

## TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jefferson in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Jefferson on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum \$1500.00 for State Aid Maintenance and receive \$7200.00 from the State.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1900.00 for Trunk Line Maintenance and receive \$8625.00 from the State.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$1698.00 for State Aid Construction and receive the same from the State.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$5000.00 for the Cherry Mountain Road and receive the same from the State.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Gale place to Fred Kelsey.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to reduce all wages and salaries ten per cent.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to allow a scale of discounts on Taxes paid between May 1 and Oct. 1, 1932.
- 10. To transact any other business which may come before said meeting.

#### DECLARATION OF TRUST

We, Ambrew V. Cotton of Jefferson in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, Elgie C. Knapp of Wayland in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and Alice C. Dunlop of Auburndale in said Massachusetts, desiring to establish a memorial to our late wife and mother, Evy C. Cotton of said Jefferson, and wishing to perpetuate her interest and regard for the care of unfortunate and deserving children of her townspeople as evidenced by her labor for their health and happiness during her lifetime, do hereby establish a trust fund to be known as the Jefferson Memorial Health Fund, by the deposit of the sum of three hundred dollars in the hands of the Siwooganock Guaranty Savings Bank of Lancaster in said Coos County as a perpetual trust, the income from which shall be used for the purposes of care for the health of any deserving child, resident in said Jefferson, said income to be paid over by said Bank to a Committee of three residents of said Jefferson, namely Mrs. Nellie Muzzey, Mrs. Harriet Pottle and Mrs. Etta Savage, who are hereby invested with the right and power of disposal of said income in their discretion for the purposes of this trust as above set forth, and with the further discretion to use said income for the benefit of an adult of said Jefferson if in their judgment the need shall be urgent.

It is our desire that the members of said committee shall serve as long as each shall feel so disposed, and that in the event of resignation or vacancy on said Committee the Selectmen of Jefferson shall appoint a successor so that said Committee shall always consist of three members serving for an indefinite term.

Payment of income by said Bank to any member of said Committee shall be a sufficient compliance by said Bank with the requirements of this trust.

It is our wish and hope that this Health Memorial Fund may be the foundation for the establishment of further memorial gifts which may be added from time to time to increase said Health Fund and thus enlarge the opportunity for the doing of good in the community.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND CITIZENS OF JEFFERSON

#### Teachers:

Only two changes occurred in the teaching staff this year. Mrs. Lena M. Whyte resumed her position at Riverton after an absence of a year. In the High School Miss Anna E. Hedman of Temple was appointed in place of Mrs. Nevers. Miss Hedman holds a Master's degree from Columbia University. Repairs:

All of the school buildings were given a thorough cleaning before school opened. Only minor repairs were needed, and but one major repair will be required this summer, namely, the foundation of the school at the Meadows.

#### Health:

The usual thorough physical examination was given by Dr. Aldrich, and monthly weighing of each child carried out. A special feature of the health

program this year was the Toxin Antitoxin clinic in which over seventy children were treated.

#### Extra Curricular Activites:

Both of the high school teachers have been active in carrying on the special work that helps to create the proper school atmosphere. The senior play was a decided hit and both of the basketball teams have had a successful season.

#### A Safe Investment:

In these troubled times, public opinion is determined that the children shall be the last to suffer.

Money invested in education is safe in a bank that never fails. Let everyone strive to maintain our schools at their present high standard, even though it means a sacrifice, and the coming years will demonstrate the wisdom of this policy.
