

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 11th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow work.
- 4. To see how much money the town will raise for plowing and sanding roads in winter.

- 5. To see if town will accept State Aid Construction and raise \$757.50 for same or will accept Town Road Assistance (Class 5) and raise \$522.26 for same.
- 6. To see if town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the road from Mrs. Everett C. Merrill's to point discontinued in 1926, near the Aboltin place; and to relinquish to abutting land owners all title to that part of the above mentioned road (Lyle Gale's to Aboltin place) discontinued in 1926.
- 7. To see if town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the road from corner of Burns Cemetery westerly by the Breck timber lot and M. C. Mathews estate to Ned Mathews' driveway.

- 8. To see if town will vote to raise and appropriate \$300 for dredging the river back of the Town House provided the State will appropriate \$1,000 for the same purpose.
- 9. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for painting fence and care of Rhoades Cemetery.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$50 to the Lakes Region Association for advertising the natural advantages and attractions of this town.
- 11. To see if the town will raise \$400 for Blister Rust control.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid early in the season.
- 13. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.
- 14. To see if the town would vote to raise and appropriate \$25 for the Newfound Region association for advertising the natural advantages and attractiveness of this town and make appropriation for the same.
- 15. To act on any other matters that may legally come before this meeting.
