

Warrant for Town Meeting

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Errol, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Errol, on Tuesday, the 14th day of March, next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the public library.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the police department.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town poor.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to sponser a skating rink and raise the money for the same.
- 11. To raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for its program of advertising, etc., as a part of the cooperative investment by regional towns, an amount equal to 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1943.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Errol School Board:

I hereby submit for your consideration my tenth annual report of the Errol schools.

TEACHERS

At the close of the year in June 1943 and during the summer vacation, we lost two of our teachers. Mr. Irving C. Lewis, headmaster, secured another position and asked to be released during the summer vacation. This vacancy was finally filled by Harry R. Conway of Berlin. Miss Alice Zolner, who declined her election, is teaching elsewhere. Mrs. Shirley E. Hawkins took the intermediate school for a time but found that homemaking and school teaching too much so resigned. Mrs. Esther H. Bean was secured to fill the vacancy. Mrs. Bean is doing very well in this rather hard school. Misses Hurlbert and Bartlett hold the same positions as last year.

ENROLLMENT

The registration, this year, is as follows: Grade I—4; Grade II—15; Grade III—4; Grade IV—6; Grade V—5; Grade VI—7; Grade VII—7; Grade VIII—3; Grade IX—3; and Grade X—8. The total registration is 62. This number includes 19 from Wentworth's Location and 8 from Millsfield.

PERFECT ATTENDANCE

The following five children were not absent or tardy during the year: viz., Jacqueline Bean, Raymond Muise, Norman Porter, Edna Sweeney, and Janet Sweeney.

GRADUATES

Jacqueline Bean and Roland MacKenzie constituted the class who completed grade ten and entered high school in September.

TRANSPORTATION

The transportation is the same as last year with James Jordan transporting eight from Millsfield and fourteen from Errol. Clayton Turner transports nineteen from Wentworth's Location. Dennis Ferren brings his own children from Upton Hill road.

SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT

These have been purchased as in former years.

HEALTH

The medical examination and general health work has been under the care of Miss Nellie E. Stone, R. N. from Colebrook. Miss Stone found five pupils with defective vision—one corrected later; fifty-six with defective teeth; six with diseased tonsils and three unvaccinated—later vaccinated.

SCHOOL CENSUS

The return of the school census, taken in September, 1943, showed 17 boys and 16 girls in town between the ages of 5 and 16, one between 5 and 8 was not in school. The total registration September 30, 1943 was 63. Of this number, 26 were from outside the district and 5 were over 16 years. This leaves 32 resident children in school between the ages of 5 and 16.

STATISTICS

From last year's registers were gleaned some data that may be of interest: viz., The schools were actually in session 36.8 weeks; total unrepeated registration 66; the percent of attendance was 93.5; 75 tardy marks were recorded, which is three times as many as last year; 6 visits were made, to the schools, by the board members; 361 visits by citizens; 118 teacher visits were credited to the superintendent; and 6 school board meetings were held during the year.

HOME ECONOMICS AND MANUAL ARTS

The work in Manual Arts has been dropped because a teacher could not be found qualified to teach it.

The Home Economics is still under the efficient management of Miss Hurlbert. Some excellent work has been accomplished by the girls in this department.

CONCLUSION

The various extra curricula activities, connected with the schools are enjoyed by the student body. Some activities are, however, curtailed owing to the war conditions.

The teachers are given assistance by private conferences when the superintendent makes his visits.

Noon lunches are carried on as in previous years.
