Town Warrant

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Acworth in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Acworth on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

Art. 3. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

Art. 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for breaking Roads.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for Construction of Class II road known as East Acworth from Honey brook corner and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum required by law, or will accept State Aid for Construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum required.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of Town Poor.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Lights.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Debt and Interest.

Art. 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on notes on credit of the Town such sums as may be needed to meet current expenses in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Old Home Day.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of Silsby Free Public Library.

Art. 13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to property bought by the Town for taxes.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.

Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to close subject to gates and bars the road leading East from Charlestown line to fork of roads West of Eric Bascom's farm.

Art. 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

That we raise the sum of \$660.00 for payment of Town Debt.

That we raise the sum of \$2,500.00 for winter maintenance of Roads.

That we raise the sum of \$5,973.00 for the support of Schools.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Acworth School Board:

I herewith submit my seventh annual report as your Superintendent of Schools.

I with you feel the loss to the Board through the death of Mrs. Helen Reed, and extend sympathy to her family. She was a good official.

In the fall of 1936 Acworth School District began a new plan for the education of its pupils. We are now following that plan.

There are maintained in Acworth three one teacher schools with grades one to six in each; pupils in grades seven to twelve are transported to Vilas High School at Alstead.

The work at each of the local schools has been very satisfactory this year. Miss Ruth Lane continues her work at East Acworth, Miss Maud Moody was placed in charge of the South Acworth School last fall, and Miss Flora Longa, a graduate of Keene Normal School is teaching at the Center. Acworth is fortunate to have able teachers who take such interest in their work.

The question of great interest to the voters of Acworth this year is, — Shall the present plan be extended three more years?

It seems to me that there are three parts to be considered, the value of the schools to the pupils, the value of the schools to the Town of Acworth, and the costs of the schools to Acworth School District.

Vilas High School has been organized into one of the best rural high schools in the State of New Hampshire. The teachers and the Alstead School District have tried to make Vilas High School an agent helpful to the larger community including Acworth. It is doubtful if a plan can be devised through which Acworth would be able to offer its pupils opportunities as beneficial as those they now enjoy, or one that would train them for greater social good in their own localities.

Considering this problem from a financial view point, there are several plans to be studied.

Any plan that would give the pupils of seventh and eighth grades a junior high training at the South or Center would be far more expensive than the present plan, and doubtlessly would deprive a number of children the privilege of attending a senior high school. Buildings would have to be rented, and transporting given to seventh and eighth grade pupils.

The only plan that I can find that would cost less than the present plan is to have three eight grade schools, and furnish no high school transportation—it is doubtful if that would be less expensive. While not as many pupils would attend high school, those that did might not all go to the same school. Doubtlessly Alstead as well as other districts would be justified to ask the average cost of high school education in this state—this amount can be collected from Acworth. Acworth is paying not more than ninety dollars per pupil for high school tuition and transportation. There are two districts in this union paying one hundred dollars per pupil for tuition alone. The costs of this plan should be about three hundred dollars less than the present cost, but there are elements entering in that might raise those costs.

I value the kindness and help that I have received from the Acworth School, the teachers and the citizens.
