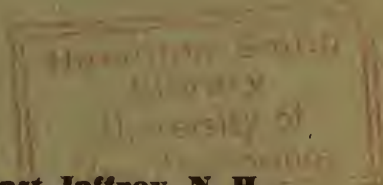

TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey, in the County of Cheshire,
qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Union Hall on School Street in East Jaffrey Village, in said Town, on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, and all other necessary Town Officers.
2. To hear all reports and act thereon.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be required for the support of the poor, building and repairing highways and bridges, fire department, Memorial Day, street lights, and all other Town Charges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to accept as a public highway, the right of way, thirty-three feet wide, extending one thousand feet northerly from the Peterborough Road, on the Westerly side of Cheshire Pond, said public highway to be known as Ridgecrest Road, as petitioned for by Lucy C. Gentsch and others.
6. To see if the Town will vote to have an electric light installed on Oak Street hill, to raise and appropriate \$15.00 to pay service charge or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Adolph Bibeau and others.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to continue the survey of Town Roads or act in any way relating thereto.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$367.00 to the Monadnock Region Association of Southern New Hampshire for the issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising, calling attention to the resources and natural advantages of the Town, in co-operation with the other thirty-seven towns in the Monadnock Region.
9. To see if the Town will vote to install two electric lights in the rear of Union Hall and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30.00 to pay service charge.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 to pay to the Parent-Teachers Association for the salary of the caretaker at the public bath-house at Contoocook Lake or act in any way relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to establish the width of Blake Road, as laid out by the selectmen pursuant to the vote of the Town March 11, 1880, as forty (40) feet and to lay out and extend said way of the same width over the Northwesterly side of land of Boston & Maine Railroad Southwesterly to land of Alfred LaPlant about four hundred seventy (470) feet Southwesterly from the Southwesterly side of Squantum Road and to take any necessary action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for State Aid Construction upon condition that the State will contribute the sum of \$3,500.00 to be expended on the Bond's Corner Road so called, or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$901.74 upon condition that the State allot the sum of \$3,606.95 or act in any way relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to construct a sewer on East Main Street, Grove Street, Juniper Street and Brooke Street, or in that vicinity; raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay for the same, or act in any way relating thereto as petitioned for by Hermidas LaForce and others.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a Town Engineer whose compensation shall be established on an hourly basis by the Selectmen, or act in any way relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to construct a foot bridge adjoining the stone bridge across the Contoocook River near the saw-mill of Bush & Sawyer; raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$1,500.00 to pay for the same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Everett D. Bingham and others.

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$200.00 to pay Hubert F. O'Neil as Chief of Police the amount of his salary during the time of his recent disability or act in any way relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to lay a line of sewer pipes in Forcier Way, so called, leading East from Stratton Street, and to place a septic tank at the end of said line of pipes, and raise and appropriate money to pay for the same; it is understood and agreed that Cyril Forcier, the owner of the land, will give a right of way to lay the said pipes in said Way without cost to the Town, or act in any way relating thereto as petitioned for by Alphonse Belanger and others.

18. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the municipal accounting division and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.
9. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$300.00 for foot lights in Union Hall, or act in any way relating thereto.
10. To see if the district will raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$300.00 for the purpose of maintaining adult classes or act in any way relating thereto.

TOWN SURVEYS — REPORT NO. 6

Selectmen of Jaffrey, N. H.
Gentlemen:

The following is the sixth progress report on Town Surveys. After a lapse of seven years, the sum of \$200.00 was appropriated for the survey of Town Roads with the following results:

Main Street was surveyed from the Catholic Church westerly to South Hill Road in the Center, Old Jaffrey Road from Main Street at the Center to North Street and North Street to the residence of Hiram Cutter, connecting with previous surveys. Highland Avenue was completed and Gilmore Pond Road from Highland Avenue to River Street. This made two complete circuits and the traverses were adjusted and most of the survey plotted on the regular sheets, there now being thirty-five cloth mounted sheets in the set.

Line and grade stakes were given for the improvement of the grounds at the new Union School, including drains, sidewalks, drives and grassed areas.

Surveys were made for the sewer in Jaffrey Center and line and grade stakes were given during construction.

Line and grade stakes were set for sidewalk relocation on Main Street for the new bridge in East Jaffrey Village.

The center line was established for Gilmore Pond Road from River Street westerly to Highland Avenue.

TOWN SURVEYS — REPORT NO. 7

Selectmen of Jaffrey, N. H.
Gentlemen:

Following is the seventh progress report on Town Surveys. With an appropriation of \$200.00, at the last annual Town Meeting, for the survey of town roads the following was accomplished:

Academy Street was surveyed from Main Street to connect with a property survey and a part of Gilson Road to connect other property surveys so that now a continuous surveyed line extends along the roads from the Sharon-Rindge-Jaffrey Line Post over Squantum Road, Main Street, Academy Street, Gilson Road and Dublin Road to the Jaffrey-Dublin Line Post on the westerly side of Thorndike Pond. The southeast and northwest ends of this traverse have not been plotted on the town sheets because the two ends have not been tied in with other road traverses to make a closed survey. A part of South Hill Road and all of Sawtelle Road were surveyed, making a closed traverse with Main Street which was surveyed last year. Prospect Street was surveyed and the traverse extended to the Old Jaffrey Road for a closed survey. Measurements of buildings were made on Oak, Pine, Grove and Brook Streets and K K Road to complete plans of previous surveys.

Six new streets (on cloth mounted paper) were started making a total of forty-one in the set to date. Property surveys are tied in to the town surveys whenever possible.

In addition to the town survey, line and grade stakes were given for the construction of the sewer in the Center and on Main Street and Bradley Court. Line and grade were given for the resurfacing of Prospect, Aetna, Pine and Wheeler Streets and Stearns Road.

ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

March 12, 1940

Officers elected: Town Clerk, Walter H. Gentsch; Selectman for three years, Ovila J. Belletete; Town Treasurer, John G. Townsend; Highway Agent, Henry J. Belletete; Chief of Police, Hubert F. O'Neil; Chief Engineer of Fire Department, Samuel Lafreniere; Overseer of Poor, James H. Fitzgerald; Water Commissioner for three years, James B. Perry; Tax Collector, Hubert F. O'Neil; Commissioner of Humiston Park for three years, George A. Hart, Sr.; Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, George S. Austermann; Auditors, Fred L. Cournoyer, Joseph D. Donahue and George A. Hart.

At a legal meeting duly holden in the Town of Jaffrey on the second Tuesday of March, 1940 at 9 o'clock in the forenoon at the new School Auditorium in said Town, the supervisors of the check list having filed two alphabetical lists of the legal voters of the Town of Jaffrey and made oath to the same as the law directs and the Selectmen having returned the Warrant with the certificate of posting thereon at the time and place of meeting.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, George H. Duncan, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon. The Moderator read the Warrant and the return of same.

The package of ballots was publicly broken in open meeting and the ballots were delivered to the ballot clerks, and the ballots were then and there examined and counted by the election officials and the Moderator certified to the Clerk that the number of ballots forwarded by the Secretary of State to the Town of Jaffrey have been examined and counted and the total number of ballots received were one thousand five hundred and seventy-five (1,575), six hundred (600) Democrat, and nine hundred seventy-five (975) Republican, and all are for the use of the said Town of Jaffrey. The ballot box was publicly opened by the Moderator and shown to be empty.

Article 1. It was moved and seconded that the Moderator appoint a Committee of three to bring in recommendations for Auditors.

Motion unanimously carried.

The Moderator appointed for said Committee: Lewis S. Record, John J. Evans, and Eleanor S. Austermann. Said committee reported and recommended as follows: Fred L. Cournoyer, Joseph D. Donahue, and George A. Hart.

It was moved and seconded that we accept and adopt the report of the committee. Motion was unanimously carried and the above were declared elected Auditors.

It was moved and seconded that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for George S. Austermann for Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

The motion was unanimously carried.

The Clerk cast one ballot and George S. Austermann was declared elected Trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

It was moved and seconded that we proceed to elect two highway agents by the Australian ballot. It was moved that the above motion be amended to elect one highway agent. This was seconded. (Moderator surrendered chair to Randy P. Cournoyer to enter discussion). (Moderator resumed Chair).

It was moved the previous question. Seconded. This motion unanimously carried and debate closed.

The Moderator appointed the following tellers: Charles Bent, Theron Champney, Alfred Cournoyer and Willis Towne.

The whole number of ballots given in was 457.

Necessary for choice, 229, upon which

One Road Agent	264
Two Road Agents	193

The Moderator stated the question before the meeting was the amendment and the amendment was adopted by vote.

The Moderator ruled that the original motion as amended was before the meeting.

The original motion as amended was unanimously carried.

Article 3. It was moved and seconded that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.

Motion unanimously carried.

Article 4. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to construct a float at Contoocook Lake, near the bath house, said construction to be under the direction of the Selectmen.

Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 5. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,099.25 for State Aid Construction, provided the State will contribute the sum of \$2,099.25 to be expended on the Bond's Corner Road, so called.

Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 6. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Seventy (\$370.00) dollars as the Town's proportionate share of the expense of Monadnock Region Association's advertising campaign for the development of the Monadnock Region.

Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 7. Passed over for the time being.

Article 8. Passed over for the time being.

Article 9. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred thirty (\$330.00) dollars to complete the grading and any other necessary work at Humiston Field. This work to be under the supervision of the Park Commissioners.

Motion seconded and carried.

Article 7. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,300.00 to purchase a Caterpillar tractor, said sum to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen.

Motion seconded and lost.

Article 8. It was moved that we pass over this Article.

Motion seconded and carried.

Article 10. It was moved that we pass over this Article.

Motion seconded and carried.

Article 11. It was moved that we pass over this Article.

Motion seconded and carried.

Article 12. Moderator surrendered chair to Randyl P. Cournoyer. George H. Duncan moved, That the Town Road Agent hereby is authorized to plow snow-roads for private parties upon written request filed with the Agent prior to December 1 of each year, at the rate of fifty cents for each one hundred linear feet or fraction thereof for each plowing; provided, however, that no such plowing shall be done for any person failing to pay for such plowing for the preceding winter season; that the amount in arrears from each person shall be published in the Town Report for the succeeding year; and that snow-roads to churches may be plowed without notice or charge.

Motion seconded and lost.

It was moved to pass over this Article.

Seconded and unanimously carried.

George H. Duncan made the following resolution:

Whereas, Experience in the past has shown the necessity of Flood Control in the Contoocook Valley; and

Whereas, the Federal Government has recognized this need by making engineering studies in the area, authorizing the construction of a flood control dam on the Blackwater River and contemplating a dam on the Contoocook River near West Hopkinton; therefore

Be It Resolved, That we, the voters of Jaffrey in town meeting assembled this twelfth day of March, 1940 hereby approve the principle established by the Blackwater River dam for control by dams on tributaries rather than by dams on the main River near its mouth; and request an extension of that principle by construction of similar works on the upper tributaries of the Contoocook, thereby giving protection to the entire Contoocook Valley; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of these resolutions be transmitted by the Town Clerk to the Secretary of War, the Secretary of Agriculture, United States Senators H. Styles Bridges and Charles W. Tobey, United States Representative Foster Stearns and Governor Francis P. Murphy.

This resolution was seconded and unanimously carried.

Moderator, George H. Duncan, resumed the chair.

Article 13. It was moved that the Town continue the printing of vital statistics in the Town Report.

Motion was seconded and carried.

Article 14. It was moved that the sum of two hundred (\$200.00) dollars be raised and appropriated to continue the survey of Town Roads to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen.

Motion was seconded and carried.

Article 15. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars to complete the construction of the sewer in Jaffrey Center Village to be expended under the direction of the Board of Health.

Motion seconded and carried.

Article 16. Jason C. Sawyer moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred seventy-five (\$175.00) dollars to reimburse Hubert F. O'Neil, Chief of Police, the damages and expenses he paid as a

result of a law suit arising out of the performance of his official duties, brought against him by one August P. Duval.

Motion seconded.

The Moderator ruled that this motion is not in order; that the Budget Committee did not include an item for this Article in the Budget. A member of the Budget Committee explained that this Article was included in the Budget under the item of "Town Charges."

Jason C. Sawyer appealed the Moderator's ruling.

The appeal from the decision and ruling of the Moderator was put to a vote and the Moderator's ruling and decision was unanimously overruled and rejected.

The original motion made by Jason C. Sawyer was put to a vote and carried.

Article 17. It was moved and seconded that we pass over this Article. Motion carried.

Article 18. It was moved to accept and adopt the Reports as printed in the Town Report.

Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 19. It was moved that the Town raise and appropriate the sum of seventy-four thousand, two hundred sixty-two dollars and twenty-six cents. (\$74,262.26).

Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

Six P. M. The hour having arrived for closing the polls the ballot box was publicly opened and the ballots removed therefrom.

The Moderator, in the presence of the Selectmen, Town Clerk, and Ballot Inspectors sorted and counted the votes for Town Officers and made a public declaration of the whole number of votes given in for each person voted for and those elected to Town Office.

The Check Lists were used during the balloting. The ballots for Town Officers and Presidential Primary were sealed and subscribed to by the Moderator and Selectmen and delivered to the Town Clerk to be preserved.

Voted to adjourn at 10:15 P. M. March 12, 1940.

It was moved and seconded that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Jason C. Sawyer for Moderator. The motion was unanimously carried. The Clerk cast one ballot for Jason C. Sawyer and the Moderator declared him elected Moderator and administered the oath of office in open meeting.

Article 2. It was moved and seconded that the Moderator be instructed to cast one ballot for Walter H. Gentsch for Clerk for the ensuing year. The motion was unanimously carried. The Moderator cast one ballot for Walter H. Gentsch for Clerk and declared him elected and administered the oath of office in open meeting.

Article 3. It was moved and seconded that the Clerk cast one ballot for C. Francis Wozmak for a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years. Motion unanimously carried. The Clerk cast one ballot for C. Francis Wozmak and the Moderator declared him elected and administered the oath of office in open meeting.

Article 4. It was moved and seconded that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for Lawrence W. Brown for Treasurer for the ensuing year. The motion was unanimously carried. The Clerk cast one ballot for Lawrence W. Brown and he was declared elected Treasurer.

Article 5. It was moved that the School District raise and appropriate the sum of sixty (\$60.00) dollars, as salary of the school board; twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars as salary of truant officer; five (\$5.00) dollars as salary of the district clerk; ten (\$10.00) dollars as salary of district treasurer; and five (\$5.00) dollars as salary of the moderator.

The motion was seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 6. It was moved that the reports of the School District be accepted and adopted as printed in the Town Report.

The motion was seconded and unanimously carried.

Article 7. It was moved and seconded that the Auditors to be elected at the Town Meeting tomorrow also act as School District Auditors.

The motion was unanimously carried.

Article 8. It was moved that the School District accept the budget of the School Board as approved by the Budget Committee, and for this purpose that the District raise and appropriate forty-six thousand six hundred ten (\$46,610.00) dollars for the support of public schools, and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district.

The motion seconded.

(Lewis S. Record gave an explanation of the School Budget.)

George H. Duncan moved that the motion be amended by reducing the amount three thousand (\$3,000.00) dollars so that the total appropriation would be forty-three thousand six hundred ten (\$43,610.00) dollars.

Motion seconded.

The motion to amend was put to a vote and lost. George H. Duncan asked for a division vote and the vote was in the negative and the motion to amend was lost.

The original motion was put to a vote and carried.

Article 9. It was moved: "To perpetuate a name that has been familiar and loved by generations of Jaffrey families and visitors,

Be it resolved that the voters here assembled in the School District meeting this 11th day of March hereby express a sentiment that this building in which we are now assembled be known from this day forth as Union Hall."

Motion seconded and unanimously carried.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Jaffrey School Board:

I submit this, my twenty-third annual report as Superintendent of Schools, it being the thirty-second in the series under union supervision. With this report is also submitted the report of Conant High School by Headmaster Ernest B. Dana, and the report of Mrs. Helen L. Towne, school nurse.

The faculty changes in the high school have been mentioned in the headmaster's report.

In the grade school Miss Margherita Vanni, Miss Helena Brown, and Miss Betsy Kimball resigned at the close of the school year in June. The fifth grade position was filled by the election of Miss Dorothy H. Conway of Holden, Mass., Miss Annie C. Costello as Principal took charge of the fourth grade, and Miss Alice E. Fiske of Dublin was elected teacher of the second grade.

During the summer vacation Mr. Donald Chamberlin was transferred to the Junior High grades, and his room was placed in charge of Miss Rita J. McKearin of Fitchburg, Mass.

Miss Conway and Miss Fiske are graduates of Keene Teachers' College and Miss McKearin a graduate of Emmanuel College, 1939, with the degree of Ed. M. for graduate work at Fitchburg Teachers' College, 1940.

The enrollment for the present school year is 573. For the same period last year it was 561, and for the entire school year it was 582.

Four years ago, when the construction of the new grade school building was under consideration we tabulated the estimated enrollment for the next six years. The increased enrollment over this period as predicted might have been questioned as showing too large an expected increase.

The increased enrollment for 1938-39 over expectations was due in part to the families locating in town during the period of the extra work following the hurricane of 1938.

The figures for the period noted show a larger enrollment for the high school and junior high grades, and a slight reduction in the first six grades.

The organization and work of the grade school has received special attention during the present year, and the results up to the close of the half year have been encouraging.

Achievement tests are given in all the grades above the first, and the results carefully compared with those of other schools having similar grades. The median for grades four, five, and six showed the Jaffrey schools one point higher than the next highest school tested at the same time. These figures merely show how closely the median and average ranks correspond in similar schools with large grades.

The high school activities have been set forth in detail in the headmaster's report. The work in both the senior and junior high school has been very commendable. Although two changes have occurred in the teaching force since the school year began we were fortunate in securing excellent teachers to fill the vacancies.

The installation of the Industrial Arts department asked for last year has been of great benefit to the boys of both the junior and senior high school. We were fortunate in securing the necessary equipment before increased prices and delay in delivery of shop material occurred.

Each spring all our teachers attend the County Institute at Keene, which is conducted by the State Board of Education. In October our teachers attended one day of the session of the State Teachers' Association at Rochester, and on the evening of November 19th they met with the other teachers of the Peterborough-Jaffrey Union at Shattuck Inn where over sixty teachers and guests enjoyed a musical and literary program. The speaker, Principal Clarence P. Quimby of Cushing Academy gave a most interesting and helpful address.

Two special appropriations are being asked for this year, one to install foot lights in Union Hall, the other to maintain adult classes during a part of the coming year. For some years we have secured federal aid for the adult classes, but this aid has been withdrawn. We are therefore, asking that those who have profited by these classes may have them continued at local expense.

In closing I wish to express my thanks and appreciation for the loyal support of our teachers, pupils, school officials and all interested citizens.

REPORT OF HEADMASTER OF CONANT JUNIOR-SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

To Lewis S. Record, Superintendent of Schools, East Jaffrey, N. H.

The following is the annual report for Conant Junior-Senior High School for the year 1940.

Teaching Staff

Several changes have been made in the teaching staff. The vacancies made by the resignation of Miss Marjorie Frost, Miss Elinor Connor, and Miss Ruth Johnson (Mrs. Gerald Cournoyer) have been filled by Mr. Donald Chamberlin, Miss Marjorie Boothby, and Miss Lillian Maynard respectively. Mr. James Jordan has been added to our staff to teach in the new Industrial Arts Department. Five teachers are doing full time work in the senior high school, four teach in both the junior and the senior high school, and two teach full time in the junior high school. The music supervisor works one half day each week and the school nurse works one or more days each week.

Enrollment and Attendance

Although the present enrollment in the senior high school is one hundred and thirty-six, the total number of pupils enrolled has been one hundred and fifty-three, as compared with a total enrollment last year of one hundred forty-three. Seventeen pupils have left school since beginning in September; one post graduate, one senior, four juniors and eleven freshmen. The present enrollment in the junior high school is one hundred and two; whereas the total enrollment has been one hundred and ten. Eight pupils have left school since beginning in September; four in both the eighth and seventh grades.

The attendance in the senior high school for the year 1939-1940 was 96.7% as compared with 96.0% for the State as a whole and the number of tardinesses per pupil was 1.3 as compared with 1 for the entire State. The number of half days in which schools were in session in 1939-1940 was 342, while the average for the State was 353.5. For the current school year (first twenty weeks) the percent of attendance has been 96.29 and the number of tardinesses per pupil .53.

In the junior high school for the same period the attendance has been 95.59 and the number of tardinesses per pupil .15.

Activities from February 1940 to February 1941

DRAMATICS: On April 12 the Class of 1941 presented its first public play, "The Tin Hero" in Union Hall. The excellent presentation of this three act comedy showed that much time and work had been put into it by the coach, Miss Elinor Connor, and by the members of the cast. The action was rapid moving, and the many unusual and comical situations which arose as the plot developed brought from the audience many hearty laughs.

As seniors, the same class presented its second play on Nov. 22, in Union Hall. Under the direction of the coach Miss Marjorie Boothby, the three act comedy, "Her Step Husband," furnished a full evening's entertainment, packed full of interest, enjoyment and humor for all who attended. The action, speeches, and stage furnishings were indicative of a great deal of preparation and rehearsing by both the coach and the boys and girls who took part.

WASHINGTON TRIP: Twenty-six of the twenty-nine members in the Senior Class with Miss Elinor Connor, Mr. Gerald S. Cournoyer, and Mr. Ernest B. Dana as chaperones spent the April vacation in the cities of Washington and New York. The Baltimore and Ohio Travel Agency again conducted the trip. Between the time of the arrival of the class in Washington on Saturday afternoon to the time of departure on Tuesday afternoon just as many as possible of the points of national interest in or near the Nation's Capitol were visited. The high light of the stay in Washington was in having Senator Charles W. Tobey personally conduct the class through the Capitol.

In New York, also, practically every moment was taken up with visits to points of interest and with sight-seeing trips. The boat ride between Boston and New York, and a short sight-seeing trip in Philadelphia, on the way down to Washington supplemented an eight-day tour which furnished a variety of experiences in sight-seeing and travel for every member of the group.

ATHLETICS: Conant High School Athletic Department appreciates in no small way the interest and support which the merchants and the townspeople have given to it. With this help it has been possible to keep the teams well equipped, and to see that everything possible is done for the health and physical welfare of the boys and girls who participate in athletics. This support of the community added to the furnishing of a first class gymnasium and competent and enthusiastic instruction have resulted in the development and maintenance of this important part of the school's program upon a high plane.

The basketball season of 1939-1940 closed with two memorable events for Conant. The first of these was the winning of the championship and trophy by the boys at the Townsend Tournament held at Townsend, Massachusetts, and the second, the Testimonial Banquet for both the girls' and the boys' teams which was made possible by the generosity of many townspeople.

Although this season the players are younger and less experienced, by virtue of much hard work and determination there has been a rapid and steady improvement which has resulted in the development of two strong teams in a relatively short time.

In baseball with a late spring and several positions to be filled because of graduation, it was necessary to build practically a new team. However, several closely contested games interspersed with victories indicated that the players were furnishing stiff opposition and were improving as the season advanced.

Inasmuch as the players in both basketball and baseball are for the most part in the first three classes in high school, there should be a sufficient amount of experienced material to build up strong teams for another year.

A beginning has been made, also, in Winter Sports. The ski and skating teams turned in some excellent performances at the Wilton High School Carnival, and now with an experienced coach and increased interest of the student body, participation in more events and meets is looked forward to next year.

MUSIC: This department of our school has had a very successful year. In spite of having a music supervisor but one-half day each week, it has been possible to prepare and present concerts at functions held both in and out of town in addition to the carrying on of the regular instruction. In May for the first time a Conant High School Glee Club took part in the Annual State Music Festival which was held in Laconia. Six of these pupils represented the school in the All State Chorus. The same group also presented a concert at a Parent-Teacher Meeting in Keene in February, and took part in the Graduation Exercises in June.

The Junior High School Glee Club sang at an operetta held in Troy in the early spring, and at the Junior High School Prize Speaking Contest in the fall. The choruses from both the Senior and the Junior High Schools furnished important parts in the graduation exercises of their respective schools.

MISCELLANEOUS: The May Ball on May 17, and the Senior Reception on June 18, which were held by the Juniors were well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by all. These two gala events provide a fitting climax to the social life of the student body as the school year draws to a close.

The Junior High School's third annual field day, which was held at Lake Contocook and Humiston Park, was greatly enjoyed by the boys and girls. Games, swimming, and refreshments provided an all inclusive program.

This year's Junior Class held its first school dance, the Hallowe'en Ball on October 18. Like the other school dances, it plays a real part in the social life of the school and in bringing the school and the community together for a good time.

At the Junior High School Prize Speaking Contest, on December 12, Arline Young won first prize, David Tilton second prize, and Leone Tilford, third prize.

No Amos Fortune Prize Speaking Contest took place during the year of 1940 as the contest for the school year 1940-41 is being held in March instead of in December. The English teacher and contestants are preparing for the events at the present time.

CONCLUSION: Although installed for but a half year the new Industrial Arts Department is adequately equipped and well organized for the teaching of Woodworking. It is now possible to offer subjects to the boys comparable to those offered to the girls in the Home Economics Department. For the present year, every boy enrolled in the junior high school has four periods of shop, and a Woodworking Course is offered as an elective to boys in the senior high school who are taking the General Course. During the school year 1941-42 a Cabinet Making Course will be offered in the senior high school.

In the Home Economics Department sewing machines and a refrigerator have been added to the equipment, and the electric range has been replaced by one of the most modern type by the Derry Electric Company. It has been possible again to meet the requirements of the George-Deen Act in the instruction in this department which means assurance of the continued reimbursement from the Federal Government for about one-third of the salary of the teacher.

In looking toward the future in respect to the steadily increasing enrollment in the senior high school and the much larger classes which are resulting in certain subjects, the question of accommodation from both the standpoint of room and of teachers becomes more and more a pressing and ever present problem. A comparison of the number of pupils in the two upper grades in the high school with the two grades in the junior high school

indicates that the enrollment will increase in the neighborhood of about 25 pupils each year for the next two years. As this does not include tuition pupils it would seem that the enrollment will be near 170 next year and 200 the following year. Add to these figures the fact that the present 5th and 6th grades contain approximately 50 pupils in each grade the increased enrollment seems likely to last for some time.
