THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Stewartstown, in the County of Coos in the said State qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Town of Stewartstown on Tuesday the ninth day of March at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote the following Town Officers:
 - (a) Town Clerk.
 - (b) Selectman for the three years ensuing.
 - (c) Town Treasurer.
 - (d) Five Road Agents.
 - (e) One or more Constables.
 - (f) One or more Sextons.
 - (g) Collector of Diamond Pond Rents.
 - (h) Overseer of Poor.
 - (i) Trustee of Trust Funds.
 - (j) One Library Trustee for the three years ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to accept the budget as submitted by the Selectmen. If not to see see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year, as follows:

- (a) Town Officers' Salaries.
- (b) Town Officers' Expenses.
- (c) Election and Registration.
- (d) Town Hall Expenses.
- (e) Damages and Legal Expenses.
- (f) Health Department.
- (g) Vital Statistics.
- (h) Interest on Temporary Loans.
- (i) Interest on Long Term Notes.
- (j) County Tax.
- (k) State Tax.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for support of the Poor.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Libraries.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the care of Cemeteries.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise seven hundred thirty-five (\$735.00) dollars for street lighting.
- 8. To see what sum of money, if any, the Town will vote to raise, in addition to that required by law for Town Road Maintenance.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise the following departments:
 - (a) Police Department, including care of Tramps.
 - (b) Fire Department.
 - (c) Sewer Department.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Winter Roads.
- 11. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise to pay on Long Term Notes.

- 12. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of Taxes of the Municipal year and to pay debts out of the Tax money when it is received.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through a Tax Collector's Deed.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the following roads which are not used:
 - (a) The Amos Tewksbury Road. Starting from the State Aided Road to the Amos Tewksbury place.

(b) Cross Road. Starting from the Norah Kidder farm to Enoc Terrill farm.

(c) Brooks Woods Road. Starting at the Burton Corbett barn to the Colebrook Town Line.

(d) Alvin Sawyer Road. Starting from the Allen Knights farm house to the Alvin Sawyer place.

(e) Mattie Haynes Road. Starting at the Charles Heath road to the Mattie Haynes place.

(f) Lilly Horn Road. Starting at State Aided Road near Arthur Forest's to Alvin Hall place.

16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct, authorize and empower its Selectmen to pledge the credit of said Town in sum of twenty thousand (\$20,-000.00) Dollars, by issuing a series of Notes, written in the sum of five thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars each, dated February 1st, 1937, and made payable to the order of the Public Service Company of New Hampshire, with interest, in one, two, three, and four years respectively, from the date thereof; in full and complete

settlement, of a judgment rendered in an action in favor of said Public Service Company of New Hampshire against said Town covering the amount agreed upon for excess sums paid by said Public Service Company of New Hampshire to the said Town for taxes on real estate which has been determined is without the Town and State of New Hampshire.

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to abate the Beecher Falls Company 1936 Tax of \$312.80.
- 18. To vote upon the following question: Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?
- 19. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before this meeting.

Superintendent's Report

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the town of Stewartstown:

General

School is democracy's greatest gift to civilization. Throughout the world, among upward struggling people, wherever parents share in the aspirations of their children, schools flourish. But let us not think that an education is acquired only in schools. Education is a part of life—a continuing process.

Children grow up but once. Today's children must start their education in today's schools. Ours is the responsibility of supplying a school that can respond to the needs of the times.

You have locked in your heart your secret hopes and ambitions for our boys and girls. Someday you will find expression for your desires, then the boys and girls, as well as the rest of the community will know your feelings by the support that you give to your own schools.

The next time that you pass a school house pause a moment to think what school means to humanity.

Teachers

The following changes occurred in the teaching personnel of the district: Margaret Edgar, Kathleen Lord and Barbara Greenwood fill respectively the vacancies at Bear Rock, Hollow and North Hill Schools, all were graduated from Plymouth Normal School and the former has had previous teaching experience. Ruth Travers of Keene Normal was selected to fill the vacancy at Cedar Brook School. The enrollment (124)

at West Stewartstown was so large that it became imperative that the fourth room be finished off. Sybil Porter was added to the staff as teacher for the third and fourth grades. During the Christmas recess Cleora Stillings Richardson and Ruth Gray Weeks resigned and were replaced by Lee Hallowell in the upper grades and Pearl Raymond in the primary room.

Buildings and Equipment

The condition of the buildings is for the most part greatly improved. The Cedar Brook and Hollow Schools were completely redecorated inside. One side of the roof at North Hill was shingled and the Bear Rock School was papered. At West Stewartstown the building was completely redecorated inside and painted outside; the building was also shingled. By adding the extra room it was necessary to finish off the walls and ceiling to build in cupboards, a cloak room, and to install blackboards, radiation, curtains, maps, seats and a teachers desk. Also numerous other minor repairs were made on the buildings.

Enrollment and Attendance

There are now 183 enrolled in our elementary schools, of which 116 are at West Stewartsttown and the remaining 67 in the rural schools. This is an increase of 11 over the same period last year. The number of tuition pupils is the same as of last report, namely 37.

The attendance records were for the most part satisfactory. Cedar Brook maintained a 96 per cent record. West Stewartstown Grammar had a very commendable tardiness record having only five for the 180 school days.

Health

The primary purpose of health work in Health education is conceived as teaching how to live. If this were not so, there would be no justification for placing the service in schools.

The health service program of the school—the examination, the follow-up, weighing and measuring, the dental clinic, the methods of communicable disease control, the plans for a healthy school environment—all offer opportunities for students to learn to live healthfully.

There is only one way to learn to live healthfully and that is to practice living healthfully.

In recent studies made by the American Child Health Association to determine the effectiveness of the school health program, large groups of children were studied to determine their freedom from defects, their health practices, and to find out what factors most influenced these conditions. The one factor found to have the greatest significance was the nurse-teacher relationship. When the parent, the teacher and the nurse work together the closest, it is reflected in a better health status of the child.

Notes on the Budget

The total amount of the School Board's 1937-38 budget is \$16,311.21 as compared with \$14,749.21 for 1936-37. The estimated income for the coming year is State Aid \$5,294.00, Tuition \$55.00 and Dog Licenses \$40.00 or a total of \$5,389.00. Approval of the budget would therefore require that \$10,922.00 be raised by taxation.

All the items in the budget remain practically the same as in former years except for the additional cost of running the extra room at West Stewartstown and the increased tuition due to increasing numbers attending High School.

The School District's outstanding indebtedness is \$5,700.00. This should be reduced some each year if possible.
