You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for relief of town poor.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$57., based on a 1-100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.
- 12. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collectors' deeds.
- 13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### Report of School Superintendent

Shelburne, N, H., February 1, 1942

To the School Board and Citizens of Shelburne:

Your school at the present time has an enrollment of 25 pupils of whom three are registered in Grade Eight.

In June of 1941, one pupil was graduated from the eighth grade with the usual exercises at the Grange Hall.

This year, eight Shelburne pupils have been registered at Gorham High School, and one pupil is at Berlin High.

The school work has been regularly inspected and supervised by your Superintendent and work commensurate with the several abilities of the various pupils is being accomplished.

The discipline and general attitude of the pupils is excellent. The percentage of attendance for the last complete school year ending June, 1941, is 97.1.
