#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hooksett in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L. S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hooksett, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To hear and act upon the report of the Town Budget Committee.

4. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget in whole or in part.

5. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of two per cent (2%) on all taxes, except poll taxes, paid on or before the fifteenth day of July.

6. To see if the town will vote to accept all trust funds not before accepted.

7. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relative thereto.

8. To hear the reports of the selectmen, town treasurer, agents, auditors and committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

9. To see if the town will vote to appropriate seventy-

five dollars (\$75.00) to be contributed to the funds of George E. Merrill Post No. 37 for Memorial and Armistice Day ceremonies. (Petition by Alfred Campbell, Adj. and twelve others.)

10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to apply a seal coat of tarvia to the roads at the following locations: (Tarvia treated in 1933 and 1935) Martin's Ferry road, Alice Avenue, Bridge Street, Poor Road, Granite Street, Hale Avenue, Bartlett Street, Highland Street, Johnson Landing Road, and Smith Road, or take any action relative thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to purchase additional snow fence or take any action relative thereto.

12. To see if the town will vote to accept W.P.A. proposal No. S.M. 31 and raise and appropriate the sum of nineteen hundred and ninety-eight dollars (\$1,998.00) to pay for supervision, material and supplies, equipment rentals and other direct costs; the Federal Government to furnish the labor and pay for same at a cost of seven thousand one hundred and sixty-five dollars (\$7,165.00), the men employed to be taken from the direct relief rolls in the Town of Hooksett. This proposal is for the improvement of farm to market roads and will include widening, straightening, clearing vision and draining on the following roads: Hackett Hill road, Bow road, Bow Bog road, Superintendent's Hill, Alice Avenue, Misery Hill road, Martin's Ferry road and Sand Hill. This project will provide six months' work for twenty-three men.

13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-five hundred and fifty-nine dollars as its proportionate share of state aid construction, or five hundred and twenty-four dollars and ninety-seven cents (\$524.97) the State to furnish two thousand ninety-nine dollars and ninety cents (\$2,099.90) making a total of two thousand six hundred and twenty-four dollars and eightyseven cents (\$2,624.87), the same to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Department for town road maintenance, or take any action relative thereto.

14. To see if the town will vote to reshape and oil one mile of road beginning at the State Highway on River road south of Hooksett Village, at the foot of sand hill leading to Hackett Hill and Goffstown, and raise and appropriate money for same. (Petition by Orin J. Cate and twenty-seven others).

15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to surface treat Mill Street in Hooksett Village. (Petition by George A. Cook and sixteen others.)

16. To see if the town will vote to grade and oil the River Road, so-called, between the corner of High Street south and River road and Robie's store and Post-Office, and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the same, or take any action thereon. (Petition by George W. Robie and ten others.)

17. To see if the town will vote by ballot to buy a tractor and snow plow suitable to plow snow. (Petition by Laurence Baxter and nineteen others.)

18. To see if the town will vote to install ten (10) street lights between Hooksett Village and Manchester line on the West River Road, so-called, and raise and appropriate money for the same. (Petition by J. O. Campbell and twelve others.)

19. To see if the town will vote to accept and maintain Lamphere Street, so-called, leading from the end of Bartlett Street to the Manchester line and install at least two street lights thereon. (Petition by Maynard Fillmore and twenty-six others.)

20. To see if the town will vote to keep the town tractor in its garage from October 1st to April 1st and hire plowing of snow done by trucks thereby saving money for the town. (Petition by William W. Nagel and fifteen others.)

21. To see if the town will vote to protest against State plows throwing snow onto the town sidewalks except when it may be unavoidable and plugging entrances to citizens' driveways without having men accompanying plows to clear snow from such entrances. (Petition by William W. Nagel and eleven others.)

22. To see if the town will vote to raise \$25,000.00 if the Federal Government will grant a like amount, for putting in a water system in South Hooksett. (Petition by Napoleon Despins and nine others.)

23. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money sufficient to buy 400 feet of double jacket hose to be divided between Fire Department number 1 and number 2. (Petition by Chief Melvin W. Worthen and thirteen others.)

24. To see if the town will vote to have one joint caucus instead of two different party caucuses. (Petition by Lillian Russell and thirteen others.)

25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### **REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

#### To the School Board of Hooksett:

My second annual report deals chiefly with teacher changes, added facilities, increasing the per cent of promotions, state aid and expenditure per pupil, enrollment and building conditions.

Schools opened in September with two changes and one transfer in the staff of teachers. At the close of schools in June Miss Helen B. Huston, teacher of the Martin's Grammar School, was married and withdrew from the profession. Miss Lois M. Cate at the River Road School resigned to teach in Pembroke. Miss Edna B. Wilson's request for transfer from the Village Grammar School to the Martin's School was granted.

Miss Annie R. Whittemore of Andover, New Hampshire, was elected to succeed Miss Wilson in the Village School. Miss Whittemore graduated from Keene Normal School in 1930, and has taught for five years in the schools of Wilmot, New Hampshire. During the summers of 1933 and 1935 she took post graduate courses at New Hampshire University.

Shortly before the opening of schools in September, Miss Lenore C. Roberts of Concord was elected to succeed Miss Cate as teacher of the River Road School. Miss Roberts is a graduate of the Dewey Training School in Concord and has taught for five years in the graded schools of Belmont, New Hampshire.

Most important among your added facilities is the provision for an adequate water supply on the grounds of the Village School. A driven well of approximately one hundred feet in depth affords adequate and excellent water as shown by an analysis made by the State Laboratory in Concord. The shaft is encased with steel and covered by cement to prevent any possibility of soil or surface contamination. The well—now equipped with an outside pump is so situated that an electric pump may be placed in the basement of the building.

Unsanitary toilet conditions at the Neal School demanded the construction of a new cess-pool and the repair of the drainage system from the chemical toilets.

Electric lights are particularly needed in the Neal School. At present the Public Service Company is unable to furnish the power until there is more general demand for it in that neighborhood.

Classroom facilities in language instruction have been improved by the introduction of the "Open Door Language Series" in grades five and six, and the use of "Elements of English" by Center and Holmes in the seventh and eighth grades. New material in literature is now available in both of these grades.

The Elson system of reading, introduced last year in Grades I and II, has been extended through the next two grades.

Although, last June, the per cents of promotion were generally good, these per cents were too low in several schools. To improve this situation four methods of procedure are being followed: (1) Trial promotions are being extended for at least half a year; (2) A complete record of achievement tests is kept and studied for every pupil in the four higher grades; (3) The majority of the teachers are making annually at least one visit to every home represented by the pupils in their room; (4) Before a pupil is returned to a lower grade the case is reported to the superintendent and investigated by him.

With the improvement of facilities, Hooksett's cost per elementary pupil for the year ending in June 1935, was \$56.12 against the State's median cost of \$76.93: which means that Hooksett's increase in per pupil cost was \$1.84 against the State's median increase of \$4.47 per pupil in elementary schools. With an enrollment of less than three hundred and fifty pupils, this increase in per pupil cost was more than met by the increase in state aid, when the allotment of \$953.39 in 1934 is compared with \$1,965.79 received in 1935.

If recent increases in pupil enrollment in your public schools are to continue, the time is approaching when added classrooms must be provided. This is particularly true of the Village School, where three years ago crowded conditions were relieved by opening the River Road School. Today the Village School is again over-crowded and in need of a third teacher; state aid money is available; but classroom facilities are lacking. In the present building the location of the toilets is undesirable, coatrooms are unheated, and the two, narrow and winding stairways, leading from an over-crowded room, present a serious menace in case of fire. The problem will soon demand one of two solutions: either the remodeling and enlarging of the present building, on grounds already inadequate, or the erection of a new building on new and more ample grounds.

The problem also carries with it a financial possibility.

There are this year sixty-five pupils from Hooksett enrolled in public high schools and academies. The district is paying out over \$6,000 in tuition. This enrollment combined with your present seventh and eighth grades in a sixyear high school with four teachers could be maintained as far as local costs are concerned for the amount now paid for high school tuitions. The fact that your present district debt is ten thousand dollars must not be forgotten. However, I contend that the retention in Hooksett of an annual expenditure of \$6,000 is worthy of consideration.

In conclusion allow me to call attention to the report of your School Nurse. The high percentage of dental defects corrected is indicative of the financial support given to this clinic work by your local organizations. I appreciate the prompt and efficient service rendered by your Truant Officer, and the willingness with which the teachers have contributed time and effort, made necessary by the testing program, home visits and other special activities.

It has been a pleasure to share with the members of your board in the administrative activities of the past year.
