A RESOLUTION was presented by Warren Clifford as follows:

"I would like to request that a Committee of seven interested citizens, including one member of the Board of Selectmen, and one member of the Planning Board, be chosen by the Moderator for the reasons listed below:

"1. To seek out and become familiar with the laws of New Hampshire pertaining to the Town Manager form of government.

"2. To visit Town offices in the area employing Town Managers and obtain information on the operation of this plan.

"3. To hold public meetings in the interest of informing the citizens on this matter.

"4. To submit a report of its findings and recommendations in writing to the Board of Selectmen prior to January 1, 1971, and to be distributed with the next annual Town report."

RESOLUTION ACCEPTED

A RESOLUTION was presented by John Ornell that the Selectmen have the Town Budget printed in the 1970 Town Report similar to the School Budget of the 1969 Town Report as printed on Page 128.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTED

A MOTION was made by John Schou and duly seconded by David Gordon that the Board of Selectmen appoint a Committee to act as representatives of the Town in the interest of Highway Safety, said Committee to consist as nearly as practical to that as recommended by the State Legislation; a doctor, lawyer, highway agent, member of School Board, Chief of Police, Fire Department representative, Ambulance representative, Town Selectmen, and other interested parties, and a report brought back to the next Annual Town Meeting.

VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE

A RESOLUTION was presented by Roger Soucey directing the Selectmen to take the necessary steps to clean up the Town of Raymond, to enforce the laws of the State of New Hampshire to clean up junk yards, "eyesores," and any expense incurred be at the discretion of the Selectmen.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTED

A RECOMMENDATION was presented by William McKinley that any expenditure in excess of \$1,000.00 be on a contract bid basis by two or more parties.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES OF DUDLEY TUCKER LIBRARY

This supplements the reports of the Librarian and the Treasurer.

Since the State Library has discontinued centralized book purchasing, we are continuing to buy our books through commercial outlets. This has been generally satisfactory except that there have been delays in the receipt of books ordered.

The Librarian and the Trustees have continued to attend book meetings for the selection of books. They also attend Library Association meetings. This attendance is without cost to the Library.

Reference books have been purchased with State funds (\$100 last December and \$100 this year). Our reference files are growing and improving.

Inter Library cooperation is expanding under the auspices of the State Library. Now books can be borrowed on individual request from Manchester, Exeter or Portsmouth as well as from the State Library. The Librarian will handle the ordering. In addition Raymond residents can obtain from the Librarian a Statewide Library Card which permits the holder to borrow books from almost any Library in the State. Furthermore the "Talking Book" service is now operable. Phonographs and records of books are available without charge for the blind and incapacitated. See the Librarian for this service.

The Trustees acknowledge with thanks a gift of

money from Mrs. Sue Ege and a gift of books from Mrs. John Harney.

The Trustees invite and urge all to make greater use of the Library facilities.

REPORT OF HIGHWAY AGENT

Tarring:

The following sections of road were patched and seal coated: Plains Road, Prospect Street, Sun Hill Drive, Green Road, Francesca Drive, Harriman Road, Orchard Street, Moulton Street, Wright Street, Floral Avenue, School Street, River Road, Gould Street, Depot Street, Lane Road and Long Hill.

For the last two years we have mixed our own patching; it has worked out well.

Morrison Road:

To complete this project, a minimum amount of gravel was needed and was hauled. This road being one of the worst in the past is now one of the best. It has been tarred and completed; some \$1,500.00 was spent on it to finish the job.

Harriman Road:

At the intersection of Harriman Road and Gov- to the edge of the tar road. A section of the ledge condition, as the ledge was two feet above the road to the edge of the tar road. A section of the ledge approximately 12 feet wide, 60 feet long, was drilled and blasted, then dug out and hauled to the new maintenance building site. This section of road has been graveled and tarred. Some \$1,200.00 was spent on the project.

Other drilling and blasting was done on the Ham Road, Langford Road, Old Manchester Road; there was approximately \$500.00 spent.

Juanita Avenue:

New construction of approximately 450 feet of this extended road. There was one catch basin in-

stalled, 112 feet of drain pipe, a sufficient amount of gravel and then tarred. This was a maintenance expenditure.

Town Road Aid:

In February of 1970 we started a 3700 foot project on Green Road, cutting brush, burning brush, etc. By June 27 we had embankments bulldozed and ledges dynamited and 306 feet of culvert delivered for the job. By late summer we had stumps and ledge hauled off, culverts installed and road graveled to the state highway standards. At the present time the state feels that they will not expend any more aid for tarring this section of road. Reason being that of the new state Route 101 being constructed and the relocation of another part of the Green Road.

Mill Road:

A road right of way that belongs to the town that has a summer home on it and a newly-built year round home. This road is located off Lane Road at Handley's Corner and leads to town line of Chester. In order to give the people living there year round service there will have to be a considerable amount of work done on the road. We feel that we should be concerned about 1000 feet of this road.

Prevere Road:

An old town right of way, 1,600 feet in length, located off Harriman Road continuing to Mountain Road at the home of Ted Karl. We have been asked to try to consider doing work on this road to make it passable. It is understood that the Cobb Poultry Co. has built a great deal of taxable property there.

Equipment:

Again this winter as in 1968 we experienced

heavy snow fall. Realizing once again how fortunate the town was to have the Hough equipped to move snow. There is over 1100 hours on the Hough. The grader is in fair condition at the present time.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the men who worked with this department this year, also the town treasurer for her continued services, and the selectmen for their work and interest in this department. I thank the citizens and taxpayers for their continued cooperation.

Results show that we are not doing enough; we must do more in the matter of fire education, a more active inspection program and a more prompt, complete investigation of fires where definite cause is not known with court action where the need is indicated.

We must insist that minor children are given needed supervision. This is a parent's responsibility.

Your Warden and District Chief stand ready to help in this work.

Our gratitude to all who have helped in forest fire prevention and suppression this past year and we look forward to this continued help in our effort to improve our good prompt detection system and fast suppression action. This, coupled with a good prevention program, will improve our fire record.

Follow these simple suggestions to help :

Set a good example for others by observing fire permit laws and regulations; take your debris and waste to the town dump; keep matches away from children and be sure your smoking material is dead out when discarded.

RAYMOND FIRE DEPARTMENT

B. A. CHASE, Chief

The following is a brief report of the activities of the Fire Department for the year 1970.

We had a total of 69 alarms — 42 bell or outside alarms and 27 still alarms. These were as follows:

- 22 Dwellings or buildings involved
- 11 Grass and brush fires, etc.
- 14 Car fires
 - 2 Bomb scares at school
 - 2 Animal rescue
 - 7 Mutual Aid calls
 - 1 No school
 - 5 False alarms
 - 3 Auto accidents
 - 2 Burning of old buildings

These fires involved property valued at approximately \$208,907 with an estimated loss of \$48,502, of which \$25,637 was due to the total loss of four trailers.

We received Mutual Aid from Epping on 2 occasions; Exeter, 1; Fremont, 2, and Candia, 1.

This past year we have installed a Fire Detection System in the entire Fire Station, which means, in the event of fire in the station, the siren will automatically be sounded. We will soon have an alarm box outside the station in order that anyone can sound the alarm, where as now, anyone wanting to report a fire has to do so by telephone.

Also, by the time you receive this report, our new Monitor System should be in operation to the extent

of the funds made available at the last Town Meeting. My budget, for 1971, will include funds to complete this system, which I will further explain at the Town Meeting in March.

Once again, I would like to thank the Selectmen; the Police Department, for their cooperation in handling the traffic problem at, and during, the fires; the Red phone operators; N.H. Fence Co. for the radio antenna support-pipe donation; Brown's Express, for the free express he so willingly donated during the year; Warren Arnault, for the material and labor he provided without charge in replacing the piping on Engine 2, after putting in the new 600 gallon tank, and, to all other citizens who did so much, in any way, by donations of articles, money and time to assist our Department. My sincere appreciation, also, to the members of the Ambulance Association who gave their whole-hearted assistance in standing by, as a "back-up" crew while we were out fighting a fire. (Not to mention the hot coffee they provided for us either at the fire or after our return to the station!)

Finally, a special thanks to all the members of the Fire Department, itself, for their cooperative efforts in helping to maintain a Fire Department of which Raymond can be proud.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Town of Raymond, New Hampshire

This is my 10th annual report to the citizens of Raymond.

The past decade for the Police Department has seen many changes and additions that seem to have befallen many small communities throughout the surrounding area. Increased budgets, additional equipment and men and more sophisticated methods of enforcing law and order, all contribute to a factor known as growth, and Raymond is a small town grown big and getting bigger all the time.

The past year two new branch banks were opened and a liquor store is foreseen in the near future. This type of growth will require more police protection and patrol with additional expense.

The new cruiser was received in June 1970 and had 16,000 miles on it at the end of December 1970. The two radios were converted this year and this gives us five mobile units and a base station which gives us an excellent communications system.

This Department has made application for a Radar Unit to be funded on a 50/50 basis through the Highway Safety Act and approval is expected shortly as the funds become available.

Accidents account for many hours of work each year. This year was just a bit better than 1969. We

were fortunate with some of the serious accidents we covered this year that there were no fatalities. Proposals for the coming year and the addition of radar should improve our record for 1971.

The past year has shown a marked improvement in an area requiring much time, that of burglary, including investigation, and malicious damage. Burglaries have dropped about 50% and malicious damage complaints, even though they number about the same, are not of the same scope as last year. Plans to improve these areas will be forthcoming this year.

Most all the other services provided by your police department, such as school functions, family problems, missing persons, stolen vehicles, suspicious persons checked out and assist to other departments will continue to increase with the growth of our community. Keeping all these factors in mind each and every one of us should expect and demand a growth of the Police Department and support it with every means possible.

In closing this report I would like to take this opportunity to thank Dep. Chief Robert Elliott and each of the Special Officers, the Selectmen, Fire Department, Raymond Ambulance, and last but not least Oscar St. John who has done an excellent job as Dog Officer and every citizen of Raymond for their support and contribution to your Police Department.

PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board wishes to acknowledge the cooperation and assistance that it received from citizens, town officials and town departments during the past year.

A Zoning Ordinance is a means by which a property owner can protect himself against intrusion by neighbors with uses and activities that would be detrimental to his safety, his welfare, and his property values. Because of this, a protective ordinance was presented to the town of Raymond on November 3, 1970. The majority of voters were in favor of adopting the ordinance and it became effective upon its passage.

Briefly the ordinance created two zones, set lot sizes, frontage and setback regulations, mobile home regulations, and restrictions on junkyard operations. A building inspector and a board of adjustment have been apopnited by the Selectmen to administer the ordinance. After living under the ordinance for some months, citizens must agree that although zoning does affect an individual's plans for the use of his property, it is designed to protect the community and assure the best future environment for its citizens.

The board is currently involved in developing a series of town maps including roads, population density, soil conditions, water systems, town properties, and recreational areas. The maps will serve as reference material for the board as well as for general public use. Also under study are the areas of sub-

division regulations and road construction specifications.

Recently the town of Raymond has been greatly enhanced by the addition of an excellent Medical Service, Legal Counsel and by two Banks. It is hoped that the town will continue to develop and protect its future by planned and orderly growth.

REPORT OF TOWN MANAGER INVESTIGATION

The 1970 Town Meeting authorized the appointment of a Committee to study the practicability of employing a Town Manager and to report at the next Town Meeting.

Your Committee (whose names appear below) have worked on the proposition. Information has been obtained from New Hampshire laws, from experience in the states of Maine and of New Hampshire, and from a study of Raymond finances. The search for evidence is still going on.

It may be well to point out at this time that, by New Hampshire Law, the Town Manager, when authorized by the Town Meeting, is a full time employe, hired by the Selectmen, working under the instructions of the Selectmen, and must represent the Selectmen satisfactorily in all his assignments. He is accordingly available daily for the assistance of the Townspeople.

Your Committee has reached the conclusion that the Town of Raymond would do well to adopt the Town Manager System. The Committee, however, does not believe that it has amassed in presentable form sufficient evidence to be convincing at the Town Meeting and asks that it be kept on duty for another year. The Committee requests the Selectmen to include this in the Town Report.

As a part of its study your Committee examined the expenditures for 1969 as shown in the Town Report. The Town spent for clerical and secretarial work by five people the sum of \$2,916.57. The Com-

mittee has no doubt that this money was properly spent and equally properly earned by the five. The Committee believes, however, that the employment by the Selectmen of a single "full time" secretary (male or female) at a reasonable small increase in total wage would be much more desirable. The secretary's duties are suggested as follows:

1. To keep the Selectmen's office open daily, answering telephone calls, etc.
2. To do required typing, bookkeeping, clerical work, etc., previously done by several others.
3. To attend all Selectmen's meetings, keeping minutes where required, and typing letters for Selectmen,
4. To perform any other duties, properly required by the Selectmen.

Your Committee believes that a capable Secretary, devoting her (or his) time about as outlined, can save the Selectmen considerable time to devote to more important duties and can greatly improve the service to the Townspeople. In consequence your Committee recommends that the Selectmen include in their 1971 budget appropriation for a "full time" secretary instead of several part time secretaries.

Submitted herewith are the results of an examination and audit of the Town of Raymond, for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1970.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

All officers of the Town were audited including the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Trustees of Trust Funds, Water Department, Library and Cemetery Trustees.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Exhibit A-1 is a Balance Sheet as of December 31, 1969 and December 31, 1970. The Liabilities exceed the assets making a Net Debt of \$56,385.31. Exhibit A-2 shows the changes in financial conditions. Exhibit A-3 is the appropriations as raised by the vote of the Town, expenditures, unexpended balances and overdrafts. Exhibit A-4 is a statement of Revenues and Budget Summary. The net budget deficit for 1970 was \$3,507.47 this was created through an unusual large amount of appropriations carried forward to be spent in 1971.

DEPARTMENTS

Exhibits B-1 through H show summaries of departmental receipts, expenditures and proof of Balances. All monies were accounted for by checking receipts at source, expenditures by canceled checks and reconciling with depository banks.

GENERAL COMMENTS

All records are in excellent condition. Water accounts receivable are up \$872.74 over the 1969 balances due. Several citizens are not making any attempt to pay their bills. Your auditor suggests a drive on these accounts. Property may be sold for unpaid water bills.

Many thanks to the officials of the Town, for the cooperation given us during the course of the audit.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Raymond in the [L.S.] County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Raymond Fire Station in said Raymond on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what action the Town will take relative to the playing of Beano in the Town of Raymond.
4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell at public auction any property acquired by Tax Collector's deeds.
6. To see if the Town will vote to revise the existing Town Road regulations.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and

appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500) for purchase of office equipment.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the Seacoast Regional Counseling Center (formerly the Portsmouth Mental Health Clinic) as requested by this organization.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to tar the nine hundred (900) feet of Essex Road which was accepted by the Town in 1970.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept as a Town Road the forty four hundred (4400) foot extension of Essex Road known as Pond Road, Pine Road and Twins Road which have been prepared in accordance with the required specifications, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to pave same.

11. To see if the Town will vote to accept the six hundred feet (600) of road known as Bambi Lane, said road being forty two feet wide and having a one hundred foot radius turn around at the end, and to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pave same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to gravel and widen sixteen hundred feet (1600) of the Prevere Road.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to gravel and widen one thousand feet (1000) of the Mill Road.

14. On petition of Roy Campbell and thirty four

others, to see if the Town will vote to accept Highland Avenue, located west off Batchelder Road, extending five hundred feet (500) in distance, and to see if the Town will raise and appropriate sufficient funds for tarring said road.

15. To see if the Town will vote to accept two hundred feet (200) of extension to Juanita Avenue, 40 feet wide, after road has been built to town standards.

16. On petition of Kristy Construction Corp. and ten others to see if the Town will vote to accept an extension of Elsun Avenue from its present termination for approximately one hundred and fifty feet (150) to its intersection of Sasame Street, so called, and to raise and appropriate a sufficient sum of money to pave same.

17. Voters may choose to elect officers on second Tuesday in March and allow Selectmen to choose another day to transact all other town business by ballot approval of the following question. In adopting the provisions, the warrant for the Town Meeting shall prescribe the place, day and hour of each session of the meeting.

DO YOU APPROVE OF HAVING TWO SESSIONS FOR THE ANNUAL TOWN MEETING IN THIS TOWN, THE FIRST SESSION FOR THE CHOICE OF TOWN OFFICERS ELECTED BY AN OFFICIAL BALLOT AND OTHER ACTION REQUIRED TO BE INSERTED ON SAID OFFICIAL BALLOT AND THE SECOND SESSION ON A DATE SET BY THE SELECTMEN FOR THE TRANSACTION OF OTHER BUSINESS?

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$35,000.00

for the erection of a Town Office Building to be built on the Old Town Hall foundation and to authorize the issue and sale of notes or bonds of the Town under and pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act.

19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the 1934 D-4 Bulldozer to the highest bidder and monies from same to be deposited in the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Fund.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Fire Chief to send fire apparatus out of Town and receive fire apparatus from other towns on a donated basis in accordance with the provisions of R.S.A. Chapter 154.

21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) for the purchase of a Tranquilizer Gun for the Dog Officer to be used in his work.

22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of housing the Medical Center outside of the Municipal Building.

23. On petition of twenty-six voting residents of the Town of Raymond, petition the sum of Two Thousand dollars (\$2000.00) to be raised and appropriated for the purpose of financing the summer recreation and water safety program, said program to be under the supervision of the Raymond Boosters Inc. Recreation Committee.

24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00) to purchase a tract of land, deed reading thirty two acres more or less, land measuring approximately eighteen hundred and fifty feet by

twelve hundred feet, and to authorize the issue and sale of notes or bonds of the Town under the pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act. This land is now owned by Thomas P. Welch of Raymond, N.H. of which approximately eighteen hundred and fifty feet of this land borders the B & M Railroad. The right of way to this land borders Route 107 and will be a public right of way to all abutters of this land. The purpose of the Town purchasing this land is for a future Industrial site, School site, Town well site, etc. No portion of this land shall be sold for any purpose without a vote of the people at a special or regular Town Meeting.

25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Polls will not close before 6 p.m.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS

The Cemetery activities of the Trustees have continued as in the preceding years. This work has consisted of the use of Cemetery Trust Funds for perpetual care of lots and (by direction of the Selectmen) the handling of the \$650.00 appropriation for Pine Grove Cemeteries. The appropriation was used for Spring cleanup, mowing for Memorial Day, and mowing the avenues. It was also stretched to cover some work on the Lane and Chester Line Cemeteries, of which more later.

Because of favorable weather conditions and (we believe) improved efficiency of operation, the Perpetual care expense was kept down to \$1,152.35, about two thirds of the amount available, and about \$12 less than the year before.

The Lane Cemetery was burned over where needed. Brush was cut and sprayed with weed killer and the whole Cemetery brought to a condition where it could be mowed several times. The Cemetery is now in condition where regular mowing will keep it presentable.

On Chester Line Cemetery brush cutting and scything (also mostly volunteer work) brought the Cemetery to the point where near the end of the season it could be mowed completely by machine. Next year regular mowing plus a little weed killer should give good results.

Income from Perpetual Care Funds of the Single Space section is, as yet, inadequate for its care. Help was extended from other Perpetual Care Funds.

Here, too, volunteer help was given and was greatly appreciated. We mention particularly that the Raymond Garden Club purchased and set out tulip bulbs around the flagpole. This should give an attractive touch of color in the Spring.

We were distressed by two cases of vandalism at Chester Line Cemetery. On the Whittier lot (which is under Perpetual Care) the large monument was damaged and six footstones overturned. On other lots nine headstones and eight footstones were overturned with eight of them broken. This was reported to the Selectmen and Police. Repairs to the Whittier monument are scheduled for next Spring when weather and temperature conditions permit.

We point out several items of interest as regards the Cemetery Trust Funds:

All the larger funds (\$500 and over) have been changed over to draw 6% interest.

Five new funds totaling \$275 have been established. Several have been started with partial payments and are being built up to the present normal level of \$200. We are happy to cooperate and recommend the practice to others.

It will be noted from the Treasurer's tabulation that we have not been using all the interest available. We have been helped by favorable weather for two seasons. We may be considered by some to have been a little too stingy on the expenditures. We hope to improve care of the Cemeteries by a greater use of available funds.

Our management of the Cemetery portion of the Trust Funds has been criticized because we do not spend exactly the accrued interest on each respective lot and do spend some of it on lots not under

Perpetual Care. It is said that those who have not established Perpetual Care Funds are gaining an unfair advantage from this. We agree with this conclusion and wish that all lots were under Perpetual Care. Our experience, however, indicates that this is not the whole story and we offer the following offsetting and practical comments.

A well-kept Perpetual Care lot is degraded by an adjacent or nearby lot with weeds and hay two feet high. This has been experienced in the past.

Weed seeds from an unkept lot pollute a cared for lot.

By spending money for mowing rather than bookkeeping, we obtain a presentable cemetery well within the limits of available funds, and, we believe, at little or no added expense. Actually, expenditure in 1970 was less than in any of the three preceding years.

Barring instructions to the contrary from the Selectmen or the Town Meeting, we plan to continue the practices of the past few years until we are relieved from duty. We will be glad to discuss this policy more fully at any time.

nature to the Raymond High School, to wit: The designing, constructing, and equipping of additional building facilities to said high school and to authorize the School Board, in the name of the District, to enter into contracts, sign necessary documents and instruments, and to do all other acts and things necessary and proper to carry out any action authorized under this article. 515 ballots cast.

Article 7: To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto. Motion was made and seconded that all reports printed in the Annual Town Report be accepted as printed. Vote in the affirmative.

Article 8: To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant. Motion made and seconded that Article 8 be indefinitely postponed. Vote in the affirmative.

Article 9: To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation for such sums as are estimated to be received from the State Foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes of the Town.

Motion made and seconded that the sum of \$549,-549.30 be raised and appropriated for the support of schools as outlined in Article 9. Vote in the affirma-

tive. An amendment to the motion was made and seconded that a secret ballot be taken for Article 9. Standing vote was taken. Yes - 38, No - 73. Amendment was defeated.

Article 10: To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting. A resolution was presented by John Ornell as follows:

WHEREAS, New Hampshire ranks last in the nation in state aid to local schools; and

WHEREAS, the number of school children and the cost of education continues to increase each year;

WHEREAS, the increasing cost of education is borne almost entirely by local property taxes which are fast becoming confiscatory,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Voters of the Raymond School District call upon the Governor and the Legislature to substantially increase state aid to local school districts; and that the Clerk is hereby instructed to forward copies of this resolution to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the speaker of the House of Representatives, and the local Legislative delegation.

The Moderator accepted the Resolution and directed the Clerk to forward the copies as directed.

Warren Clifford offered the following resolution: To instruct the School Board to realign the school population so none of the small children would be in the wooden building, if possible. A vote of confidence in the affirmative was offered by the assembly.

The meeting adjourned at 10:02 p.m.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Having been your Superintendent for a very short time I am unable to report on past accomplishments but will offer some observations on what appear to be most pressing problems and suggest some alternative solutions.

Housing is the most urgent problem in most Districts. We should closely examine new methods of construction, such as pre-fabricated and pre-engineered buildings, concrete slab buildings and portable classrooms and compare them with the more traditionally constructed schools.

Curriculum revision must be constant. Our schools must place more emphasis on those pupils who complete their formal education in the public schools. Study and evaluation can show which courses are relevant to the 1970's and which should be scrapped or changed.

The structure of the school must be scrutinized as to its effectiveness in each area. Campus type schools, open concept schools, team teaching, mini-courses of short duration, humanities approach and other innovations can bring education alive to the disinterested child.

By 1973, State minimum standards must be met by all schools in the State. They are too long to reproduce here; however, several copies are available at the Superintendent's office for loan.

The School Department appreciates your fine support of the schools.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

If there is one word that may describe the major problem that besets every school district in southeastern New Hampshire, it is GROWTH! In the decade of the sixties, Raymond's school enrollment has increased from 503 to over 900 students. The housing crisis caused by this unprecedented growth was temporarily alleviated by the construction of the Houghton classroom wing in 1965. However, only five years later, in 1970, not only was this facility filled to capacity, but classes were being held in the old red schoolhouse and in the basement of the elementary school.

However, the problem is not just to find enough space in the various rooms for a desk and chair for each pupil — more specialized areas for courses such as industrial arts, science, business education, and home economics are also required. Over the past two years, an attempt has been made to remedy this situation by the proposal of additional building facilities; however, in both instances these proposals were defeated by the voters of the district.

We have received numerous complaints in the past few years regarding the deficiencies in the junior high school program. The board feels that there is justification in these complaints as pupils are offered only six weeks of industrial arts or home economics out of the whole school year. Because these are particularly important subjects for the non-college student, we feel there is a critical need to

up-grade these programs to benefit a large segment of our school population.

After reviewing alternatives for the 1971-72 school year, the board has petitioned the State Department of Education for permission to operate our school system on double or split sessions. Quite simply, this means that some grades will be scheduled in a morning session and the other grades will be in an afternoon session, thus utilizing the existing building for nearly eleven full hours per day.

The school board is well aware that this longer school day will bring with it many obvious problems, both in the school, and in the home. However, it is hoped that positive factors such as reduced class size in the elementary grades, improved curriculum in the junior high and high school grades, and fuller utilization of present facilities will justify the inconvenience of a double session program.

By this time, the community will be aware of the sizeable increase asked for by the board to operate schools for 1971-72. While this increase is due, in part, to the double session program, the major portion is for additional staff members. It goes without saying that with a growth rate in pupils of 10%, more facilities are needed. Further it should be noted that regardless of how these become available—whether through a building program, rented space in the community, portable classrooms, or double sessions—in order to keep elementary class size at a reasonable level and maintain minimum standards at the secondary level, more staff members are required.

Now of course, the school board is not unmindful of the strain that budget increases impose upon

the taxpayer. It is unfortunate that a town with a relatively small tax base such as Raymond must impose upon the resident taxpayer a disproportionately larger share of school costs than is the case in those towns and cities having a wider tax base. However, this is a fact of life and we must live with it unless and until we protest enough to our representatives to the General Court to effect a state-wide tax program that will adequately equalize the efforts of all towns to meet school costs.

In the meantime, your school board will continue as they have in the past, to scrutinize expenditures in an effort to keep costs down. While on the subject of school costs, it is interesting to note that in spite of the large increases over the past few years in school budgets, Raymond's 1969-70 cost per pupil still remains below state average at both the elementary and secondary levels.

What lies ahead in the "seventies" for education in Raymond is difficult to predict. If the past is any indication of the future, we will continue to make every effort possible to meet the educational needs of our children, realizing that the welfare of these future adults will not permit us to do less.

RAYMOND SCHOOL BOARD

RAYMOND BUILDING COMMITTEE

April 1, 1970

The following people were suggested as people to work with the board and administrators on a building proposal: Josiah Gordon, Marion Lovejoy, Mildred Campbell, Warren Arnault, and Jim Turner. Mrs. Gertrude Dannis and Mrs. Mary Conroy were selected from the teaching staff.

May 27, 1970

Present at first meeting: All board members, Superintendent McLaughlin, Principals Callaghan and Minichiello, Marion Lovejoy, Mildred Campbell, Mary Conroy, Gertrude Dannis, Warren Arnault. Discussion was held on last bond issues and possible reasons for failure. Those noted were:

- a. community did not like the proposal
- b. people would not have voted for any bond issue because of tax increase
- c. lack of communication with public
- d. long-range planning should be stressed
- e. recommendation of educational consultant should be made known to community

After discussion, the group felt that a questionnaire to be mailed to every voter in the district might be a step in the right direction. Hugh Holt, Marion Lovejoy, Mildred Campbell and Ralph Minichiello were to draw up the questions.

A target date of September or October was set for this committee to reach some conclusion so that a proposal could be formulated and presented to the voters in March 1971.

June 17, 1970

Approximately 80 questionnaires returned were reviewed and analyzed. Most replies seemed to favor improvements in both elementary and high school areas.

Mr. Case asked that a committee look into the possibility of a school site. Ruby Colligan, Jim Turner and Sally Paradis will report at the next meeting.

August 19, 1970

Deputy Commissioner Robert Brunelle was present. He reviewed the land requirements:

High School — 10 acres for first 100 plus one acre for each additional 100 pupils (1,000 pupils — 20 acres)

Elementary — five acres for first 100 plus one acre for each additional 100 pupils (1000 pupils — 15 acres)

In view of the growth predicted for this area, Mr. Brunelle strongly encouraged the purchase of land in the community for a future school site.

He also commented on the desirability of retaining tuition pupils as long as this is financially advantageous to Raymond.

September 16, 1970

Discussion was held as to a proposal to be presented to the voters in March 1971. Mr. Case asked if some sort of agreement could be reached as to what should be proposed. The majority of those present favored an off-site elementary school, with renovations at the present facility for a high school.

The report of the site committee was withheld pending the selection of an architect.

October 14, 1970

Architects were interviewed: Isaac Associates and Dirsa & Lampron.

October 21, 1970

A discussion was held on types of construction presented by the architects and related costs. Mildred Campbell, Marion Lovejoy, Frank Case and Ralph Minichiello reported on a visit to the new elementary school in Meredith designed by Dirsa & Lampron on the open concept plan.

As there seemed to be some question in the minds of some committee members as to whether or not a decision had been reached to present an elementary school, further discussion was held. It was finally agreed to hold a meeting to discuss the following alternatives with the public on November 9:

- a. elementary school off site
- b. high school addition
- c. elementary school addition — on site
- d. elementary school off site with renovations to high school

Also to be presented were facts on co-op schools, AREA concept, borrowing capacity, construction costs.

November 18, 1970

The meeting of November 9th was reviewed. The committee was generally pleased with this meeting at which approximately 75 people were present.

Because of the strong feeling indicated at the meeting on the 9th, in the direction of pursuing the co-op arrangement, this committee felt it should contact school boards in surrounding towns as to their willingness to study co-op.

Mr. Holt moved and it was seconded that: "We immediately contact the school boards of the following districts — Candia, Deerfield, Northwood, Nottingham, Epping, Fremont and Chester indicating that there seems to be a body of opinion in the Raymond School District supporting cooperative endeavors; indicating that we as a school board recognize the advantages of cooperative school organization, but that we also are faced with severe and immediate need for physical facilities and because we find ourselves in this dilemma we request them to indicate if they would call a meeting on Saturday, January 16th, of their school district to determine if their voters would approve their participation in a cooperative study. Raymond to continue general planning toward off-site elementary building but to hold in abeyance a firm decision pending the results of this vote." Voted in the affirmative.

The Superintendent will be asked to draft a letter to the school boards of the towns mentioned above.

It was decided to hold the next meeting on December 16 if enough replies are received. (Note: Meeting not held as only two replies had been received.)

The next meeting was set by the school board for January 20, 1971.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board, School District Treasurer, School Lunch Program and High School Activities Fund.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative balance sheets, as of June 30, 1969 and June 30, 1970, are presented in Exhibit A-1. . . As indicated therein, the Net Debt of the School District decreased by \$8,796.87, from \$302,716.61 to \$293,919.74, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1970, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

School Lunch Program (Exhibit C)

A summary statement of the school lunch program account is included in Exhibit C.

High School Activities Fund (Exhibit D)

A statement of the fiscal activity in the high school activities account is contained in Exhibit D.

School Tax Account (Exhibit E)

A statement of the school tax account with the Town of Raymond is presented in Exhibit E. As indicated therein, at June 30, 1970, the School District had received from the Town, the total of the 1969-70 school tax, the amount of which was \$333,386.98.

Bonded Indebtedness (Exhibit F)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the School District as of June 30, 1970, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit F.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus (Deficit)

The current financial condition of the School District changed from a current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) of \$2,283.39, to a current deficit (excess of current liabilities over total assets) of \$10,919.74 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, as shown herewith:
