#### **TOWN WARRANT**

#### State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hillsborough, County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in Child's Opera House in said town on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose one Selectman for three years, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Highway Agent, Town Clerk and Chief of Police for one year, Trustee of the Fuller Public Library for two years, Trustee of Trust Funds for three years and all other necessary town officers or agents for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To hear the reports of the town officers to the auditors, the reports of the auditors, agents, committees or other town officers heretofore chosen or appointed and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for town officers' salaries, town officers' expenses, Community Building, appropriations for street lights and all current expenses of the town and such amounts as may be necessary to apply upon the principal and interest of the town debt.

- Article 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the building and repairing of highways bridges and culverts.
- Article 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for Memorial Day purposes.
- Article 6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 to be applied upon the salary of the District Nurse.
- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to instruct and empower the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses of the town and in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the support of band concerts for the coming season.
- Article 9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of co-operating with the State and Federal governments in the control of the White Pine Blister Rust or act in relation thereto.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$60.00 for the care and maintenance of the Town Clock, so-called, on Smith Memorial Church.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum equal to not more than one one-hundreth of one percent (1-100 of 1 percent) of the assessed valuation based upon assessment of 1941 for the purpose of publicizing the natural advantages of the town, in connection with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the permanent improvement of highways.

Article 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to deliver inventory blanks, to residents when assessing.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Salary of the Highway Agent and Chief of Police or take any action thereon.

Article 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### General Discussion

The schools of the Town district opened in September with enrolments as follows: Center, 20; Flat, 24; Lower Village, 15; Upper Village, 27; Merrill, 9; making a total of ninety-five pupils. At this writing the full membership is less owing to the fact that several families have moved out of town. Twenty-one pupils from the district attend Hillsboro high school, which makes a total school enrolment of about one-hundred-sixteen. For the last few years the school population of the country as a whole is much lower than it used to be due to our economic and social conditions, which tend to a lower birthrate. It is not good for any nation to have a continued low birthrate.

Since last report the school board has made a heroic effort to improve the lack of water in the schools, by cleaning out and repairing old wells. The buildings have been kept up. And our policy of furnishing the pupils with up-to-date and modern materials has been continued. The children of this district who attend high school are giving a good account of themselves.

The question of whether or not the schools of this district should be consolidated in one way or another belongs in the hands of the voters of the school district. It can be shown that a consolidated school system will offer better athletic and social advantages. Such a system can offer more interesting, more lifelike activities, more comfortable living quarters, and wider contacts. Financial statistics compiled over a period of years both locally

and the state over do not prove either one way or the other that any one system is less expensive. The one room situation is probably less expensive to operate. It cannot be shown that a consolidated school system will mean better scholastic achievement in higher institutions of learning. The advantages which should be stressed in the life of any individual are chiefly a matter of opinion. They are also a matter which concerns the pocket-book. For these very good reasons the voters of the school district should turn out strong at the annual meeting, and this being a democracy, let the opinion of the majority rule.

In these days of national and international strife let us not forget that the education of our boys and girls must go on uninterrupted by the lure of high wages which even school boys and girls may command. We need all the advantages which education affords in order to maintain and propagate the principles of American democracy for the defense of which we have taken up arms. Dictatorships do not thrive among enlightened peoples.

A very important problem which school districts must face this year is the question of rising costs. Consequently school boards will be obliged to increase some of the budget items in their recommendations for the appropriations of the ensuing year. It goes without saying that the general public in Hillsboro is as well aware of these conditions as those of us who are directly connected with the conduct of the schools, and that these matters will be favorably and sympathetically considered at the annual meeting of the school district.

It has been a pleasure and a privilege to be associated with your school board, they work with open minds and a fine spirit of cooperation on behalf of the boys and girls of the community.
