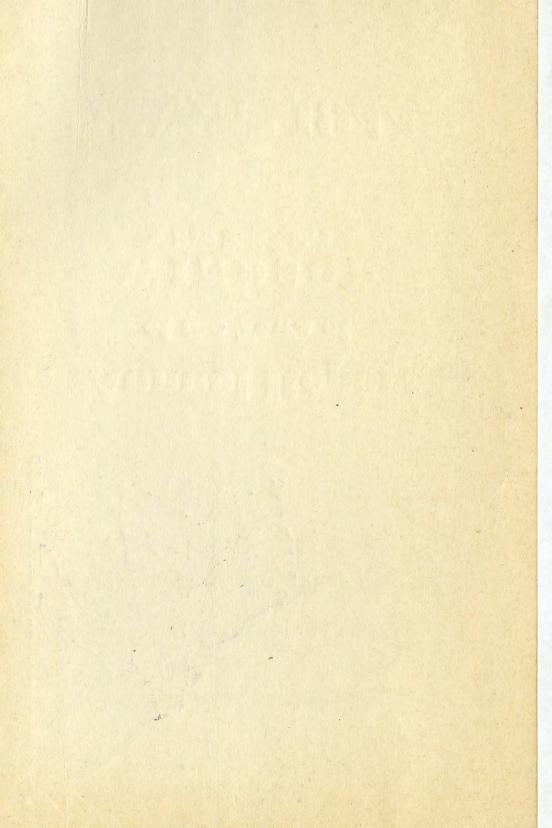

#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Windsor, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Woodrow residence in said Windsor on Tuesday, the Fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To cohose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3 To hear reports of Auditor and Agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote in relation thereto.
- 4 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways and bridges.
- 5 To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate \$12.69 as the town's share.
- 6 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 7 To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector deeds.

- 8 To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$25.00 for the Street Light for the ensuing year.
- 9 To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.

To the School Board and Citizens of Windsor:

I hereby submit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

#### ORGANIZATION

School Board: Neil Woodrow, chairman; Charles Nelson, Walter Shanley.

Superintendent of Schools: Howard F. Mason, Hillsboro, N. H.

Transporter: Mrs. Louise Murdough.

#### PUPIL DATA

Six pupils are attending the Dole School at the present time, Caroline, Daniel and Marshall Strickland and Gloria, Lilla, and Sally Woodrow. These same pupils were in attendance at the Dole School last year. Hazel Woodrow is attending Hillsboro High School.

The following pupils maintained perfect attendance for the number of terms indicated during the school year 1942-43: three periods, Lilla Woodrow and Sally Woodrow; two periods, Gloria Woodrow.

#### GENERAL REPORT

Due to the peculiar position of Windsor and the manner in which its children are educated I have taken it upon myself to do my best to represent you in all matters dealing with the schools in which your children receive their education.

A piano was very graciously donated to the Dole School by Mrs. Powers. This has served to give added enjoyment to the pupils and a better appreciation of their music. Mr. John Cranston also gave the Dole School a set of encyclopedias.

The pupils are being transported this year by Mrs. Murdough, the teacher at the Dole School. This not only saves on gas and tires in our country's time of dire need but also is being done at a saving in money to the town of Windsor.

Windsor is truly fortunate that their pupils can attend the Dole School while it is being taught by Mrs. Murdough. She is a teacher of long experience who is doing a fine job.

I have enjoyed excellent cooperation from everyone this year for which I am duly grateful.
