Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Stewartstown School District:

General

The world goes to school. Perhaps nothing in the history of the world has ever been supported by a consensus of belief more universal than that which sustains education today. Social, economic, political, and religious interests are equally bound up in the educational system. It serves, not one interest, but all. The leading telic force within the state by which it may hope to perpetuate itself and direct the growth of society is education.

Through the schools of today, even more than ever before, an effort is being made to instill into the very nature of each boy and girl the ideals of fairplay, truthfulness, cooperation, and loyalty. A school should not be judged by its size or its complicated machinery. The criterion should be the services which the school renders to the pupils and the community of which they are a part. The facts are that that community prospers most whose boys and girls have received a comprehensive and well rounded education.

Enrollment and Attendance

The enrollment shows an increase over last year. There are now 110 at West Stewartstown and 62 in the five rural schools. Much more of an increase on the west side would necessitate an extra teacher and the fixing up of the further room.

The attendance records for the past year were fairly good. The number of tardinesses sums very large. Absence is often unavoidable but tardiness can usually be prevented.

Teachers

The following changes occurred in the teaching personnel; Helen Trecarten of Gorham Normal School was elected to teach at the Hollow School; Lillian Lowry, Plymouth Normal, at South Hill; Priscilla McConnell, Plymouth, at ,North Hill; Sigrid Christiansen, Keene, at Bear Rock, and Ruth Gray, Plymouth, at the West Primary. At Thanksgiving Violet Kelly was succeeded by Isabelle Nelson at the West Intermediate Room.

Buildings and Equipment

Minor repairs were made on the various buildings during the summer months. The North Hill School was completely redecorated inside. The South Hill School was painted outside and the toilets sheathed up. A few new desks and new primary chairs were purchased for the West Stewartstown School.

The Cedar Brook School is especially in need of redecoration and the roof at West Stewartstown should be shingled.

Health

We try to interpret health as a path to personal accomplishment and better living, rather than as a separate subject—health to become fit for service; not health for health's sake.

The interest of the child is enlisted by parent, teacher and nurse, but the responsibility of clearing the path of unnecessary handicaps rests on the parent.

It is the work of the school nurse to point out these defects to parents, refer them to family physicians and assist in securing corrections. The interrelation of health with economic and social conditions is obvious.

The school nurse has made 166 home visits during the months from September to January. During this time the following complete corrections have been secured: vision 6, skin 10, pediculosis 28, orthopeadic 1, teeth 33, tonsils 4, and vaccination 44. Toxoid protection from diptheria was given to 33 children.

The nurse finds as she becomes better acquainted that some things must be stressed in some schools and not in others—underweight due to an inadequate diet is a problem in certain districts while others do not appreciate the dependance of general health upon good teeth.

Each child has handicaps which are unique, depending upon his environment, which we must first understand.

Notes On The Budget

The total amount of the School Board's 1936-37 budget is \$14,749.21 as compared with \$15,151.60 for 1935-36. The estimated income is: State Aid \$4,520.-29, Tuition \$55.00, and Dog Licenses \$50.00. Total \$4,625.29. Approval of the Budget would therefore require that \$10,123.92 be raised by taxation. This would be \$123.48 less than last year's appropriation.

The School District indebtedness is now \$5,700.00. This should be reduced some each year if possible.

Conclusion

I wish to thank the School Committee, teachers, parents and friends for the interest and support that they have given to the schools during the past year.
