THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pittsburg on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for same.
 - 2. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
 - 3. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen authority to distribute blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen authority to assess a sum not exceeding ten cents per thousand dollar valuation of the assessed valuation of the town for 1947, said sum to be turned over to the White Mountain Regional Association for the purpose of advertising the resources of the town.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to pay the same wage rate the ensuing year as in 1946.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,500 to straighten and repair the Day Road. Same to be laid out by the Road Agent.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen authority to sell the two snow plow tractors and plows and other obsolete equipment.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to give the selectmen authority to sell and convey the Indian Stream School Lot.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to have two highway districts only, to take effect Town Meeting day 1948.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$2500. to purchase a piece of land now owned by George W. Hawes being located as follows. Beginning at the point where the line running between the George W. Hawes and the Church property hits the sidewalk; thence running back from the sidewalk in the same line as the existing line fifty feet beyond the church shed thence running in a line parallel to the sidewalk to the Back Lake Road; thence running along the Back Lake road to the sidewalk; thence along the sidewalk to the first mentioned point.
- 11. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

The polls shall be open at 10 A. M. and not close before 6 P. M.

Health

Good health is one of life's greatest assets. To promote a healthier race of people our efforts should begin not only before school age, but before birth. A mother can do much to insure her child's health by placing herself under medical care early in pregnancy.

During infancy, preschool and school age have periodic medical examinations. Detection and correction of defects should take place at the earliest opportunity.

Guard against communicable and infectious diseases by imminizations, vaccination and innoculations. Complications from communicable diseases can cause very serious damage to a person.

Good nuitrition is most important. Nothing is more fundamental in the building of healthy vigorous children than furnishing them the right building materials. One gets that in a good well balanced diet.

The school records show that many defects have been corrected. The most serious problems that confronts us at the present time are dental and throat work. Due to the shortage of dentists we are unable to have dental clinics but parents are realizing the importance of corrective work and in most cases their cooperation is very gratifying.

By building healthy bodies and minds in children we help them to become independent, self supporting and productive citizens, which in turn help to build and maintain a good government, democracy and a better world to live in.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Pittsburg School District:

Foreword

Do you ever turn back the clock to days which sometimes look in retrospect much more attractive than they really were? Our children still need the three R's. But they also need an up-to-date acquaintance with the world in which they live.

The jet motor and the atom bomb, because of their dramatic character, are known to all who can read or hear. They typify a new and fast moving age.

American children have an assignment that is not optional. They are introduced to an incredibly complex world, a world of quickly achieved knowledge and skills, of racial and class tension, of international frictions, of battered traditions, of huge debts and of inevitable change. They must have an education which will help them find their way in the world.

The best educational programs to be found in the nation today can still be improved. We can and must provide a good educational opportunity for every individual. As the school program improves and becomes more closely geared with life, an increasingly heavy responsibility is placed on the teachers. Schools are not operated to provide jobs for teachers. The only excuse they have for existing in the community is for the good they can do for the boys and girls.

Somehow may the horizon be brighter because of a thoughtful well guided program of education and training for youth, started in the home and continually strengthened by their experiences in the home, the church and the school. We can build a greater and nobler America only as we develop human resources.

Teachers

There have been several changes in the teaching personnel since the last report. In the High School, William P. Robbins, U. of N. H., became the new Headmaster; Guy Bagley, U. of Connecticut was chosen to teach English and French and Robert McDonough, Clark University, was selected for the social studies postion. Marion Gray returned as teacher of Commerce. Addie Gray, Lyndon Normal, was elected to the 5-6 grade position and Lillian Ball filled the vacancy in the Primary room. Katherine Dwinell Gadwah returned in the 3-4 grade room.

Due to the completion of a new room the first six grades were re-divided, two grades to a room and an extra teacher was added.

Buildings and Equipment

The biggest single item was the finishing off of a new classroom in the High School building. This room is located in the basement on the West Side. It is finished with plywood, and oak flooring and was furnished with new movable pupil desks and flourescent lights. Numerous other minor repairs and improvements were made.

The building is in good condition and quite adequately furnished.

The Danforth School remains closed.

Enrollment and Attendance

The total enrollment of the district is 124, as compared with 110 last year and 107 for the previous year.

There are in the High School five tuition pupils from Clarksville and we have five attending the West Stewartstown Elementary School.

Notes on the Budget

The School Board's total budget for 1947-48 is \$28,993.00 as compared with \$25,557.00 for last year. The requested appropriation of \$28,993.00 represents an increase of \$3,436.00 or about 13% over the appropriation for the previous year. The budget reflects anticipated higher costs all along the line.

Legislature

Undoubtedly a record number of educational bills will come before the legislature this session. It is expected that a minimum salary law will be introduced. A bill providing for increased state aid has already been dropped in the hopper. This bill, if passed, would increase the present \$400,000.00 to approximately \$2,080,000 annually for equalization.

You will, I am sure, wish to keep informed on the various bills as they are presented and upon the possible effect they may have on the educational future of the state.

Conclusion

The destiny of our country remains within our people. We must make education for peace realistic. The best education for peace will be that which provides our young people with a realistic understanding of the world and its peoples, teaches tolerance and goodwill toward the peoples of all lands, but at the same time maintains a firm determination that our nation shall join in a worldwide effort to banish war from the earth.

I take this opportunity to again express my appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for their support in our common effort to maintain good schools.
