To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 12th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow work.

4. To see how much money the town will raise for breaking of roads in winter.

5. To see if town will accept State Aid Construction and raise \$742.50 for same or will accept Town Road Assistance (Class 5) and raise \$498.64 for same.

6. To see if town will vote to accept State Aid for repairing bridge on Washburn road and appropriate money for town's share.

7. To see if town will vote to discontinue the road from Four Corners to the Orange town line.

8. To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate \$800 toward putting the road known as Knowles Hill road in passable condition. 9. To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50.00 to the Lakes Region Association for advertising the natural advantages and attractiveness of this town.

10. To see how much money the town will raise for Blister Rust Control.

11. To see if town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid early in the season.

12. To see if town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.

13. To act on any other matters that may legally come before this meeting.
