THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pittsburg on Tuesday, the Twelfth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for same.
- 2. To see if the Town will give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- 3. To see if the Town will give the Selectmen authority to distribute blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to assess a sum not exceeding ten cents per thousand dollar valuation of the assessed valuation of the Town for 1946, said sum to be turned over to the White Mountain Regional Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town together with other Towns in the region.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to increase the basic rate of pay for all Town employees ten cents per hour and to increase the pay for trucks from ninty cents to one dollar per hour. The increase herein asked for shall be in force from Town Meeting 1946 to Town Meeting 1947 only.

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$2,500. to purchase a new fire truck and necessary equipment and to give the Selectmen authority to sell the old fire truck.
- 7. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

 The polls shall be open at 10 A. M. and not close before 6 P. M.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Pittsburg School District:

Foreword

Today there is a mounting tide of sentiment in behalf of better education. Education for all the people is America's noblest contribution to civilization. As surely as children grow, the schools must go on. Education cannot wait. The neglect of growing youth cannot be repaired. On every hand people are planning for the future. Labor, industry, business and government are looking ahead. What are our plans for our schools?

We have said that democracy cannot exist without education. The opposite is also true. Education cannot grow and flourish without democracy. The schools are citadels of democracy in war or in peace. Only with a democratic system of education is it possible for a nation to find and develop the talents of all of its youth.

Every child in our country deserves a fair start in life including an educational opportunity that will develop his talents to the fullest. America believes in giving everyone a chance. We want our schools to build character. We want our boys and girls to be honest, friendly, considerate, cooperative and responsible. We want them not only to believe in democracy but to play their part in making it work. We want them to know the happiness to be derived from hard work, as well as the joys of a profitably invested leisure. In short, we expect the schools to develop rounded, balanced lives, to contribute to youth' personalities, and to the enrichment of society.

Let us set the child in our midst as our greatest wealth and our most challenging responsibility. Only people make a nation truly great.

Teachers

There have been several changes in the teaching staff since the last report. In the High School John Day, U. N. H., became the new Headmaster, Paula Kenney, American International, was chosen to teach English and French. Marian Gray and Marie LaFontana returned from the previous year.

Muriel Currier was selected for the Intermediate room and Doris Fissette for the Primary room. Mrs. Currier has just resigned and Katherine Dwinell, Lyndon Normal, took over January 21st.

Danforth School was closed so we have one less teacher.

Buildings and Equipment

The desks at the Village School were varnished, the fire-escape painted and the usual minor repairs and improvements were made during the summer months.

The old wooden water-closet tanks were replaced and considerable work done in the toilet rooms during the Christmas recess.

The Indian Stream school-house was sold in accordance with the vote of the district public auction.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment of the district is 110, as compared with 107 last year. Enrollment two years ago was 126 and five years ago 177.

There is in the High School one tuition pupil from Clarksville and we have six attending school at West Stewartstown, and one at Canaan High.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's total budget for 1946-47 is \$25,557.00 as compared with \$25,289.00 for last year.

The requested appropriation is \$25,557.00. The appropriation last March was, by error, \$24,025.75 instead of \$25,129.00 as printed in the report. The increase in the burget this year is due to the anticipated higher costs for salaries and supplies.

Heating

Due to the increased cost of labor reflected in higher wood costs, the school board, as an experiment, tried using coal to heat the Village building in 1944-45. During the summer 1944 we purchased 101.2 tons of coal at a cost of \$1,097.00. It was estimated that we burned 75 tons for the year. Our heating cost would therefore be approximately \$810.00. It seems fair to say that coal was more economical than wood for that year.

Health

A brief report of the work of the School Nurse, Ethel Sturgis, between January 1, 1945 and January 1, 1946 follows:

School insepections 704, home calls 346, treatments at school 73, physical defects, teeth 53 corrections 27, tonsils 14 corrections 2, vision 39 corrections 23, surgical operations 5, anesthetics 3, skin disease 12, contagious 11, orthopedic 2, malnutrition 4, anemia 3, pupils to hospital 5, pupils to doctor 8, pupils to dentist 9, injuries 13, medical cases 84.

Teacher Retirement

The 1945 State Legislature saw fit to revise the Teachers' Retirement System. The law, as amended, provides for larger contributions, for better retirement benefits and should provide greater stability among the teachers of the State. It is still on a voluntary basis.

Based on a four per cent rate, the estimated assessment for the school year 1945-46 is \$100.00. The assessment is to be made after July 1, 1946, and is

governed by the salaries of the teachers participating. Additional enrollment or resignation of members, as well as salary changes may alter the assessment figure.

Conclusion

It has been said that the people of the United States could be divided into three groups—the small group who make things happen—the large group who watch things happen—and the enormous multitude who do not know what happens. I hope that the educational opportunities of our schools are such that our boys and girls will become a part of that small group who make things happen.

I take this as another opportunity to express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
