TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs;

YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 8th of March, at 3:00 of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles:

POLLS will be open from 3:00 P.M. and close at 8:00 P.M.

BUSINESS MEETING to start at 7:00 P.M.

Articles of a General Nature

1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,975.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing.
3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1983.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept gifts and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and grant them power to expend such funds.
6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to receive monies from the State under the Highway Grant, these monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,300.00 for the support of the Town Library.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$438.00 as the Town's share of the operating cost of the Cheshire Health and Social Services.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$443.00 as the Town's share for the Southwestern Region Planning Commission.

11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$3,000.00 from the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund. This money to be used for the construction of removable, partitioned, Town Offices in the upstairs of the Old Brick Schoolhouse.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Old Schoolhouse or Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council, or take any other action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of a summer day camp sponsored by the Cheshire County YMCA.

15. To see if the Town will vote to go on record in support of immediate actions by the Federal Government to control and reduce acid rain which is harmful to the environment and economy of Nelson, New Hampshire and to the health and welfare of the people of Nelson, New Hampshire. These actions shall include: 1. Reduce by at least half the major cause of acid rain, sulfur dioxide emissions, by the year 1990. 2. Conclude negotiations and adopt a treaty with the government of Canada that will commit both nations to this same goal. The record of the vote on this article shall be transmitted to the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation and to the President of the United States. (By Petition)

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with a Data Processing firm for maintenance of it's fiscal or other Town records.

Articles Dealing With Service And Protection

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to support the Town's continued participation in the existing Regional Solid Waste Facility based in Keene with it being understood that this vote includes the participation and support of a regional solution for handling solid waste either by agreeing to accept a landfill site in the Town, providing cover material from the Town, accepting an alternative operation in the Town or agreeing to whatever other aspect of a regional solid waste operation that is sensible for serving the region so that a good, cooperative regional solution will be a commitment and a reality.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the proper expenses and member reimbursement of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad.

20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, March 1983 to March 1984, it being understood that Townspeople will still be charged for individual calls.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of two self-contained breathing apparatus.

23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purchase of a Fold-A-Tank water storage device.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of a portable radio for the Rescue Squad.

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for proper expenses of the Police Department.

26. To see if the Town will vote that on the expiration of the term of Police Officer and Constable elected at the Annual Meeting of the Town in 1983, the Selectmen be, and hereby are, authorized thereafter, to appoint Police Officer and Constable in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated as amended.

Articles Dealing With Roads

27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for wages in the maintenance of the roads and bridges.

28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$43,000.00 for General Highway expenses - gas, repairs and supplies.

29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$537.29 as its share of TRA constructions costs, the State's share being \$3,581.92.

30. To see if the Town will vote to accept additional Highway Subsidy Funds in the estimated amount of \$3,933.23.

31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts of estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action relating thereto.

32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee.

33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$12,000.00 from the Road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. This money to be used for the purchase of a used dump truck for the Highway Department per recommendations of the Road Equipment Committee and the Selectmen. It being understood that the 1973 4-Wheel Drive International Dump Truck be traded in or sold out-right to the highest bidder or take any other action thereto.

34. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purchase of 42 acres of land located on the southeast side of the present Town Barn being a portion of the Eliot Priest property.

34. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as they may legally be brought before the meeting.

The Librarian attended four Nubanusit Library Coop meetings held around the area.

Our "Aluminum Rush" event in Old Home week was lightly attended, but those present were updated on the present status and future importance of waste reduction and recycling by John Isham, of the N.H. Resource Recovery Association and Architect Tom Weller who displayed his model rural recycling transfer station.

At our last meeting of January 20, 1983 Carl Woodbury of the N.H. Bureau of Solid Waste Management educated us on the economic wisdom of proper land disposal techniques for handling septage.

We maintain our interest in all matters pertaining to health land use, particularly of town properties, and true to our promise of March 1982, we have conserved dollars. Our only expense has been membership in the N.H. Association of Conservation Commissions.

TOWN MEETING, MARCH 9, 1982

Minutes of the annual meeting of the Town of Nelson,
New Hampshire

The checklist was handed over to the Town Clerk and was signed by the Clerk and the Supervisors of the Checklist.

Moderator John Bradshaw opened the polls at 3:03 p.m. and read the opening clause of the warrant. It was moved and seconded to waive the reading of the entire warrant; motion was passed.

ARTICLE ONE was read, and voting began, marking the first use of the Nonpartisan Official Ballot System for the election of Nelson town officers.

The business meeting convened at the Town Hall at 7:02 p.m. Moderator Bradshaw explained that voting and the meeting would go on simultaneously until the polls closed at 8:00 p.m.

Several errors in the 1981 town report were noted: Page 27 should have included the "Summary of Uncollected Taxes" from page 101. On page 24, the three columns of debits and credits on the top half of the page should have been headed by the dates 1978, 1979, and 1980, respectively. On page 14, the estimated total appropriation for 1982 should have read \$135,618.56. On page 15, the estimated amount of revenue to be raised by property taxes should have read \$70,267.41.

ARTICLE TWO: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$33,795.00 to defray Town charges for the year ensuing. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Lothrop explained the various increases and changes. The article was adopted as written.

ARTICLE THREE: It was voted to allow the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1982.

ARTICLE FOUR: It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer, any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds, and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.

ARTICLE FIVE: It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept gifts and/or federal or state aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and to grant them power to expend such funds.

ARTICLE SIX: It was voted to allow the Selectmen to receive monies from the state under the Highway Grant, these monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance.

ARTICLE SEVEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the

sum of \$3,010.00 for the support of the Town Library.

ARTICLE EIGHT: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Old Home Day; and the sum of \$175.00 to help defray necessary and proper expenses of Memorial Day.

ARTICLE NINE: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the care of the Town Common.

ARTICLE TEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for the maintenance of the cemetery.

ARTICLE ELEVEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$438.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of the Cheshire Health and Social Services.

ARTICLE TWELVE: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219.00 as the Town's fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$392.00 as the Town's share for the Southwestern Regional Planning Commission. Voters wondered why the appropriation was up \$50 from the year before. Selectman Jeffery explained that the cost was based on a charge of eighty-five cents per capita. The Article was passed.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Board of Adjustment.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Conservation Commission.

ARTICLE SIXTEEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 for the proper expenses of the Nelson Planning Board.

ARTICLE SEVENTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 to be held in the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Old Brick Schoolhouse or the Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals would be made from the fund except by vote of the Town. Selectman Bunce proposed an amendment that changed the amount of the appropriation from \$3,000 to \$5,000. He explained the reasons for the increase: restroom facilities should be improved in both buildings; office space needs to be developed upstairs in the Schoolhouse; the Town Hall needs winterizing. A committee will be appointed to develop an overall plan and present it to voters at the 1983 town meeting. The Article was passed as amended.

ARTICLE EIGHTEEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council.

ARTICLE NINETEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to insulate and add attic ventilation and repairs to the Town Library. Voters inquired whether the Selectmen would get bids in order to fix the building for the lowest cost. Selectman Lothrop explained that the appropriation must be made first, then bids would be obtained. He also explained the damage caused by ice back-up on the building, and the need to insulate and ventilate the attic. After a brief discussion, the Article was passed.

ARTICLE TWENTY: Shall the citizens of Nelson ask members of the New Hampshire Congressional delegation to support or co-sponsor a resolution in the U.S. Congress to: Request the President of the United States to propose to the Soviet Union that the United States and the Soviet Union adopt a mutual freeze on the testing, production, and deployment of nuclear weapons and of missiles and new aircraft designed primarily to deliver nuclear weapons, with verification safeguards satisfactory to both countries? (By petition.) A lively discussion ensued. Robert E. Robinson requested vote by secret ballot. The ballots were distributed. The Article passed by a vote of 57 to 43.

ARTICLE TWENTY-ONE: To see if the Town shall adopt the provisions of RSA 72:43-f and 72:43-g for the adjusted elderly exemptions from property tax. (See warrant for complete provisions.) Vote was held by printed ballot. During the discussion, Sidney Partridge explained that this article would take the place of the expanded elderly exemption. The Article provides that the value of a person's residence is excluded from the qualifying figure of \$30,000 in assets; it increases the amounts of exemptions for persons age 65 to 80; and it raises the income requirements. Selectman Lothrop said that the measure will cost the town an additional \$1500 to \$2000 in tax revenues; also, elderly people will have to offer proof that they qualify. During the collection of the printed ballots, the voting polls were declared closed at 8:15 p.m. by Moderator Bradshaw. The Article was passed by a vote of 100 to 3.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH PROTECTION

ARTICLE TWENTY-TWO: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00, which money is to be paid to the City of Keene for the use of its landfill.

ARTICLE TWENTY-THREE: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense purposes.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FOUR: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for proper expenses of the Police Department. Selectman Bunce explained that the figure is lower than that of most towns in the area. There were 162 calls the previous year, which worked out to less than \$20 per call. The figure of \$3,000 would include an estimated \$1500 for labor and mileage, \$500 for miscellaneous equipment, and \$750 for the cost of a radar unit. A heated discussion followed in which voters expressed dismay that former police officer Jon Perkins had purchased the radar unit without the approval of the town, and that the Selectmen, in Mr. Perkins's

absence, could not account for \$1154 spent in 1981 on police equipment. Michael Blaudschun explained the need to use radar on Route 9 and the Tolman Pond area because of complaints about speeders by residents of those neighborhoods. Four different amendments were proposed during the course of the discussion. Amendment One, by Barry Tolman, moved that the budget be cut to \$1200. Amendment Two, by Selectman Bunce, amended the figure to \$2750. Amendment Three, by Mary Murphy, changed the figure to \$2000. Amendment Four, by Thomasa Quigley, proposed that no funds covered by this Article could pay the cost of the radar unit. Moderator Bradshaw expressed confidence that the Selectmen would heed the points raised during the discussion and would act to protect the legal rights of the Town. He also ruled that the amendments would be voted on in reverse order, except that amendments referring only to an amount of money would be voted on from the highest figure to the lowest. Amendment Four was passed by voice vote. Amendment Two was withdrawn by Selectman Bunce because it had included the cost of the radar. Amendment Three (appropriating \$2000) was passed by voice vote. The Article was passed as amended.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FIVE: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the proper expenses and member reimbursement of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad.

ARTICLE TWENTY-SIX: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for body work and paint for the 3M1 Fire Truck. Fire Chief Robert West explained that the truck is 14 years old and in need of maintenance, but will probably last about 6 years more if it can pass underwriters' inspection. He added that the work would be put out for bids. The Article was passed.

ARTICLE TWENTY-SEVEN: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1500.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, March 1982 to March 1983, it being understood that townspeople will still be charged for individual calls.

ARTICLE TWENTY-EIGHT: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department. Ray Huber wondered how much already is in the fund. The sum is \$15860,63. The Article was passed.

ARTICLE TWENTY-NINE: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to pay for damages done by dogs.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

ARTICLE THIRTY: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 for wages in the maintenance of the roads and bridges. This figure represents an eight percent increase over 1981.

ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,000 for General Highway expenses: gas, repairs, and supplies. Selectman Bunce explained that the figure included \$5,000 for additional paving, repairs on the dump truck, more culverts, and gravel. He reported that the Town had purchased two Army trucks at \$300 each and a snowplow, and had miraculously resurrected the old International truck voters had authorized selling the year before. Win French asked why the Town had not used crushed gravel; Mr. Bunce said that bank-run gravel had been much cheaper because of the large volume needed. The Article was passed.

ARTICLE THIRTY-TWO: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$539.99 as its share of TRA construction costs, the State's share being \$3,599.26. Road Agent Clyde Hutchins asked for input on which roads to fix; the Selectmen asked voters to suggest road concerns at the weekly Selectmen's meeting. The Article was passed.

ARTICLE THIRTY-THREE: It was voted to accept additional Highway Subsidy Funds in the estimated amount of \$4,349.67.

ARTICLE THIRTY-FOUR: It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action relating thereto. (Highway Maintenance Appropriation indicated was \$9,300.00; related to Article 30.)

ARTICLE THIRTY-FIVE: It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Road Equipment Committee.

ARTICLE THIRTY-SIX: To see if the Town will allow Barry Tolman, et al, to maintain three "speed bumps" in the Tolman Pond Road from the Partridge house to the tennis court, and to designate these bumps by signs, in an effort to slow the traffic down by their homes. (By petition.) Barry Tolman said that he would maintain the bump himself and just during the summer. Selectman Bunce said that if the Article was approved, he would verify its legality with a lawyer to determine the Town's liability in case of an accident. Robert West expressed concern about a fire truck or ambulance having problems negotiating the bumps. A voice vote was taken, but the results were uncertain. The Article was passed on a standing vote, 47 to 43.

ARTICLE THIRTY-SEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to open a section of Road #80 from the intersection of Road #64 and #80 southerly for a distance of 1800 feet and raise and appropriate the sum of \$18,000 to allow the said road to conform to State specifications. Road #80 being subject to gates and bars by vote of the Town in 1958. Selectman Bunce explained that the purpose of the Article

was to elicit an expression of opinion by the taxpayers on the issue of opening up a Class 6 road (any road that has been thrown up, and not maintained by the Town for 5 years), since it is illegal to spend any money on such a road unless it is officially reopened. Barry Tolman said that the Article represents a larger issue, for 3,000 acres of Nelson land fall into the category of land without access to a Class 5 road; the land is taxed at a value of \$1,000,000, yet it cannot be built on. Clyde Hutchins proposed an amendment to allow the Town to issue building permits on Class 6 roads, but the Moderator ruled this amendment as improper. Frank Upton Jr. amended the Article to read: "To see if the Town will vote to open a section of Road #80 from the intersection of Road #64 and #80 southerly for a distance of 1800 feet to allow a building permit to be issued on an old cellar hole on Frank Upton's land." Voters asked whether a Town can simply reclassify a Class 6 road as Class 5 without doing any work. Selectman Jeffery said that state law requires a Class 5 road to be maintained well enough to allow safety equipment to get to a piece of property. Claude Hutchins proposed an amendment that read: "To see if the Town will vote to reclassify Road #80 as is to Class 5 from the intersection of Road #64 and #80 southerly for a distance of approximately 1800 feet." More discussion followed over the question of the differences between a Class 5 road and a Class 6 road, and the Town's responsibility in each case. The amendments were voted on in reverse order. Claude Hutchins's amendment was rejected by standing vote, 38 to 19. Frank Upton's amendment was rejected by voice vote. Article Thirty-seven was rejected as read unanimously by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-EIGHT: To transact any other business or discuss any other warrant proposals as they legally are brought before the meeting. Selectman Lothrop presented a plaque to retiring tax collector Sidney Partridge to commemorate his twenty-five years' of outstanding service to the Town of Nelson.

It was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was passed.

Your Road Agent rebuilt and widened one mile of Old Stoddard Road for about \$5.00 per foot. He hauled granite slabs from a cellar hole in Keene to allow the rebuilding of abutments to prevent the collapsing of our bridge crossing.

SCHOOL WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the school district in the Town of Nelson qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Nelson Town Hall in said District on the 4th day of March, 1983, at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 2. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for, and to accept and use in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire, or any department or agency thereof, or any federal, state, or private agency.

Article 3. To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to apply for, accept, and expend, without further action by the School District Meeting, money from the state, federal, or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the 1983-1984 school fiscal year provided that such expenditure be made for purposes for which a school district may appropriate money, and that such expenditure not require the expenditure of other school district funds.

Article 4. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 to send students to a conservation camp.

Article 5. To see what action the District will take to amend the purposes of the Capital Reserve Fund established by the District in March of 1972 for the purpose of construction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes **by adding:** and shall include the construction, reconstruction, or acquisition of a specific capital improvement to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville Elementary School, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,700.00, or any other sum from the Capital Reserve Fund established by the District in March of 1972, and as amended March, 1983, to make improvements to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville School, or to take any other action regarding a waste disposal system. Whereas action is required immediately in regard to the improvements needed on the waste disposal system, that the school board be authorized to take whatever action is deemed necessary at the earliest possible date.

Article 7. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be deposited in the Capital Reserve Fund established at the March, 1972 District Meeting, and as amended March 4, 1983, for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, or acquisition of a specific capital improvement to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville Elementary School, or to take any action relating thereto.

Article 8. To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$248,269.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the statutory obligations of the District.

Article 9. To choose agents and committes in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

Article 10. To Transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING

March 5, 1982

The polls were opened for persons wishing to vote for the officers listed by non-partisan ballot as required by law by the Moderator, Ethan C. Tolman, at the Nelson Town Hall, at 5:00 p.m. The Moderator announced that the polls would remain open until 10:00 p.m.

The checklist was handed over to the Clerk and signed by the Clerk and the Supervisors of the Checklist.

The Annual School Meeting warrant was read at 8:00 p.m. and the meeting was called to order.

Mr. Tolman introduced Mr. Richard Champagne and Dr. Bernard Ellis from SAU #29 and allowed that "they may respond on technical points or points of interest throughout the meeting through the Moderator."

ARTICLE 1: It was moved and seconded that the District accept reports of agents and auditors as printed in the Annual Town Report and place such reports on file. The motion carried.

ARTICLE 2: It was moved and seconded that Article 2 be accepted as read. "To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for, and to accept and use in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire, or any department or agency thereof, or any federal, state, or private agency." The motion carried.

ARTICLE 3: It was moved and seconded that Article 3 be accepted as read. "To see if the District will vote to authorize the School Board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the School District Meeting, money from the state, federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the 1982-83 school fiscal year provided that such expenditure be made for purposes for which a School District may appropriate money and that such expenditure not require the expenditure of other School District funds. Further, that the School Board hold a public hearing prior to accepting and spending such money. The motion carried.

ARTICLE 4: It was moved and seconded that the District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$450 to send students to a conservation camp. The motion carried.

ARTICLE 5: It was moved and seconded that the district raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be deposited in the Capital Reserve Fund established at the March, 1972 District Meeting for the purpose of construction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes. The motion carried.

ARTICLE 6: It was moved and seconded that the District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to provide a physical education program at the Munsonville School.

David Sobel, who spoke for the school board, said that this article was included to get an idea of whether or not the people wanted a physical education program. He said that, at this time, the school board has not taken a stand or does not have a consensus opinion. There was additional discussion of the possibility of receiving federal

grant for playground equipment, and of the present physical education program at the school, which is being done by the teachers and volunteers. The motion did not carry.

ARTICLE 7: It was moved and seconded that the District vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$241,683 for the support of schools, for the salary of school district officers and agents, and for the statutory obligations of the District.

There was considerable discussion about the legality of the installation of the addition to the fence in front of the Munsonville School without School District Meeting appropriation. Mr. Sidney Partridge spoke of his difficulties in securing information and communications concerning the addition to the fence. In defence of this expenditure, Mr. Richard Champagne spoke of the "Rye Decision" while allows School Boards this financial flexibility. Complaints were then expressed about the fence gate not being kept operable during the winter months, and we were assured that this problem would be corrected.

Mr. David Upton gave a detailed budget presentation, and Mr. Maurice Collins then amended the article to read "\$236,269 instead of \$241,683," by eliminating the proposed 15% increase for our teachers. This amendment was defeated by a vote of 26 to 23.

The original article finally carried by a vote of 27 to 22.

ARTICLE 8: "To choose agents and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant" was passed over.

ARTICLE 9: Mr. David Upton moved that the Nelson School District publicly thank Natalie McClure for her many years of service to the District and for her many years of caring about the people and the children and the Town of Nelson. The motion was wholeheartedly seconded and Natalie received a standing ovation!

Mr. James Murphy asked to reconsider Article 6. A vote of 26 to 22 defeated that request.

Mr. John Bance expressed thanks to David and Timothy Upton for their extensive work in the building of the Munsonville School vestibule. And, under Article 9, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The polls were closed and the meeting was adjourned at 10:27 p.m.

SCHOOL BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

To the students, parents and taxpayers of the Nelson School District:

I am happy to report that it has been another eventful and productive year for our students and our school system. Our students have been successful and have demonstrated their competencies and abilities on the CTBS national achievement test and on our own School Administrative Unit 29 Accountability testing system.

We continue to place academic emphasis on the learning of skills in language arts, mathematics, social studies and science. The principals and staffs of the five School Administrative Unit 29 town schools, Chesterfield, Harrisville, Marlborough, Nelson and Westmoreland, have worked cooperatively to complete the implementation of the new language arts curriculum that they developed and wrote in 1980-81. After considerable discussion and consideration, the five town schools have decided to test run the STAMM Math Program. This math curriculum is presently being piloted by selected teachers in each of the town schools. The overriding philosophy behind all our curriculum development work has been, and will continue to be, that instruction be tailored to the individual needs of each student, that the choice of methods and materials be geared to each student's abilities and experiences, that student success be measurable and demonstrable and that good progress records are necessary for proper management and evaluation.

In an effort coordinated by all the School Administrative Unit 29 town principals, computers have been systematically introduced into the program of studies in all five elementary schools. All schools are using similar computer hardware. Operating knowledge and program tapes are being shared among school staffs for the mutual benefit of all the students in all the towns.

During the summer months, the Board revised, enhanced and made more definitive its goals for the Nelson School District. Goals are the vehicle through which a school board can communicate its plans and intentions to its constituents, and its expectations for specific results to its school administration and staff. School District goals which accurately define the educational needs of our students and the educational expectations of parents and taxpayers become the guideposts for positive growth as well as the yardstick for the evaluation of our success.

The Nelson School District Goals for the time period 1982-1985 are as follows:

EDUCATION: Basic Skills: To ensure the competence of students in the basic skills of reading, written and oral communications and mathematics; to encourage the use of multi-media in the teaching of basic skills.

Curriculum: To continue to develop curriculum materials; to investigate new concepts in teaching methods in science, social studies and the arts.

To focus on the coherence of our program, and to plan carefully field trips and extracurriculum activities as an integral part of instructional units (Policy # 6132).

Learning Environment: To continue to place emphasis on developing an educational atmosphere within the Munsonville School that provides for the individual differences of each student and produces students who value themselves and other people.

To encourage the practice of acceptable social skills and good citizenship.

Accountability: To continue to develop a system of school district accountability while maintaining that accountability only measures some of the aspects of the educational program at the Munsonville School.

ADMINISTRATION: To prioritize the principal's time commitments to maximize instructional continuity.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: To continue to emphasize the development of a sound program of school-community relationships through regular discussions between staff and board members (open to parents and the public) to discuss the implementation of and the progress towards, fulfilling board goals.

To encourage visitation of school by parents and board members.

BUILDING & GROUNDS: To creatively and effectively optimize available playground space.

Regarding our EDUCATION goals, we have made considerable progress in the past years in the areas of curriculum development, individualized instruction, development of a discipline policy and procedure and methods of program evaluation utilizing various testing instruments. As previously noted, curriculum development is on-going and to date has been very successful. Accomplishment of our objectives of developing student individualized teaching methods and materials, accurate skills measurement and necessary records maintenance systems has resulted in the five towns of School Administrative Unit 29 taking a leadership role in curriculum development.

The Board's proposals for supporting physical education, health education, art and music, and pre-school and readiness programs for the 1983-84 school year are contained as line item components of our proposed 1983-84 Nelson School District Budget. The Board recommends that \$1,000 be raised to hire a parttime physical education instructor, that \$1,000 be raised to continue our contracted special music and art programs and that a readiness program be established requiring the expenditure of \$289. The readiness funds will be used to purchase educational materials and screening services.

In the areas of communication and public participation, the Board employed the services of Dr. Virginia Trumbull to personally meet all members of the community in order to develop and report back to the Board a concensus of

the educational policies and practices community members would like the Munsonville School to include. Dr. Trumbull conducted four community "coffees" from February through May and made her report to the Board and the public in June. Many of Dr. Trumbull's recommendations are reflected in the 1982-85 Nelson School District Goals, approved by the Board in July. In addition, the Board approved the formation of a five member Board Advisory Committee called the Nelson School District School Community Council. The objectives of the Council, as outlined in their charge, are two-fold: (1) "Provide the school board and the school administration with a knowledge of

the community's educational desires, interests and expectations" and (2) "Provide the community with information about the school's programs and procedures". Elected by the Board in June and presently serving a one-year term on the council are Pearl Blake, Alouette Iselin, Nancy Stretch, Steve Teeter and Frank Upton. The Board welcomes the assistance and advice of the Council and of those who may wish to participate with them.

In other areas of Board activity, the Board and school administration have completed a review and revision of all Nelson School District policies. These policies and related procedures provide the reason and the method for the consistent routine conduct of the School District's business. In general, the policies and procedures relate to the employment and evaluation of staff; the procurement of necessary equipment, supplies and services; the maintenance of suitable school facilities; and the instruction, transportation, attendance, discipline, health and safety of Nelson students. These policies have the force and effect of law and are available for review by any interested citizen.

We continue to review our student transportation system with an eye toward controlling costs and improving schedules and services. The additional routes that we have investigated have such a high price tag that they are not feasible.

Budget development and financial efficiency never cease to be a concern of the Board. We returned \$29,723. from the 1981-82 budget resulting in a school tax reduction of 2.5% in your property tax bill this fall. Accounts returning money were the tuition account; transportation account, both route and gas contingency money; and the payroll accounts from money not spent for the employment of substitute teachers or a clerical aide.

From both a financial as well as a morale support standpoint, a special thanks goes to the Packersfield Club for the contributions it has made to our kids and to our school. Our students were able to reach their goal of paving their basketball court sooner than expected, when a Packersfield contribution completed their fund raising efforts. More importantly, the recent Christmas gift, a Commodore 64 computer, made by the Packersfield Club is a most significant contribution to education in Nelson. With it and the town schools' coordinated computer literacy project, our students will be well prepared for the impact of computers on their education in the Keene schools and on their later lives.

When it's all said and done, all the components of our school: all the people and all the money; all the meetings and all the programs; the instruction, the curricula, the facilities, the budgets and the buses; all our efforts have one intention, that our students succeed in their learning, that they fully realize their maximum potential and that they become able to lead full and productive lives. To this end, all of us, the staff, the administration and the Board welcome your well-intentioned criticism and are grateful to accept your thoughtful praise.

I will close this report by quoting from the remarks of Ms. Nancy Richard, a nationally known consultant on readiness programs and developmental education, in a report she made to the Nelson School Board. Ms. Richard spent a day interviewing our school staff and observing our kids so that she could recommend to us how we could best integrate a readiness program into available school space and time. After stating that a readiness program would fit very naturally into our present school, its philosophies, practices and staff capabilities, Ms. Richard concluded her report,

"I can't end this report without expressing my feelings about the Munsonville School in general. The best way I can express it is: 'I wish my children had been as lucky'. The teachers know and care about every child. The atmosphere is warm and free of stress. The children are obviously very happy and productive. There is a wealth of activity going on. In the time I was there, not only were the children involved in the 3 R's, but were also cooking, sewing and singing. One can readily see that they help the school to function as smoothly as it does. In the time I was there, I didn't observe one teacher speaking to a child about a behavioral problem, nor one child acting out even though the teachers were giving much attention to me. You have every reason to be very proud of your school."

We look forward to continuing to earn such praise this year and in the years to come.

MUNSONVILLE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Principal's Report

The 1982 - 83 school year began on September 1, with an enrollment of 26 students. There have been no staff changes.

Our Language Arts Continuum and Record-keeping System is in the second year of implementation. Students enter school at varying stages of language fluency, and our guide facilitates instruction of the total student through his or her physical, emotional and intellectual spheres. To assure that skills are taught in the most meaningful way, teachers are encouraged to utilize community resources and materials to assist the student in acquiring the practical and applicable skills necessary for everyday life. The goal is to foster creativity in teachers as well as in the student.

The Continuum is a tool used to observe and assess a student's performance in a consistent manner. It shows and encourages success in achievement of essential skills. The ultimate goal is that each student will be able to communicate in a meaningful and grammatically correct way.

We are piloting STAMM, Systematic Teaching and Measuring Mathematics, in grades 3, 5, and in the Resource Room. This program is based on the concept of continuous progress and, therefore, it is not expected that every student will always be working at the level listed for his grade. It is possible for a child to progress through less than one level in some years and complete more than one level in another year. Because of the flexibility of STAMM, teachers can use a variety of classroom organizational patterns, resources and teaching methods. Textbooks remain the primary resource, but STAMM provides supplementary activities and materials, as well as a structure for organizing and listing materials. Emphasis is placed on the concrete experience to aid mathematical concept development.

We have begun work on a project to introduce the timely concept of recycling to our children. A short-term goal of creating gifts for sale at a Christmas Fair has been planned. The funds earned from the fair will be used to pay the expenses of a field trip to a working recycling center, and to set up a "library of tools". The long-term goal is to encourage the children to think before they discard, and to teach them skills which will enable them to recycle within their homes and the community. Anne Ames has energetically coordinated this project utilizing the talents and efforts of community members and students. We are all enthusiastically involved and hope that this program will be ongoing.

Our basketball court has been completed and is presently being enjoyed by students and the community. The most recent endeavor of the Packersfield group is the purchase of a Commodore 64 computer. Computer science has moved beyond the exclusive domain of mathematics and has found applications in nearly all subjects of the comprehensive school. The staff is making every effort to learn as much as they possible can about this relatively new technology and its potential.

Our musical instrument program is in its second year. It continues to be sponsored by the Packersfield group and is under the direction of Karen Desrosier. Participation and enthusiasm is exceptional. Our ski program, under the direction of Betty Lenox, continues to be of great interest to the students. We would like to thank parents and community members for making these programs available to our children.

The staff submitted a proposal to the New Hampshire Heart Association for a grant entitled "Keep Your Heart Pumping". We were awarded this grant and will be implementing it in January. Our proposal uses a core approach in utilizing responsible people from the community to bring an awareness of good health habits into the homes of our children. Our long-range goals are to establish an ongoing exercise program, develop parental awareness, maintain good family health habits through the children's involvement in the project, develop a health snack cookbook and to develop an awareness of choices to be made to maintain a healthy body as a child and as an adult.

We would like to express our appreciation for the interest, support and help given us by parents, community, school board, and SAU 29. This is an important component in maintaining a program of quality education for our young people.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Our five town districts of School Administrative Unit 29 are saddened by the loss of Dr. Bernard Ellis to Connecticut. Dr. Ellis accepted a superintendency in Suffield, Connecticut, in November. His four years with us did much to improve the quality of education. In addition to the many administrative functions he provided the schools and the school boards on a day to day basis, he will best be remembered for his work in improving the language arts and math curriculum. We will continue to plan and implement an updated health curriculum recently started which was very important to Dr. Ellis and his staff.

The results of the New Hampshire School Administrative Unit 29 accountability assessment program, May of 1982, clearly shows that our town districts do a good job in teaching the basic subjects of math, English language arts and New Hampshire and United States history and government with few exceptions. These test scores do vary from year to year, based upon the ability of any one given class. The school administration and teachers are closely analyzing the results of these tests to determine weaknesses and strengths in providing our children the necessary minimal competencies as established by our accountability plan.

We recognize a need to examine more closely our social studies programs which reflect some deficiencies in New Hampshire and United States history and government. The scores below indicate the average percentage score in the three subject areas. These test results are not intended to reflect and measure one school against another, but rather to provide our individual school boards, administration, and staff with data to properly analyze present school curriculum against established minimum competencies which appear to be appropriate.

HEALTH REPORT

This school year got off to a good start. Head checks were done the first day of school. Heights and weights were done for all students and recorded. An application was submitted for the Dry Brush Program, and sent to the Dental Bureau in Concord. This program was initiated the last week of October. Most of the students participated in the program. Hearing and vision testing were completed in October. No problems were found.

In November and December, all students participated in discussions concerning nutrition and vitamins. This was well received. I feel the students came away from these discussions with a better understanding of the four basic food groups, and what constitutes a well balanced diet.

"Keep Your Heart Pumping," our grant from the New Hampshire Heart Association will be implemented in January. A program relative to the five senses will begin in January, and continue through February. The fourth grade physicals will be conducted by Dr. McMurphy on Friday, February 18, 1983. The dental program will be conducted in the late spring. Our dental hygienist is Lynn Noonan. She does an excellent job and works very well with the students. Head checks will be done once a month, or more often as needed.

The preschool vision-preschool hearing testing conducted by the State of New Hampshire will be held in mid-May. Hopefully, this year Nelson will be included. Due to budget cuts and because of the very small number of children, this program did not come to Nelson. I am hoping that this will not be the case this year.

Near the end of the school year a day is set aside for registration for incoming first graders. I will be at the school to meet the parents and the new students. At this time I inform the parents of the necessary immunizations required for school entry, plus the need for a physical report from their family doctor. If they have any questions concerning immunization requirements, physicals, or other aspects of the health care program at the school, I answer them at this time.

So far this year there have been no major accidents or injuries. Since I am at school three hours a week, it is impossible for me to take care of all students when an accident occurs. I feel very confident in the ability of the teachers at the Munsonville School. They have in the past showed that they could correctly and safely administer first aid to a sick or injured child. I enjoy working with them. Their help and cooperation makes my job much easier.

Our first aid supplies and equipment are being updated this year. The list was developed by Dr. McMurphy, and the school nurses from Chesterfield, Marlborough, Nelson, and Westmoreland.

In closing I would like to say that it is a pleasure for me to be school nurse for the Munsonville School.
