Warrant for Town Meeting

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Errol, in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Errol, on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the public library.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the fire department.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the police department.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the town poor.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.

- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the cemetery.
- 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town together with other towns in the region, a sum not to exceed 10c per \$1,000.00 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1944.
- 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of establishing a capital reserve fund to be used for constructing a new water works and sewer system in the village.
- 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purpose of purchasing a suitable plot of land, on which to erect a permanent Memorial or Honor Roll.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to consider the sale of the Municipal Electric Lighting plant, and if the vote be favorable to appoint a committee to investigate into the value of the plant and other conditions of sale and report its findings at some annual or special meeting of the Town.

Superintendent's Report

To the Errol School Board:

I hereby submit for your consideration, my eleventh annual report of the Errol schools.

At the close of school last June, we lost two of our teachers; viz., Daphne Hurlbert and Ethel Bartlett. Owing to our small enrollment and no pupils in town for grades nine and ten, it was voted by the School Board, with the consent of Commissioner Pringle, to suspend the high school grades for a year and combine the remaining grades and have but two teachers for a year. The teachers are as follows: Harry R. Conway for grade five through eight and Esther H. Bean for grades one through four. For next year, I suggest replacing a teacher for grades four to six. This would restore the elementary grades as they were a year ago; viz., primary grades one to three, intermediate grades four to six and the high school grades seven to nine. I would also suggest that the department of home economics be postponed for one more year.

It is estimated that our registration for another year will be as follows: Grade nine, six pupils; grade eight, seven pupils; grade seven, seven pupils; grade six, six pupils; grade five, five pupils; grade four, eleven pupils; grade three, two pupils; grade two, seven pupils; and there is no data available for grade one.

Nancy Hawkins, Larry Lizotte and Anne McLeod were the three pupils who had a perfect attendance record for the past year.

Last June, the following eight pupils completed the work of the tenth grade: Muriel Turner; Raymond Muise; Clarice Sweeney; Arthur Muise; Annette Roberts; Robert Gray; Marion Gould; and Merton Porter. James Jordan is transporting five Millsfield children and eleven from Errol. Mrs Zillah Thurston is transporting the children from the Upton Hill road.

The health work is under the care of the school nurse from the Colebrook nursing district. Last summer, I was unsuccessful in getting a health report from the nurse of the work done in the Errol schools for the previous year.

The report of the school census taken last September showed seventeen boys and fifteen girls in town between the ages of five and sixteen. All but two were reported in school—one between five and eight and one between fourteen and sixteen who had completed the work of the eighth grade. The total registration in our local schools on September 30th was fifty-five but twenty five of those were from out side of the district.

Last year, the schools were in session thirty-six weeks net. The unrepeated registration was sixty-six with a percent of attendance of 93.77. This is a little improvement over the previous year. The number of tardy marks was 64 which is less than the year before.

Six school board meetings were held. The schools recorded fifteen visits from citizens and the superintendent was credited with 152 teacher visits.

Some of the extra curricula activities have been curtailed owing to war conditions. We hope that conditions will so improve that normality may be resumed by another school year.
