1944 Town Warrant

- Article 1. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes and two Auditors for ensuing year.
- Art. 2. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Chairman, Board of Selectmen Town of Barrington

Dear Sir:

The last Legislature enacted a law suspending all State Aid Construction on Class II highways until the termination of the present war and for six months thereafter. Therefore, there are no State funds available for Class II construction for the year 1944. However, it is the desire of all concerned that the unimproved mileage of Class II roads on the Orange System be completed as soon as possible.

With that in mind, would your town care to raise any money this year for this purpose, the same to be set aside for future construction when State moneys become available?

This year your town is eligible for Town Road Aid. At the close of the war, however, the statute of 1941 will be in effect—that any town with unimproved Class II highways on the Orange System must expend its State Aid money on this Orange line until it is completed, and the towns cannot have Town Road Aid during that time. Therefore, if funds can be raised at this time to match State funds which will become available later, it might hasten the time that your town would again become eligible for Town Road Aid.

You would have been asked to raise \$1,075.50 this year if the State Aid Law had not been suspended.

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Board and Citizens of Barrington:

The present enrollment in Barrington School is over 8% larger than last year, distributed as follows:

The high school attendance from Barrington has increased in about the same proportion, with 16 at Spaulding High in Rochester, 17 at Dover High, and two at Austin-Cate Academy.

Special instruction in music has been introduced as authorized by the District. Mrs. Sadie L. Merriam, a graduate of the musical curriculum at Keene Teachers College, was secured for this service. Since the state law was passed, providing for the instruction of handicapped children, three children in Barrington have received the benefits of such instruction from experienced teachers at a nominal cost.

The Report of the School Nurse, Miss Margaret Macdonald, R. N., shows the completion of the regular health examination, as well as special attention when required, reports and home visits, conferences, and cooperation with the school in instruction with respect to diet, health habits, and safety. Much of the school

health activity is designed to secure normal health and growth by prevention rather than cure. Twenty pupils received certificates of complete dental care from Dr. C. H. Manning, D.D.S., at the clinic arranged by the nurse, with the generous assistance of the Woman's Club, the Parent-Teacher Association, and the Grange.

The bicentennial of Thomas Jefferson, born April 13, 1743, is being celebrated this year. Author of the Declaration of Independence and the Statute of Virginia for Religious Freedom, Secretary of State in the Cabinet of George Washington, Vice-President and third President of the United States, organizer of the Northwest Territory (now the "Middle West"), acquirer of the great Louisiana Purchase, he was prominent above most men in respect to important events deemed worthy of study by every school boy and girl. Although a Southerner, he proposed to free the slaves. The arithmetic of American school children is much simpler because he introduced dollars and cents as our system of money. He valued his own education higher than the fortune which his father left him, and he believed that through education the common people could be trusted to govern themselves intelligently. It is because of thousands of schools like ours in Barrington that the democracy which Jefferson advocated and practiced can live, defend itself against its enemies, and extend itself as the champion of human rights throughout the world. 1051
