

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hooksett in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

[L. s.]

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hooksett on Tuesday, the ninth (9th) day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To hear and act upon the report of the Town Budget Committee.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget in whole or in part.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to give a discount of two per cent (2%) on all taxes, except poll taxes, paid on or before the fifteenth day of July.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to accept all trust funds not before accepted.
- 7. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relative thereto.
- 8. To hear the reports of the selectmen, town treasurer, agents, auditors and committees, or other officers heretofore chosen or appointed, and to pass any vote relating thereto.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars to be contributed to the funds of George E. Merrill Post No. 37 for Memorial and Armistice Day ceremonies. (Petitioned for by Walter Murray, Commander and thirteen others).
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed Six Hundred (\$600.00) Dollars for the purpose of purchasing a motor truck and sufficient material and labor to replace the ladder and supply truck now out of commission at No. 2 Fire House in South Hooksett. (Petitioned for by Chief William S. Smith and fifteen others).
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-three hundred nine dollars and fifteen cents (\$2,309.15) to surface treat with tarvia the following locations: Hackett Hill Road, from West Side Road to residence of George W. Kimball; Mill St., Hooksett Village; Stearns Avenue, Lincoln Park; Manchester Road from City line to residence of Frank Murray; Smith Road to residence of Soloman Roberge; Hale and Alice Avenues and Highland Street, or to take any action relative thereto.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three hundred dollars (\$300.00) to purchase additional snow fence or take any action relative thereto.
- 13. To see of the town will vote that all labor contracted by the town shall be paid for weekly instead of monthly. (Petitioned for by W. S. Smith and fifteen others).
- 14. To see if the town will vote to give the selectmen the right and power to dispose of any equipment discarded by the town. (Petitioned for by W. S. Smith and fourteen others).
- 15. To see if the town will vote to have a light placed in front of the half-way house, on Daniel Webster High-

- way. (Petitionel for by John L. H. Prince and fourteen others).
- 16. To see if the town will vote to have all driveways and approaches to all public buildings and churches and private schools plowed whenever necessary. (Petitioned for by W. S. Smith and fifteen others).
- 17. To see if the town will vote to have a street light placed in front of the residence of Andrew Merrill on Benedick Avenue, off of Stearns Avenue in Lincoln Park. (Petitioned for by Wm. H. Atkins, Jr., and ten others).
- 18. To see if the town will vote to install two street lights between the streets of Elmer Avenue and Mammouth Road on Hale Avenue. (Petitioned for by Stanley Durette and thirteen others).
- 19. To see if the town will vote to have a truck collect garbage in the section called Lincoln Park and also Hooksett Village. (Petitioned for by D. E. Couturier and twelve others).
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand dollars (\$1000.00) for the improvement of the Auburn Road, provided that the State of N. H. appropriate the sum of Two Thousand dollars (\$2000.00) for the same. The sums appropriated by State and Town shall be extended under the direction of the State Highway Commissioner on the Auburn Road in Town of Hooksett. (Petitioned for by Vernon T. Yandoh and eleven others).
- 21. To see if the town will vote a sum of Fifty dollars (\$50.00) for non-freeze type fire extinguishers and Foam Type fire extinguishers for the Fire Dept. No. 1. (Petitioned for by Chief Ovila Chevrette and fourteen others).
- 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-six hundred and forty six dollars (\$2646.00) as its proportionate share of state aid construction to be expended on the Londonderry Turnpike and Auburn road, or five hundred twenty-seven dollars

and thirty eight cents, the State to furnish Two thousand one hundred and nine dollars and fifty cents (\$2,109.50) making a total of Two thousand six hundred and thirty-six dollars and eighty-eight cents (\$2636.88) the same to be expended under the direction of the State Highway Department for Class V town road assistance, or take any action relative thereto.

- 23. To see if the town will vote to establish and maintain a public road commencing at Mail Box 225A Turnpike Road and thence running East, for approximately one-quarter (1-4) of a mile, terminating at the home of Julia Oslizla, or take any action relative thereto. (Petitioned for by Stella Oslizla and fifteen others).
- 24. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1,515.00 for volunteer guard duty during the flood of March 1936 on failure of its passage in Legislature. (Petitioned for by John F. Clough and eighty-eight others).
- 25. To see if the town will vote to have installed on the Benton Corner Road a street light at pole No. J-285-7. (Petitioned for by Mrs. Nora Gillespi and twelve others).
- 26. To see what action the town wishes to take concerning the road along the river from the Post office to the West River Road.
- 27. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four hundred dollars (\$400.00) to lay new hardwood floors, and rearranged lighting system in the Town Hall to conform with up to date standards, or take any action relative thereto.
- 28. To see if the town will appropriate a sum of money to construct an addition to present structure of Town Hall, or take any action relative thereto.
- 29. To see if the town will vote to purchase a row boat to be used for rescue work on the Merrimack river and to be stationed at Fire House No. 1, or take any

action relative thereto.

- 30. To see if it is expedient to revise the constitution.
- 31. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.



REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Hooksett:

Herewith is presented my third annual report. Particular attention is given to flood damage and temporary organization, enrollment and teaching staff, health supervision and other activities, and new building and equipment

Flood Damage and Temporary Organization

Early in the evening of March 19, 1936, the flood waters of the Merrimack River completely demolished and swept from its foundation the two-story brick building in Hooksett Village, know as the Number Six School. Not only the building but all equipment and materials, including valuable books and scholars' supplies for other schools in the town, were a complete loss. Sixty-one public school children were deprived of school facilities.

The sum of ten dollars per pupil, amounting to more than six hundred dollars, was allotted by the State Board of Education from emergency funds for the replacement of textbooks and supplies. Further state aid allotments and adjustments for current expenses gave Hooksett schools a total of \$3,338.26.

Within a little more than two weeks the interior of a third classroom had been finished and equipped to accommodate forty pupils in the Martin's School. The Town Hall was equipped for twenty-five and later for forty pupils. A special Boston and Maine bus was provided to convey over forty children from the Village to the Martin's School. These two schools were continued in session for Village pupils during the April vacation. In this way the actual loss of school time was slightly more than a week.

Enrollment and Teaching Staff

Notice was filed on June 13, 1936, that the Holy Rosary Parochial School, which was seriously damaged by the flood, would be unable to care for its pupils in September. As a result over fifty (50) pupils have been added to the public school enrollment. This has nearly doubled the number attending the school, taught by Mrs. Gertrude Washburn, in the Town Hall. It also necessitates the transportation of thirty children to the Allenstown Grammar School, making thirty-three elementary pupils for whom tuition is being paid. Eighty-one pupils from Hooksett are enrolled in public high schools and academy. Of these, fifty attend the Central High in Manchester. The remainder are distributed in Concord, Pembroke, and Manchester West High.

Schools opened in September 1936 with four changes in teachers. Three of these were due to withdrawal from the profession and one to a transfer. Miss Kathryn T. Reynolds of Manchester was elected teacher of the grammar grades and principal of the Lincoln Park School, succeeding Mrs. Grace P. Hadley who resigned after several years of efficient service in this position. Miss Reynolds was graduated from Plymouth Normal School in 1929. The next seven years she taught large rural schools in Pittsfield and Deerfield and for several summers has been physical director of the Pittsfield Community playgrounds.

At Hackett Hill we lost a superior teacher through the resignation of Miss Muriel F. Woodward. The vacancy was filled by the election of Miss Valma B. Morrill of Derry. Miss Morrill is a graduate of Keene Normal School, class of 1924. Her experience includes twelve years in the schools of Londonderry and Moultonboro.

To fill a vacancy in the intermediate grades at Martin's, due to the resignation of Miss Annie R. Whittemore, Miss Lenore C. Roberts was transferred from the River

Road School. Mrs. Dorothy Allen was elected teacher at River Road.

Health Supervision and Other Activities

The services of your school nurse were particularly valuable both to your community and to the Red Cross workers during the flood period. Her school duties had brought her into intimate acquaintance with the majority of homes. Hence her services and her counsel were sought and appreciated by the members of the Red Cross staff. In her printed report will be found only statistics of school work for the year ending with June 1936. Such a report fails to show the service rendered during the flood, the many visits to pupils' homes and the mileage required in transporting children to and from the various clinics outside of her nursing district.

A new activity in Hooksett was a spelling contest among the various schools in town. Each school was represented by a team of three members, chosen from the six upper grades. The Lincoln Park School, represented by Helen Kruczek, Grade VII, Robert Lindh, Grade VI, and Gloria Lyons of Grade IV, won by a score of 294 out of a possible 300 points.

Late in May the Lincoln Park team represented the Town of Hooksett and won third place among similar spelling teams from the towns of Pembroke, Allenstown, Candia, Deerfield, and Raymond.

Through the generous co-operation of the local Grange both contests were held in the Hall at Martin's.

An activity, in which the Neal School has taken the leadership and has secured the co-operation and interest of the neighborhood, is the editing annually of the "Neal School Paper." The original cover design and some fifteen pages of material, written and illustrated by the pupils from all grades, give excellent motivation to grammar, composition and drawing. The paper has merited the interest taken in it by a wide circle of teachers.

In December the operetta "Sunny of Sunnyside" was attractively presented in the Grange Hall by the pupils of Martin's School. For some time this school has won recognition by the musical ability of its pupils. It is hoped that professional music supervision may again be made available for all schools in Hooksett.

In June a class of forty pupils was graduated from the Eighth Grade. Thirty-one of these are attending high schools or academy.

New Building and Equipment

Following the devastating flood of last March, action was promptly taken by the school district, authorizing the school board to purchase ample school grounds adjacent to the village and to proceed immediately with plans for the erection of a modern school building. For this purpose the sum of \$18,000.00 was raised by the School District. This sum represents the total costs to Hooksett of the building now nearing completion and located on what was formerly a part of the Samuel Head estate. All additional cost of the building is met by free grants from federal and state funds.

Under the direction of Carl E. Peterson, architect, and Louis E. Martel, contractor, both of Manchester, a four-room brick building, designed to accommodate one hundred twenty children, will soon be completed. In addition to an ample playroom and fire-proof boiler room in the basement, rooms are available for junior high school courses in domestic science and mechanic arts. On the main floor a movable partition between two classrooms provides an auditorium with stage adequate for graduations and similar functions. Heated and ventilated coatrooms are built adjacent to each classroom. On the same floor there are also located the library, offices, and toilet rooms.

With the completion of this building and improvement of grounds, Hooksett will have one of the most modern and attractive four-room schools in the state.

Emergency equipment was chosen and purchased, last spring, with a view to furnishing a new building. Consequently eighty-five movable chair-desk sets, and two teachers' desks and chairs are available to equip the two convertible class and assembly rooms. Before September there will be needed furniture to equip one, and possibly two, additional classrooms. There will also be needed library table and chairs.

A distinct improvement has been made at Lincoln Park by the introduction of city water, replacing an electric pump and pressure tank.

Since power for lights has now been brought within a short distance of the Neal School, it is hoped that this building which serves the purpose of community center as well as school may soon have electric lights.

In Conclusion

I wish to express appreciation for the prompt and generous co-operation extended by town and school officials, the Grange and other organizations in restoring school facilities.

Characteristic of the past year has been a more general co-operation by parents. I believe this is largely in response to the home visits made by your teachers. It greatly assists both the child and the teacher in making those improved adjustments that determine educative growth. The attitudes of the child, more than high marks, determine his prospects for efficient living.
