TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Henniker, in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

(L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town's Meeting House in said Henniker on Tuesday, the Ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.

3. To hear and act upon the reports of Town Officers, Library Trustees, Trustees of Trust Funds and other committees.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repair of highways and bridges.

5 To see what action the town will take in regard to the Public Health Nursing Association, raise money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise or appropriate, to defray the expense of observing Memorial Day.

7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, in addition to that required by law, for the support of Tucker Free Library.

8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the Fire Department, or take any action relative thereto.

9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise, or appropriate, for the purpose of defraying the cost and expense during the ensuing year of providing and maintaining hydrant service for the extinguishing of fires.

10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to reinsure the town buildings and town trucks.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for lighting streets for the ensuing year.

12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise toward paying its indebtedness.

13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes. 14. To see if the town will vote to accept from Fitz H. Courser the sum of one hundred dollars, the income of which is to be used for the perpetual care of the Fitz H. Courser lot in the south side of the Henniker cemetery.

15. To see if the town will vote to reestablish a street light opposite the residence of Benjamin T. Cram on Maple street; also the lights from the under pass to Henniker Junction or reestablish any other lights that have been discontinued, and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary, or take any action relative thereto.

16. To see what action the town will vote to take to prevent the spread of White Pine Blister Rust, raise money for the same, or take any action relative thereto.

17. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of the Warner road, so called, and raise and appropriate or set aside for the purpose the sum of \$2,041.00; or will accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$1,019.55.

18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,464.07 for the purpose of reimbursing the State for the balance of the Town's share of the cost of constructing the new bridges on the Bradford road, or take any action relative thereto.

19. Is it expedient to revise the constitution?

20. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

During the past year Henniker has had a great many cases of Mumps, Whooping Cough, Chicken Pox and German Measles, these do not have to be strictly quarantined.

Parents should endeavor to keep their children home and off the street while these diseases are prevalent and keep the number of cases as small as possible.

I have sent samples of milk and water to the Laboratory of Hygiene and all have been good. Have inspected several homes for boarding homes for children, licenses have been granted to all.

REPORT OF HENNIKER

PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING SERVICE

To the Selectmen and Citizens:

I hereby submit my annual report covering the period from Feb. 1, 1936 to Feb. 1, 1937.

The year 1936 has been rather a busy one, including bedside care, instructive work and School Nursing. Although the town was unfortunate in having three epidemics the past year, namely: German Measles, Mumps and Chicken-Pox, the majority of cases were mild and showed a quick recovery.

The following figures give some idea of the extent and variety of work for the past year.

General Visiting Service

- 672 visits to give bedside care
 - 17 visits to T. B. Patients
 - 28 visits to Chicken-Pox
 - 54 visits to German Measles (48 instructive)
- 56 visits to Mumps
- 523 Instructive visits made
 - 3 all night calls
 - 3 patients taken to hospital
 - 56 hours spent on Sunday and night calls.

A Diphtheria Toxoid clinic was held at Central School, Wednesday, June 17. Fourteen infants and 23 preschool children received the toxoid. The clinic was sponsored by the State Board of Health. Dr. Gillander was the attending Physician.

W. C. Goss presented a cartridge carried and used in the Revolutionary War by Captain Edward Whitman.

Gertrude Milliken, Bethel, Me., a Biography of Daniel Webster.

By the will of Alice E. Peabody of Concord, N. H., about 450 books consisting of Poetry, Drama, Travel, History, Biography and fiction. This collection contains many very fine editions: Shakespeare, Sir Walter Scott, Kipling's Works, Hawthorn's Dickens and many beautiful books of travel etc.

Mr. Willard Matthews, presented an old army swird of unknown history. This sword was given to Mr. Matthews when he was about eight years old by an uncle.

Henniker Woman's Club: Book, More Folk Tales by Speare and Gore.

Elizabeth Andrews of Hopkinton, N. H.: Fourteen books, mostly fiction.

Charles an dAlfred Ray: A bass horn and cornet-Part of a set of instruments purchased in the winter of 1859-60 by the Henniker Cornet band at a cost of \$1,000. (See Cogswell's History of Henniker, N. H.)

A. W. Ray: Orderly Book of the First Co. of Grenadiers, 40th Regiment, 4th Brigade, and 3rd Division of N. H. Militia. Dated Aug. 31, 1840 to September 1850. By the will of A. W. Ray: A Bass Viol or Cello, quite old.

Dr. E. J. Hart and daughters: A picture of Amy Brook Bridge on the road to Bradford. This was taken by Dr. Hart before the new bridge and improved highway was put in. This picture hangs in the reading room:

Mr. and Mrs. W. L. French: History of the 5th and 11th Regiments, also a register of the N. H. Soldiers and Sailors.

Georgie Fisher, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. M. Fisher: U. S. History in four volumes by J. C. Ridpath.

Miss H. F. Sawyer: Book, Anthony Adverse.

Mr. John Clark, of Beverly, Mass.: Added the new 1936 penny to the collection of pennies which he presented to the library several years ago. Every year he adds the new penny to keep the collection up to date.

From Mrs. Jennie Dodge's estate, presented by Mr. Ben Clark: A framed Proclamation for a general Thanksgiving for New Hampshire by Governor Wentworth in the year of 1763. Aug. 11 of that year was the day of Thanksgiving.

Presented by Willis Cogswell: A beautiful goldheaded cane; originally given to Col. L. W. Cogswell on his 65th birthday, by John, Leander and Willis Cogswell. Miss Helen F. Sawyer: Loaned the Figurine of Ann Boleyn, a prominent character in early English History. Having been the cause of a disturbance in that country similar to the one enacted this past year. This is a very old piece of work, supposedly made in Bow, England by the Strafford China Works about 1522.

The illumination of the trees on the library lawn is much enjoyed and appreciated by the shut-ins who can watch them as well as all of the townspeople, we have Mr. Merle Patenaude to thank for them, who kindly installs them.

Mr. G. L. Allen has taken pictures of the so-called Davis block which has been taken down to give place to the Esso filling station. The Davis block was a very old house and a picture of it in years to come may be interesting.

During the flood in March, many pictures of different places in town were taken and are being kept for the historical value they may have in future years.

Mrs. Wilbur Parmenter has charge of the Saturday Afternoon Story hour for children, and the number attending has nearly doubled, which proves that it is a successful venture.

Beginning with the first of January 1937 we changed the hours of the library from the "two to five and seven to nine" to from "three to eight" continuously. Whether this will be a permanent arrangement or not will depend on its popularity. It is encouragin gto know the work of the library is on the increase, and the library more and more being used and appreciated.

Many thanks are due all who have helped to add to the attractiveness and helpfulness of our library. May we never forget to be grateful, first that we

have (a library) and that so many remember us with kindly gifts to add to its usefulness and benefits.

The above table shows that less time was lost this. year than the year before. If the March flood had not occurred the full 360 half-days required by law would have been attained.

The percent of attendance is too low due to the amount of sickness among pupils. There is a very commendable drop in the amount of tardiness; three schools had non. The Brick School has had 100% attendance for five years, a remarkable record.

The total number of pupils enrolled in the schools of the district was 318. Of these four from Deering were in the Quaker Street School and eleven were tuition pupils at the high school. Deduction of these leaves 303 pupils residing in the district and attending public Schools.

On account of the small number of pupils, five for the last part of the year, the Brick School was not opened in the fall of '36. These pupils are being transported to the Central School in the village.

The plan of having Grade 7 of the Junior High School in the Cetnral building together with half of Grade 6 as we did in '35-'36 was not approved by the State Department for '36-'37. In order not to lose our approval as a six-year high school the 7th grade was moved back to the high school building where the grade and its teacher would be under the same general management as grade 8. This enabled us to reunite the two parts of grade 6 which had been separated during the past year. This year grade 6 is small, but next year's grade 6 probably will number about 28 pupils. Grade 3 is still divided into two parts, half being with Grade 2, and half with grade 4. We have found the plan of dividing these grades unsatisfactory, but can see no better solution, of the problem except having a teacher for each grade. Too many pupils for each teacher would be the result of putting two entire grades in the same room. With the splendid opportunity for physical education there is also need that a teacher be put in charge of this work.

The activities in debates with other high schools, Kearsarge Festival Orchestra, and Eighth Grade Spelling Match took place at the usual time during the year. The Spelling Match open to all schools in Supervisory Union No. 26 was won by Edith Traganza.

On account of the severe illness of the superintendent during May and the last part of April he was unable to carry on his usual activities. Additional responsibility thus fell both upon the teachers and the school board. With an excellent spirit of cooperation the routine of school work as well as arrangements for the annual concert of the Kearsarge Festival Orchestra were performed as usual.

We are very grateful to the board, the teachers and pupils for their assistance and the many evidences of sympathy shown us during our illness. It has indeed been a pleasure to return to work with them for the advancement of the schools.
