




# **State of New Hampshire**

---

To the inhabitants of the town of Gorham, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

Article 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for winter roads.

Article 4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.

Article 5. To see what action the town will vote to take in regard to raising the salaries of the Water & Sewer Commissioners from \$25 per year to \$75, \$100, and \$125 per year respectively. These salaries will be paid out of the water and sewer appropriation the same as heretofore. The commissioners are now meeting once each week in the interests of the Water & Sewer Commission and feel that they are entitled to more pay.

Article 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

Article 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for police for the ensuing year.

Article 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.

Article 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.

Article 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Skating Rink.

Article 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks.

Article 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the building of a dam and retaining wall at the Perkins Brook intake, in accordance with the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

Article 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the American Legion.

Article 14. To see what sum the town will vote to appropriate from funds on hand for the retirement of Land Bonds.

Article 15. To see what sum the town will vote to appropriate from funds on hand for the retirement of Municipal Water Bonds.

Article 16. To see what sum the town will vote to appropriate from funds on hand for the retirement of Cascade Water Bonds.

Article 17. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Dumping Ground.

Article 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, when such debts are incurred and expressly made payable therefrom by such vote. And to see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply to the Governor and Council for assistance in financing the needs of the town, as previously provided by Chapter 63 of the laws of 1933, or any amendment made hereto.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount of 2% on all property taxes paid to the tax collector before Aug. 1, 1938.

Article 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.

Article 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.

Article 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for W. P. A. Projects, in accordance with the recommendations of the Budget Committee.

Article 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising.

Article 26. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to build a channel in the Peabody Branch for the purpose of obtaining sufficient water to take care of the sewers that empty into this stream.

Article 27. To see what action the town will take on the petition for the continuance of the concrete sidewalk from the residence of Frank Sampson on Main Street, to the end of the old walk at the residence of Dean Potter on the Lancaster Road. (not recommended by the Budget Committee).

Article 28. To see what action the town will take on the petition to repair and widen Cross Street at the Canadian National R. R. Crossing, so that it will be safe for two-way traffic. (not recommended by the Budget Committee).

Article 29. To hear the reports of town officers, agents, committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

A petition was presented for an appropriation to make or repair the channel in the branch of the Peabody River to obtain water to take care of the sewerage that goes into this stream.

As this seems necessary the Budget Committee recommends the sum of \$500 be appropriated and raised for this purpose.

The Budget Committee does not recommend building any sidewalks this year.

A petition was presented to repair and widen Cross street at the Canadian National Railway crossing for two way traffic. It the opinion of the Selectmen and Committee that this is not a safe crossing for two way traffic and for this reason the Budget does not recommend raising any amount for this purpose.

A petition for Band Concerts was presented and the Budget Committee recommends the same amount as last year be appropriated and raised, namely \$480.

The matter of increasing the salaries of the Water Commissioners was brought to our attention, but as all the town officers salaries are fixed by a vote of the town we feel this should be up to the voters at town meeting.

The Water & Sewer Commissioners strongly advise the need of a dam and retaining wall at Perkins Brook, estimated to cost \$1500. They figure this would save the town around \$800 a year in labor. A this would seem a good investment the Budget committee recommends the sum of \$1500 be appropriated and raised for this purpose, and that it be put up for bids, all labor to be done by local help, and not to exceed \$1500.

The town is now able to get W. P. A. assistance and it has been suggested that the following sewers be built; Alpine Street, Promenade and Church Streets, and the Leblanc-Willis sewer. Estimated cost of these projects is material furnished by the town \$2907.60 and we recommend this amount be appropriated and raised. All labor for these projects will be furnished by W. P. A.

We recommend the sum of \$7500 be appropriated and raised for Town Maintenance and that from this amount the following be done: A ditch made to take care of the water, Grand Trunk right of way to Union Street ; the approaches to the Swing Bridge on Peabody River be properly made ; a guard rail on road leading from trunk line to railroad bridge at Cascade ; and a catch basin be installed on Broadway to take care of the surface water.

We recommend the following amounts be appropriated from funds on hand ;
