



TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L. S.)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lempster in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House, East Lempster in said Lempster on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will raise to keep the common mowed around the Soldiers' Monument, at Lempster Street.
- 4. To see if the town will authorize brush wood and timber, cut on the River Road from F. A. Barton's line to Keyes Hollow, 16 feet from the ditch on both sides of the road, and raise or appropriate money for same independent of the road money.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will raise to repair the Town Hall Building at Lempster Street.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Maintenance of the Trunk Line Road.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Maintenance of the State Aid Road.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for State Aid construction.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to deliver blank inventories at the time they appraise the property for taxation.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the prevention of white pine blister rust.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise or appropriate for Old Home Day and Memorial Day.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the Library.

- 13. To see what the town will pay for labor on the Highways.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to reinsure the Town Hall and Union Hall.
- 15. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money for the town in anticipation of taxes.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Highway from M. K. Olds' house to the South Mountain road so called.
- 17. To see if the town will instruct the selectmen to buy a safe for the use of the town and raise money therefor.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to buy a new road machine and raise money therefor.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to buy the James Nichols' place for the purpose of enlarging the Cemetery, and raise such sum of money as may be necessary to carry such vote into effect.
- 20. To see if the town will vote the Grange the right to build new stairs in Union Hall.
- 21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



REPORT OF

SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Members of the Lempster School Board:

I, herewith, submit my fourth annual report as superintendent of your schools.

The past year is one that may be looked upon with a sense of accomplishment in many ways. One goal toward which we have been striving has been reached, in that the three schools of Lempster were open for instruction the entire 360 half-days of the school calendar. I wish to add this year's record to the figures printed in last year's report that the people of Lempster may see accurately the gradual increase in the length of the school year accomplished at no added cost to the town. The full year is now utilized. The percentage of attendance is as high as can reasonably be expected.

The school buildings, with the exception of East Lempster, where painting is badly needed, are in good condition. By establishing a progressive system whereby one school could be renovated each year, the three would be kept in ideal condition at a comparatively small expense. It is cheaper to keep school buildings in repair than to allow them to become badly out of repair before spending necessary funds upon them.

People in every walk of life are realizing the futility of training minds but allowing weak bodies to nullify the efficiency of such training. We thus see Health and Sanitation emphasized more and more in adult activities as well as in school work. Lempster is aiding in this work by employing a registered nurse in her schools for as long a period as state aid money is avail-

able for this purpose. The nurse makes a physical examination of each pupil annually, reporting to the parents the facts ascertained. This is but a part of her work, however, for we do not believe that the school district has done its share in simply calling the attention of the parents to existing defects. There are sometimes obstacles in the way of parents who would like to help their children but feel helpless in the face of these difficulties. These can often be removed by the help and the suggestions of a trained nurse. By means of her contacts with hospitals, doctors, public clinics and other health officials she is enabled to arrange for professional treatment at moderate prices and at expert hands. In cases of diseases, simple in themselves but apt to prove serious if not watched and treated, the nurse often wards off serious consequences. Many are the adults who have expressed regret that no school nurse had insisted upon their looking after their teeth or attending to that throat, or that no school nurse had been on hand during a certain epidemic.

Within the past two years, four schools in this supervisory union have installed chemical toilets. Such equipment is no longer in the experimental stage. Its practicability has been proven. The present equipment, in a public school, presents risks that are wanting when in private houses. To do away with the present risks and to safeguard the health of your children still further, I urge upon the people of Lempster that they seriously consider the installation of chemical toilets in any or all of their schools. In all other ways Lempster schools are at least as good as the best.

I wish once more to express my appreciation for an efficient school board, kindly in criticism and generous in aid, and for the personal interest taken in the schools by many parents and citizens.
