TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the town of Eaton in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows hall in said Eaton on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same. Including Town Officers' Salaries, Town Officers' Expenses, Election and Registration Expense, Town Hall Expense, Police Department, Fire Department, Health Department, Highways and Bridges, Town Maintenance, Street Lighting, General Expenses of Highway Department, Library, Town Poor, and Interest on Temporary Loans.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700.00 for the construction of the Brownfield road, provided the State shall appropriate the sum of \$2100.00 for the same purpose, it being understood that if said appropriation is made by the State and the Town accepts said special aid, that the Town shall not be entitled to State Aid for class II roads.
- 4. To see if the town will accept State Aid for constrution of class II road known as Brownfield road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$345.00 or will accept State Aid for constrution of class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$310.65
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to pay the sum of \$8.00 towards the maintenance of the United States National Reemployment office at Conway, from May 1, 1934 to Jan. 31, 1935.
- 7. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes if necessary.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 10. To see what action the Town will take concerning the acceptance of property bequeathed to the Town of Eaton by the will of the late Leslie P. Snow.
- 11. To see what action the Town will take concerning the plowing of private roads and private ways (Other than dooryards) through the winter months.
- 12. To see what time the Town will vote to close the polls at this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT

To the School Board and Citizens of Eaton:

We were pleased to retain Miss Alice Whiting in the school at Snowville for another year. The school is well organized and the instruction is excellent. Twenty-two pupils are registered.

The statistics for the school year ending last June follow: registration, 19; percentage of attendance, 93.5; tardiness, 39;

pupils transported, 17.

Pupils attending Kennet High school this year whose tuitions are paid by the district are: Woodrow Allard, Myrtle DeWitt, Florence Head, Sam Head, Doris Nelson, Vera

Nelson, Beulah White, Eleanor Young.

We expected to include in this printed report the amount of state-aid money to be paid next year, and the new equalized valuation on which the \$5 tax is based, but this information is late in coming to us. These figures however will be known

before the district meeting.

Eaton for several years was fortunate enough to secure the services of a school nurse for a nominal sum which probably did not pay the expense of the nurse's travel. We find that the larger towns which become responsible for the nurse's contract and pay most of the salary are not willing to continue such arrangements as Eaton has enjoyed. The annual medical examination given to pupils by a physician satisfies the legal requirements and it is not likely that any arrangement for a nursing service can be made unless the district raises a sum considerably larger than the amount approved by the state on this item.

Your superintendent has enjoyed his association with the school organization and is deeply appreciative of the excellent work of his predecessor.
