## WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING.

### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Wolfeboro qualified to vote in town affairs.*

You are hereby notified to meet in Brewster Memorial Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects.

ART. 1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To choose three Selectmen for the ensuing year.

ART. 3. To choose two Auditors for the ensuing year.

ART. 4. To choose one Library Trustee for the ensuing three years.

ART. 5. To choose a Collector of Taxes, Treasurer and all other necessary town officers.

ART. 6. To see if the town will vote to return to the road agent system and elect one or more Road Agents, or will vote to redistrict the town.

ART. 7. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the Constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention shall be approved.

ART. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairing highways and bridges in addition to that required by law.

ART. 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise to defray town expenses.

ART. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on its indebtedness.

ART. 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay for breaking roads the past winter.



ART. 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and pay each fireman legally returned for the year of 1903 in addition to that required by law.

ART. 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and pay to James R. Newell Post No. 61, G. A. R., of this town, to assist in defraying expenses of Memorial Day, May 30, 1903.

ART. 14. To hear the report of the Committee appointed in 1901 to investigate the condition of the water pipe of the Wolfeboro Water system and take such action thereon as they deem advisable.

ART. 15. To choose three Water Commissioners for the ensuing year.

ART. 16. To see if the town will vote to have a Liquor Agent for the ensuing year.

ART. 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay for public band concerts during the following summer, agreeable to a petition signed by Mark B. Blaisdell and others.

ART. 21. To see what action the town will take in relation to the unexpended money raised at the last annual meeting for the observance of "Old Home Day," agreeable to a petition signed by Perley E. Young, Roscoe M. Flanders and others.

ART. 22. To see if the town will vote to assist in the observance of "Old Home Day" for 1903 and what sum of money it will vote to raise and appropriate for that purpose, agreeable to a petition signed by Perley E. Young, Roscoe M. Flanders and others.

ART. 23. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the town library in addition to that required by law.

ART. 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF BOARD OF HEALTH.

*To the Selectmen and Citizens of Wolfeboro:*

During the past year four cases of typhoid fever have been reported, one of which was complicated with liver trouble and proved fatal. The town has been remarkably free from contagious diseases indicative of good sanitary conditions.

Deaths from all causes 33, the youngest 9 years, 7 months; oldest 87 years, 10 months, 15 days.

We think we may be pardoned in saying a commendable word for the mothers and physicians for their watchful care of the little ones, as only one child under ten years has left a “vacant chair.”

Living births during the year 28. 15 males, 13 females.

The weekly, monthly and annual reports pertaining to our duties were promptly made. At the request of the State Board of Health, a sample of our public water supply was sent to them for analysis and in due time said Board reported to us “excellent water.” The annual inspection of the water shed surrounding our public water supply was carefully made in September and found satisfactory.

The removal by death from the board of their medical advisor, the venerable Dr. RUFUS HORN KING, at the age of 82 years, 11 months and 21 days, we note with reverential sorrow. His mature age and ability, quiet manner, good judgment, three score years practice in the



science of medicine; forty-one of which have been in this and surrounding towns, is not only a great loss to this board, but to the profession and community in which he has resided so long.
