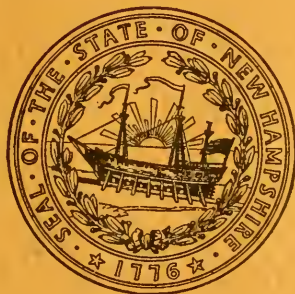
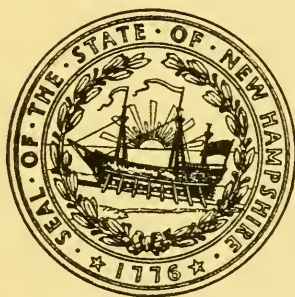

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bartlett in the County of Carroll in said State qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Bartlett on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

ART. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of money called for in the budget as prepared by the Selectmen.

ART. 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow necessary sums in anticipation of taxes.

ART. 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute the blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.

ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through the Tax Collector's deeds.

ART. 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid as Town Road Aid, and will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars for same.

ART. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars to provide adequate protection due to war emergency.

ART. 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars for the support and continuance of the Memorial Hospital, North Conway.

ART. 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take on W. P. A. projects, provided no financial obligation to the Town is involved.

ART. 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Superintendent

To the Citizens and School Board of Bartlett:

There were three changes in the personnel of the teaching staff this year. Mr. Raymond Morton and Miss Barbara Purmort, both of whom had been with us for a number of year, resigned to accept positions elsewhere. Mrs. Effie Hunt after several years of excellent service was compelled to give up her work last fall on account of health. Mr. Raymond Brennick was secured for Mr. Morton's place and Miss June DuGay was engaged for the primary school. Both are graduates of last year's class at Farmington normal school. Mrs. Muriel Campbell, a primary teacher of very successful experience was engaged for the vacancy at Intervale.

Bartlett should feel pride in the fact that two of its men teachers have joined the armed forces of the United States. Mr. Brennick left early in January and Mr. Charles Harmon of the high school was called soon after. It is practically impossible to secure qualified replacements for men teachers at this time and arrangements were made in both the graded and high schools to carry on the work with the reduced teaching staff. Mrs. Alice Chandler Davis took over the grammar school and the principalship, the third grade was assigned to Miss DuGay and the fourth grade to Miss Chambers. This gives 33 pupils to each teacher which is about the same as the average at the Intervale school.

On account of the decreased registration in the high school, it is possible with the willing cooperation of Mr. Huls-

man and Mrs. Pennett to carry on the work of the high school with some not important adjustments. A few minor changes in the course of study would make it possible to continue the arrangement next year.

It should be understood that the budget as presented to the voters is based on the assumption that this arrangement in both schools will be continued next year. There has been an increase in the cost of fuel, janitor service, books and supplies and transportation, and a marked decrease in the amount of state aid allotted for next year. While every possible economy has been taken into account the budget as recommended with the addition of special appropriations calls for \$17,718. This amount would have to be increased by \$2,000 if the voters are unwilling to go along with the suggested reduction of number of teachers. The superintendent believes that the reduction in teaching staff is entirely justified by the smaller registration and the exigencies of war time, and that it can be done without any material loss to the effectiveness of the schools.
