TOWN WARRANT

(L.S.) THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the town of Grantham in the County of Sullivan, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Grantham on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Town Clerk, one Town Treasurer and one Police Officer for the ensuing year, one Selectman for the ensuing three years, one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing three years, and one Trustee of the Public Library for the ensuing two years to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mrs. Josie Philbrick, and one Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

Art. 2. To choose one or more Highway Agents and all other necessary town officers, agents and committees, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 3. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to defray town charges.

Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to apply for State Aid for highways, and raise and appropriate money for same.

Art. 5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary to repair highways and bridges.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of

the Trunk Line highway.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for State Aid maintenance.

Art. 8. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the Public Library.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust in this town.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to hire money if necessary.

Art. 11. To hear the reports of the officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to have the old proprietor's book copied, and appropriate money for same.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to buy a snow scraper, and raise and appropriate money for same.

Art. 14. To transact any other business that may come legally before said meeting.



SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board and Citizens of Grantham:

I submit herewith my first annual report as superintendent of the Grantham schools.

For the information of those who are taxpayers in the district and others interested in the welfare of the schools, I am putting down a few of the most outstanding points from the statistical report made to the State Board of Education for the year ending June 30, 1925.

ATTENDANCE

During the year 1924-25 there were thirty-eight pupils registered at the North Grantham school but not all of these were members of the school at any one time. Forty-two pupils were registered in the village school making a total of eighty in all schools for the year.

The per cent of attendance for the year was 93.5. The per cent of daily attendance for the state was 95.4.

The average salary paid to women teachers was \$816.66. The average salary for teachers in similar schools in the state was \$1,006.65.

It may be interesting to know that twenty-four visits were made to the schools by the superintendent and that there were only thirty-one visits by the citizens of the town.

TEACHERS

The teachers this year are all graduates of Plymouth Normal School. Miss Lilla Tuttle being the only one with experience, she being in her second year in her present position. From what I can learn there

have been very frequent changes in the teaching force. My own experience has been that the pupils have rated decidedly higher on standard tests where the same teacher continued in a school from three to five years.

Miss Wilson and Miss Baraw are also doing good work in their respective schools even though this is their first year of teaching.

PUPILS

There have been to date thirty pupils registered in the North Grantham school and thirty-seven pupils in the Village school. These have all been examined for physical defects by Dr. Churchill and cases that have needed attention or follow-up work done have been attended to or plans are ready for giving them attention. The physical condition of the children as a whole seems to be very good as the report of the examination will show.

BUILDINGS

The two-room building in the village was thoroughly overhauled and renovated during the summer. The partition between the two rooms was moved over to equalize the floor space. One new window was added to the primary room while one was removed from the

west side of the grammar room. The seats were rearranged and made to face in such a way that the light comes in on the left side of the pupils.

A new floor was laid in the primary room and the desks reset. The whole interior then was refinished. The walls and ceilings being calcimined in a buff color, the wood-work painted and the desks varnished. The rooms now make for attractiveness and usefulness.

The playground at this school has been leveled somewhat on the easterly side, a thing which was very badly needed.

In conclusion permit me to thank the School Board and the teachers and pupils for their cooperation and for their many acts of helpfulness.
