THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rumney in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Rumney Town Hall in said Rumney on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Highways in addition to the amount required by law.
4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Library.
5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Street Lights.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Cemeteries.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for care of Common.
8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Owen B. LaMott Post No.76 . American Legion for Memorial Day and other Patriotic purposes.
9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,222.00 to secure from the State \$5,555.00 for permanent road from Rumney Village to the Ellsworth line, known as State Aid Orange.
10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Department.
11. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Fire Hose and Equipment.

12. To choose a Fire Commissioner.
13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400.00 for control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Dep't.
14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$74.00 to the Lakes Region Association of New Hampshire to assist in Planning and Development of the town and for the issuance and distributing of printed matter and newspaper and magazine advantage of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region
15. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through the Tax Collectors Deed.
16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.00 for resident Doctor.
17. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting and to make appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
18. To see if the town will vote to allow a 2 per cent discount on all taxes paid within 15 days after presentation of tax bill.
19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
20. To see if the town will vote to have the inventory blanks distributed at time of taking appraisal of property.
21. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF
THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS



To the School Board and Citizens of the

School District of Rumney:

The twelfth annual report of the present Superintendent of Schools is hereby submitted and makes a part of the Report of the School Board of the School District of Rumney.

At the last district meeting the district voted not to consolidate its schools at present, but to transport the 7th and 8th grades of West Rumney and these are now in the Depot school. Septic toilets were installed in this school during the summer and it is planned to enlarge the window space in the grammar room in the spring. There is ample room for the West Rumney children at present at the Depot and the transportation of these upper grades makes possible a more advantageous arrangement of the work at Mont View.

During the summer Elinor Jones resigned as teacher of the Village Grammar School to accept a more remunerative position in a city of the state. This report would not be complete without an official recognition of her long term of happy and efficient work. Muriel J. Walker was appointed to this position and after her resignation in January Mrs. Dorothy B. Davis of Plymouth is completing the year.

During the fall an opportunity presented itself to employ Jane Guyer of Hanover as music supervisor. Miss Guyer has a state credential for music and is a graduate of Smith College. She has a splendid background of music and has every appearance of being very successful. The teachers and

scholars seem very happy to be with her and the Board did well to meet the long desire of the district for supervised music in its schools. Two pianos have been purchased at moderate prices at the Village.

After careful consideration it seemed expedient to the Superintendent of Schools and School Board to discontinue the prize speaking for the present.
