TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

(L.S)

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Salem, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house, in said town, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at six-thirty (6:30) of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 2. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- ARTICLE 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to raise any more money for the repairs of highways than the law requires.
- ARTICLE 5. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer to hire, with the approval of the selectmen, such sums of money as may be needed for general purposes in anticipation of taxes.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to rescind the vote taken under Article 33 of the 1935 warrant whereby it voted to adopt the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- ARTICLE 8. To see what action the town will take relative to lighting the streets, and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed four thousand dollars (\$4,000), for the purpose of providing police officers for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed three thousand dollars (\$3,000), for the maintenance of the fire department for the ensuing year.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), or any part thereof, for the removal of snow from the highways and general highway expenses.
- ARTICLE 12. By request of library trustees. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars (\$750), or any part thereof, above the sum required by law, for the support of the Salem Free Public Library for the year 1937.
- ARTICLE 13. By request of Chester T. Woodbury. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred

dollars (\$100), or any part thereof, to maintain and improve the Town Common and the Public Square near Pine Grove Cemetery.

ARTICLE 14. By request of Ernest W. Young Post. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250), or any part thereof, for the use of Ernest W. Young Post, No. 63, American Legion, to be expended in the observance of Memorial Day in the year 1937.

ARTICLE 15. By request of Ernest W. Young Post. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), or any part thereof, for the replacement of the monument on the Town Common.

ARTICLE 16. By request of Ida E. Ewins. To see if the town will vote to accept from Ida E. Ewins a memorial fountain in memory of the late James Ewins, said fountain to be installed on the Town Common or the triangular plot of land at the junction of School Street and Main Street and maintained by the town.

ARTICLE 17. By request of John E. King. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred and forty dollars and seventy-six cents (\$640.76), and apply for aid from the state for Class 5 roads.

ARTICLE 18. By request of Walter E. Stickney and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of eighteen hundred and twenty-seven dollars (\$1,827), or any part thereof, and apply for State Aid on the road from Cowbell Corner to the Atkinson town line.

ARTICLE 19. By request of Melzar Doble and others. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar Martin Avenue and raise the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600), or any part thereof, for the same.

- ARTICLE 20. By request of Richard Fallows. To see if the town will raise such sums of money as may be necessary for continuation of resurfacing Granite Avenue.
- ARTICLE 21. By request of Adolph Ermer and others. To see if the town will vote to build tarvia road leading from the corner of the road near the residence of A. A. Philbrick to the Derry town line and raise one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or any part thereof, for the same.
- ARTICLE 22. By request of John E. King and others. To see if the town will vote to build a tarvia road leading from North Salem to Salem Center. Parcel No. 1—Beginning at the end of the tarvia road near the residence of Willard C. Maddock to tarvia road at fork of road leading to the residence of James Cullen about 9/10 of a mile. Parcel No. 2—Beginning at end of tarvia road at Reed's Corner to tarvia road near the residence formerly of Albert Searle, about 7/10 of a mile, and raise the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or any part thereof, for same.
- ARTICLE 23. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five thousand dollars (\$5,000), or any part thereof, to provide a tarvia surface for the Zion Hill Road extending from the tarvia surface on the Millville Road to the tarvia surface on the Canobie Lake Road.
- ARTICLE 24. By request of Arthur F. Dyke. To see if the town will vote to finish the 3/4 mile of road left on the Lawrence Road and raise the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500), or any part thereof, for the same.
- ARTICLE 25. By request of Henry J. Pendergast. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), or any part thereof, to continue the gravel and tar road on Cluff Road leading from Broadway to Foster's Corner.

- ARTICLE 26. By request of Joseph Silverthorne and others. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar Pond Street commencing at the residence of Albert Townsend and continuing to the state line or any part of this distance and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 27. By request of John L. Higginbottom. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar the road leading from Salem Center Road to the junction of Pond Street and Sand Hill Road, and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 28. By request of William E. Lancaster. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or any part thereof, for the purpose of building a gravel and tar road on Highland Avenue, Salem Center.
- ARTICLE 29. By request of Emma P. Lundberg. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar a portion of the road leading from the residence of Frank Butler to Canobie Lake Station, and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 30. By request of Frank Currier and others. To see if the town will vote to accept Merrill Avenue, and raise money to repair the same.
- ARTICLE 31. By request of Frank Joy and others. To see if the town will vote to accept the road leading from Brookdale Road to Canobie Lake Hotel, and raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500), or any part thereof, to repair the same with gravel and tar.
- ARTICLE 32. By request of Hagop Kachadoorian. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar the highway leading from No. 8 schoolhouse to Kelley's Crossing, or any part of this distance, and raise a sum of money not to exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000) for the same.

ARTICLE 33. By request of Sarkis Donigan and others. To see if the town will vote to accept state aid on Pelham Road and continue the state aid construction to No. 7 schoolhouse and raise the sum of twenty-four hundred dollars (\$2,400), or any part thereof, for the same.

ARTICLE 34. By request of William J. MacMasters and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000), or any part thereof, to continue the tarvia road from Point A, so called, to Hall's Crossing.

ARTICLE 35. By request of Thomas Duston. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar the North Salem Road from Bluff Street Corner to the tarvia road near the residence of Ivan C. Reed, and raise the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500), or any part thereof, for the same.

ARTICLE 36. By request of Arthur L. Cullen and others. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar the highway leading from Merrill's Corner to the Atkinson line on Poverty Road, so called, or any part thereof, and raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 37. By request of Richard Garabedian and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500), or any part thereof, to gravel and tar Salem Street from Brady Avenue to the state line.

ARTICLE 38. By request of Jacob Garabedian and others. To see what action the town will take on the appropriation of five hundred dollars (\$500) on the construction of Salem Street. The above amount being previously passed by vote in the years 1935 and 1936, and as yet not expended.

- ARTICLE 39. By request of Clarence J. Shirley. To see if the town will vote to build a new bridge at Shadow Lake and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 40. By request of William E. Lancaster. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or any part thereof, for the purpose of constructing a fireproof vault in or about the Town House.
- ARTICLE 41. By request of Edgar W. Smith. To see if the town will vote to replace the two inch water main on School Street with a six inch main and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 42. By request of Clarence E. Cameron. To see if the town will vote to extend the water main from the residence of Benjamin Farr to Hall's Crossing, or any part of this distance, and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 43. By request of the Cemetery Trustees. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150), or any part thereof, for the purpose of surveying unimproved land in Pine Grove Cemetery, and laying out proper drives and walks in the same.
- ARTICLE 44. By request of the Trustees of the Ararat Congregational Church and others. To see if the town will vote to install ten street lights from the No. 8 schoolhouse to the church and thence to the residence of Osker Jamagochian, and raise money for the same.
- ARTICLE 45. By request of John L. Higginbottom. To see if the town will vote to install street lights from Salem Center Road to the residence of John L. Higginbottom, and raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 46. By request of Elizabeth A. Colburn. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), or any part thereof, for the Lawrence General Hospital for services rendered the town of Salem.

ARTICLE 47. By request of J. W. Crowell. To see if the town will vote to provide suitable dumping places for rubbish: one each at the Center, the Depot, North Salem, and Hampshire Roads, and raise any necessary money for the same.

ARTICLE 48. By request of the Salem Woman's Club. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50), or any part thereof, for the use of Humane Work in Salem, carried on by a committee of three appointed by the club, a detailed account of the money used to be given the selectmen at the close of the year.

ARTICLE 49. By request of Elma V. Cooper. To see if the town will vote to number the houses and raise money for the same.

ARTICLE 50. By request of Wallace W. Cole. To see if the town will vote to accept a deed to the land in the rear of Woodbury High School, from Wallace W. Cole, to be used as an athletic field.

ARTICLE 51. By request of Howard E. Turner. To see what action the town will take relative to the collection of the Sunday license fees on all places of amusement for profit and all places of business open on Sunday, with the exception of those open for the sale of only milk, eggs, and other farm products sold from owner's own farm. Said fees to be recommended by the Budget Committee and collected by the Board of Selectmen.

ARTICLE 52. By request of A. Kravsc. To see if the town will vote to close a way heretofore used as a public way, leading from Old South Pond Road to New South Pond Road, in said Salem, said way being 6 feet wide on either side of the following described center line: Beginning at a point 71.75 feet north of an iron pipe in the ground at the southwesterly corner of a lot of land purchased by A. K. Kravsc, the deed being recorded in Rockingham Records, book 885, page 65, on the easterly side of the old highway; thence southeasterly in a line curved northerly with a radius of 299.0 feet about 76 feet to a point in the westerly line of Pond Road; said last point is 82.0 feet, more or less northerly of an iron pipe in the ground at the southeasterly corner of said lot and on the westerly line of said Pond Road as it now exists. Reference may also be had to a plan drawn by Fred W. Stowers of Methuen, Mass., in 1933 upon which the layout as above described was made by William E. Lancaster, C.E.

ARTICLE 53. By request of Howard C. Smith. To see if the town will vote to accept from Howard C. Smith and estate of Ellen B. Smith, the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100), as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Howard C. Smith and Ellen B. Smith lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

ARTICLE 54. By request of Elizabeth S. Cochey Estate. To see if the town will vote to accept from Elizabeth S. Cochey Estate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200), as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Stephen Roberts and Temple Roberts lot in Pine Grove Cemetery; a portion of the income of said trust fund shall be used each year for decorating said lot with a bouquet upon Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 55. By request of Medora E. Wheeler Estate. To see if the town will vote to accept from Medora E. Wheeler Estate the sum of fifty dollars (\$50), as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Stephen Bailey lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

ARTICLE 56. By request of Stacy M. Rogers. To see if the town will vote to accept from Stacy M. Rogers the sum of fifty dollars (\$50), as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended for flowers to decorate the S. L. Rogers lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

ARTICLE 57. By request of Charles H. Ray Estate. To see if the town will vote to accept from Charles H. Ray Estate, the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75), as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Charles H. Ray lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH

Since the installation of our chlorinating plant the reports of the samples of town water sent to Concord, N.H., for analysis have been much more satisfactory. An average of three or four samples of water were sent to the State Laboratory during the summer months. All reports have read "Water good" or "Water very good." During the Spring flood an extra amount of chlorine was used to insure a safe supply of water to the people of the town and as an extra precaution against disease.

Several samples of milk were submitted to the State Laboratory of Hygiene for an analysis. The reports were more satisfactory than formerly.

Some unusually large henneries in the villages have caused the neighbors to complain on account of the offensive odors. The State Board of Health puts it up to the local Board to determine whether or not a nuisance exists. Keepers of large henneries in the villages will have to be especially careful to keep their places clean and as free as possible from odors.

We have had about the usual number of cases of chicken pox, measles, mumps, whooping cough, and scarlet fever. There were no deaths from any contagious diseases.

There were eighteen deaths of townspeople. An unusual number of bodies, fifty in all, were brought here for burial. This makes a total number of sixty-eight deaths reported. There were no deaths from tuberculosis.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

It is our privilege at this time to present an account of our stewardship of the schools of the town, as well as a report of the more important details of maintenance. Considerable has been accomplished in this latter respect, most of which was anticipated, while some was not. However, the Board has endeavored at all times to make such repairs as permanent and lasting as possible, not forgetting our policy of strict economy.

Woodbury High School:—Due to leaks that developed it became necessary to redecorate the auditorium walls and paint the walls in the upper end of the second corridor.

The ceilings in rooms one and five were washed and murescoed, the girls' and boys' dressing rooms and toilets were painted and murescoed, the roof was repaired and a section of the outside wall waterproofed. Ten new desk chairs were provided and a clock installed in the auditorium attached to the present electric system. In order to conform more closely to the idea adopted in other high schools, a new type of diploma in a case was purchased to replace the old type of diploma formerly used. The floors of the lower corridors were painted and the laboratory tables refinished.

No. 1 School:—The furnace was completely overhauled and should result in fuel economy and more efficient heating. The wooden section of the porch steps was repaired and the bottom step made of concrete surrounded by a thirty inch apron to eliminate the continual repairs. The outside was painted one coat, the walls of two classrooms, corridors and four rooms were painted and the ceilings washed and murescoed.

No. 4 School:—The ceilings and walls were thoroughly cleaned and painted, including the toilets.

No. 5 School:—The porch and steps were repaired, all the walls and ceilings were painted and the woodwork varnished.

No. 6 School:—The old platforms in each of the four rooms were removed and the floors underneath these were made as much like the remainder of the floor as possible. New shelves were constructed in the closets to provide facilities for better care of books. New modern seats were provided for the toilets and the woodwork painted with aluminum paint. Some electrical work was done, the gong repaired and an outlet provided so that an electric plate might be attached to supply hot water in case of emergency. The old water pipe leading into the school was replaced with one inch copper pipe.

No. 7 School:—At this school the thresholds were replaced and a window built into the wall of the corridor

leading to the toilets and the building was painted on the outside one coat.

No. 8 School:—Owing to the fact that the furnace here was found to be completely unfit for further use, it was felt that the installation of a steam system would be more efficient and more economical over a period of years and that undoubtedly the money saved in the future on redecorating the interior would alone justify the additional investment. A bulge of considerable area in the lower corridor ceiling necessitated repairs on this ceiling. The outside was painted one coat, the ceilings in the corridors and classrooms were washed and murescoed two coats, the sashes and walls in the classrooms were painted one coat, while those in the corridors were painted two coats and all natural woodwork varnished.

No. 9 School:—The corner of the wall was repaired, the ceptic tank located and put into proper condition. The water pump was repaired and the motor overhauled.

In all these schools the sash cords were either repaired or replaced, as well as the cords on curtains.

In general the buildings are in good condition and present a neat and clean appearance. We are, however, faced with a condition of overcrowding at No. 6 school which must be met in the near future. It would seem that the real solution of this problem would be the construction of a two-room addition to the present building. With the population of this section of the town increasing perhaps more rapidly than any other, it is unreasonable to assume that there will in the future be any less pupils than at present. There are now too many children in this school.

Again we are faced with the problem of more pupils in the High School than this building was intended to care for and with the incoming classes continually increasing in numbers some provisions must be made to properly care for them. Here, too, additional rooms will soon be compulsory and some thought should be given to a solution of this problem before a great while. While we feel that much has been accomplished this year toward the ultimate which we hope to attain, yet we must not forget the loss we have suffered in the passing of our School Treasurer, James Ewins, who served us so faithfully and well over a long period of years. We are extremely grateful to Mrs. Ida Ewins, who assumed the office of Treasurer thru the balance of the school year and who has rendered a real service to the community by her able administration of the office.

We deeply appreciate the interest shown by many of the citizens in the welfare of the schools during this past year and take this opportunity of extending our thanks to those who have co-operated with the Board in any way that the children of this community might have the most that our educational facilities afford.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Salem:

I herewith present my annual report as Superintendent of your schools.

The statistical report is for the school year ending June 30, 1936. Following this report will be found reports by the Headmaster of the High School, the Music Supervisor and the School Nurse.

Mr. Jesse J. Morgan, after serving one year as Headmaster of the High School, resigned his position to accept a superintendency in Massachusetts. Mr. Harlan E. Atherton, the Headmaster at Wilton, was appointed to fill the vacancy. In order to reduce the size of some of our large High School classes, and thereby give the boys and girls in those classes more teacher-time, it was decided by the School Board to employ an additional teacher. Miss Evelyn Searle was appointed to this position. Miss Helen Collins, teacher at No. 8 School, resigned during the Summer and Miss Marjorie Smith, teacher at No. 5 School, was released in January. Miss Mildred Kane was transferred to No. 8 and Miss Donna Martin to No. 7. Miss Marion Keogh was appointed special teacher at No. 6, and Miss Anna Tighe was appointed to No. 5.

The enrollment for the year covered by this report was 724, or one less than during the previous year. The school attendance averaged 96.36% of the membership. The average for the state was 94.75%.

Forty-two boys and girls were graduated from the eighth grade last June. All but seven of these entered a high school. The Good Citizenship medal was awarded to Julia Dlugosz. The Scholarship Medals in grade eight donated by the Board of Trade were awarded as follows:

Gold Medal—William Knight Silver Medal—Barbara Ritchie Bronze Medal—Annie Bucheri As usual, detailed information about Woodbury High School will be found in the Headmaster's report. I again attest that the school is truly progressive; its conduct and morale are high; its teaching force is competent; and it ranks well among the high schools of the state.

During the past year special effort has been made to improve the books at the high school. Old and worn books have been replaced by new and modern texts so that at the present time, nearly all books are in splendid condition.

The Salem Lion's Club has made possible the organization of school safety patrols. This work was started in early Winter. Patrols have been organized at the High School, No. 1 School, and at the Depot School. The school organizations are pleased to co-operate in this worthwhile movement to safeguard children on the streets.

The assistance given the schools by different organizations of the town has made possible activities which otherwise could not have been carried out. This assistance has been greatly appreciated.

Worthy use of leisure time is being stressed in our classrooms by planning and providing suitable library reading for the children. Our aim is to encourage children to read library books for enjoyment and thus establish the reading habit. Clubs can be used to good advantage in school. A beginning has been made in this direction, both in the elementary and the high school. Mention is made of these activities not only because of their educational values but because they encourage worthwhile use of leisure time outside of school.

Standardized tests given during the year show that good progress has been made in the fundamentals.

A school citizenship mark has been added to our new report cards this year. This mark is based upon consideration of the following character traits: co-operation, selfcontrol, perseverance, courage, promptness, orderliness, and health habits. We have attempted to teach each child the importance and necessity of these character traits, which will make of him a good citizen.

The 7th grade this year at Woodbury High School is the largest in the history of the school. The 7th grade entering next year will probably also contain over fifty pupils. The following year this class will be smaller. It has been possible by a very little crowding to find desk place for all pupils at the High School. What we need is room for Manual Training and Mechanic Arts. During its first three or four years, Woodbury High School had in Room No. 4 a good Manual Training course for Junior High boys. But the growth of the school made it necessary to abandon this work and regular school desks were set up to replace the work benches.

At the Depot School the four classrooms are extra large and therefore it has been possible to put forty-five to fifty pupils in each room without overcrowding the capacity of the room. But the number of children in each room in recent years has been greater than should be assigned to a teacher for best results. An additional teacher has been provided and this teacher has worked with small groups in a small room. This extra teacher could do more for the school if a regular classroom were available. Also, a larger playground is needed for games and supervised play.

The per pupil cost in the elementary schools in Salem for the period of this report was \$56.73. The state median reported by the State Board of Education for this period was \$77.93. The cost at Derry was \$86.12. The per pupil cost in the Woodbury High School also continues low. The cost was \$86.38 per pupil as compared with the state median of \$99.50.

For a number of years Salem has sufficiently recognized the value of music instruction to employ a special teacher of this subject to make the instructional work of the schools more effective. With children these days hearing so much music that appeals solely to the most elemental emotions, which need to be controlled rather than stimulated, it is of the highest importance that children be taught to appreciate and demand the kind of music that elevates. "Music Appreciation" records for use on a portable orthophonic phonograph have been used. Schools equipped with radios have made use of the Damrosch music appreciation broadcasts.

Those who use the school buildings greatly appreciate the effort on the part of the School Board to keep these buildings in good repair and condition. The new furnace at the No. 8 School is working very satisfactorily and is a great improvement. I also wish to speak especially of the great improvements brought about in the toilets at the No. 6 School.

Since buildings constitute one of the important features in the educational life of our children, it is necessary that they should be clean, sanitary and warm. Our janitors succeed, I believe, in keeping our school plants in this condition. Pupils are taught to do their share in caring for the upkeep and appearance of the buildings by orderly disposal of wraps, use of hand washing facilities, and observation of other regulations.

The function of education is the development of character. Education is not a course of training for life at some future time. It is good living now. Education is not confined to the hours in the schoolroom, nor to a stated age. It is a continuous process throughout life. Therefore it is necessary for teachers, school officials, pupils, parents, and citizens to have a clear idea of education, a theory that considers the maximum development of the individual as of the greatest importance. Such a development involves adequate teacher background and preparation, right attitude of girls and boys, co-operation of parents, and an intelligent and active interest in education by all citizens.

In conclusion I wish to express my appreciation of the fine spirit of co-operation on the part of the School Board, teachers, local organizations, and the local community.

REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER

To W. J. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my first annual report as Headmaster of Woodbury High School.

Since school opened September 9, 1936 for the twelfth year, 278 pupils in all have been registered, 13 more than last year. This is the largest registration in the school's history. At the present time 264 pupils are enrolled as follows:

Of this total there are 14 tuition pupils from the following towns: Two from Atkinson, one from Derry, and eleven from Windham.

Of the 32 graduates last June, four are at home. The others are gainfully employed or enrolled in post secondary institutions as follows:

- 1 Post Graduate in Commercial work.
- 1 is attending Northeastern University.
- 2 are attending the University of New Hampshire.
- 1 is attending Plymouth Normal School.
- 2 are attending McIntosh Business School.
- 1 is attending the New England Aircraft School.
- 1 is attending Leslie Kindergarten School.
- 1 is attending evening school in Methuen.
- 4 are engaged in farm work.
- 10 are working in mills and factories.
 - 1 is employed by a creamery.
 - 3 are clerking in stores.

The activities during the first half year have been many and varied. They have included regular class work, which has been carried on faithfully and efficiently by a loyal faculty; athletics, music, and special events. The football team under the capable direction of Head Coach Howard S. McPhee and Assistant Coach John Bowyer conducted itself creditably, even against teams out of its class. Though victories were not numerous, team spirit was abundant and sportsmanship ever present. Much appreciation is felt for the generosity of Mr. Harley Russ, who allowed the school to use the Wood Heel field; the cooperation of Mr. James Murphy, trainer at Lawrence High School; the kindness of Dr. Lewis F. Soule in providing dressing rooms and ministering to injured players; the services of the Police Department under the direction of Chief Frederick L. Chrysler; and the generous spirit of the Salem Lions Club in giving the football squad a fine banquet and presenting gold and silver footballs. The annual operetta, "Blow Me Down," presented by the Athletic Association, was produced under the splendid direction of Mrs. Eva Thompson, ably assisted by Miss Guild, Mrs. Smith, Miss Swanson, and Mr. McPhee. Performances in this affair were unusual for high school talent.

Physical exercises have been conducted in morning recess periods under the direction of both teachers and pupils, out of doors in good weather and in class rooms with windows open on stormy or cold days.

Several fire drills have been conducted. The building can be emptied in sixty seconds.

Three dances for students and alumni have been conducted during the Fall, and four class parties have been held. Both the Junior High and Senior High had Christmas parties.

The Student Council organized in the Fall with representatives elected by the different classes. In its meetings it has appointed traffic officers for duty as pupils pass be-

tween classes, discussed material of interest for the welfare of the school, and planned a schedule of the assemblies which are presented by the various classes.

An editorial board issued the first copy of the school

magazine, "The Ray," just before Christmas.

Members of the Senior Office Practice class serve in turn as secretaries in the office, thus assisting materially in the administration of the school, and securing practical experience.

A series of club meetings are being held during the Winter and Spring. The Social Club includes pupils learning to dance and studying good social manners. There are two of these clubs, one for the Junior High and one for the Senior High. The Dramatic Club has programs of sketches, readings and plays. The Camera Club deals with the hobby of taking and developing pictures. The Handicraft Club enrolls groups of Junior High pupils learning to make miscellaneous articles. The Automobile Driving Club studies principles of safety on the highways, both for car drivers and pedestrians. The Boys' Cooking Club includes boys who are learning culinary skill in the kitchen. In addition to these, a group is securing drill in such fundamentals as ordinary arithmetic and place geography.

Basketball is well under way, with Mr. McPhee in charge of the boys and Miss Swenson directing the girls. More inexperienced teams have been organized for the Junior High, Freshman, and Sophomore pupils. Mr. Rourke and

Miss Fisk are in charge of these groups.

The Seniors are planning to produce a play the latter part of the Winter. The class will visit the General Court in session at Concord, take its usual class trip before graduation, and conduct the usual Senior Prom in June. Baseball will be conducted as in previous years.

The school's greatest needs for the future are some kind of a mechanic arts or technical course for boys to balance the educational opportunities for both boys and girls in our program of studies, showers in the school building, and a school athletic field. These would be real improvements if the obstacles to their accomplishment could be overcome.

All parents and interested citizens are cordially invited to visit school at any time. All such visits which may assist the faculty in co-operating for the best interest of the pupils in Woodbury High School will be greatly appreciated.

I wish to extend appreciation for the kindness of teachers, Superintendent, School Board, and citizens who have co-operated in all activities of the school.
