### Town Warrant

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Charlestown, in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Charlestown on Tuesday the thirteenth (13th) day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose the necessary Town Officers for their respective terms.
- Art. 2. To consider the Budget. To raise such sums of money as may be deemed necessary for the maintenance of the poor, laying out and repairing highways, building and repairing bridges, street lighting, and for the necessary charges arising within the town.
- Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to allow the selectmen to deliver the inventory blanks at the time of taking inventory.
- Art. 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow on notes on the credit of the town, such sums of money as may be necessary to meet current expenses in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to accept all trust funds received for the perpetual care of lots in the cemeteries.
- Art. 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to appointing a finance committee for the ensuing year.
- Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one one hundredth of one percent (1-100 of 1%) of the assessed valuation based on the assessment of 1944 for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, together with other towns in the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region. (inserted by request).
- Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the purpose of cooperating with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, in regard to continuing white pine blister rust control. (inserted by request).
- Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to appoint a committee to investigate the need of a new school building, and report with recommendations at the next town meeting. (inserted by request).
- Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to install a catch basin to take care of surface water at the foot of Bridge Street hill near the residence of W. F. Poisson, and raise and appropriate money for same. (inserted by request).
- Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to re-surface the new Acworth road with tarvia, and raise and appropriate money for the purpose. (inserted by request).

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to insulate the attic in the town hall, and raise and appropriate money for the purpose. (inserted by request).

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to weatherstrip and caulk the windows in the town hall, and raise and appropriate money for the

purpose. (inserted by request)

Art. 14. To see if the town will vote to paint the town hall and fire station, and raise and appropriate money for the purpose. (inserted by request).

Art. 15. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the following mentioned highways—

(a) Road near Arthur Lane's to Unity highway.

(b) Road leading from the Acworth road past the Merrill place now owned by T. J. Frizzell, to the Eggleston road.

(inserted by request).

- Art. 16. To see if the town will vote to require the proprietors of the Boston and Maine Railroad to raise or lower the main highway leading from Charlestown to Claremont where said highway is crossed by railroad at Merrill Crossing, so called, in said town of Charlestown so that said highway will be sufficiently above or below said railroad to safely accommodate the travel upon both said highway and said railroad, or to erect and maintain gates across said highway, by the sides of said railroad at said Merrill's Crossing, so called, or to station a flagman at said crossing. (inserted by request).
- Art. 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 to purchase additional seats for the upper town hall, to match ones purchased last year. (inserted by request).
- Art. 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100.00 to be used by the Charlestown Recreation Council, to pay a director for the Charlestown Recreation Centre for the 1945 and 1946 season. (inserted by request).
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote to lay out and construct a road in the north end of Forest Hill Cemetery from East Street east to join with the present drive, and to survey and lay out burial lots in the north end of the cemetery, adjacent to this proposed road.
- Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to object, so far as they can, to any action for the taking of the Cheshire Bridge by the State.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to support United States membership in a general system of international cooperation such as that proposed at the Dumbarton Oaks conference, having police power to maintain the peace of the world.
- Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

- Art. 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$703.11 for Town Road Aid, the State to contribute \$2,812.43; this money to be used to improve Class V roads.
- Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to purchase a truck and snow plow for the use of the town, and raise and appropriate money for this purpose.
- Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to be used for the purpose of laying new sewer lines on the Springfield Road beginning near Cheshire Bridge and running southerly on said road a distance of about twenty-five hundred feet, and from said road to the Connecticut river. (inserted by request).
- Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to purchase the Grange piano, that is now in the upper town hall. (inserted by request).
- Art. 27. To see if the town will vote to place the toilets in the basement of the town hall, and raise and appropriate money for the purpose. (inserted by request).
- Art. 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not to exceed \$650.00 for the purpose of installing showers in the basement of the town hall. (inserted by request).
- Art. 29. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to see what arrangements they can make for the collection of garbage in Charlestown village, this service to be paid for by the parties served. (inserted by request).
- Art. 30. To see if the town will vote to make a re-appraisal of the real estate in the town, and raise and appropriate money for the purpose. (inserted by request).
- Art. 31. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to install a new cement floor in the fire station. (inserted by request).
- Art. 32. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The new State regulations, of requiring the closing of all accounts December 31, leaves the collections for the fourth quarter of 1944 to appear in next year's report. Although receipts are some more than they were ten or fifteen years ago, the replacements in the system, and numerous repairs, with an increase in the wages of help, make for a lesser profit in this department. There are also some connections that are not paying a proper rental, due to various reasons, one of which is because new fixtures have been added, and a report of the same was not made to the Superintendent.

The Water Commission would be appreciative, if all takers would look over their equipment, and make a report to Mr. Hoffman, and ascertain if they are paying a proper water tax. No one will be over charged, and the privilege of the water as provided to residents of this community, should be so thoroughly appreciated that we all ought to consider it a pleasure to help maintain the system, by supporting it financially, according to the benefits that are derived from it's use.

Forty years ago, water for the community was supplied in various ways. A few residents had very good springs in the hill east of the village, from which they were supplied. Others had dug wells, and many others had so called driven wells.

In the beginning, no pipe line existed in the Snumshire section nor north of the village toward Springfield. The Hall's Pond enterprise will store a lot more water. It is really an excellent source of storage. Some more cement work is needed to complete repair on the original stone dam, as water seeps through it somewhat.

There is also some more clearing of trees and brush wood around the pond to be done, but good progress has been made in this respect.

Ultimately more land adjacent to the reservoirs will be

purchased to make pasture wash less objectionable. It would seem not inconsistent for owners of property in the water shed to take all possible precautions to avoid this situation. No ill results have ever occured as a result of the proximity of farms. However the State Board of Health have in times past annoyed us about a few of these situations.

### Health Officer's Report

With the exception of a few cases of measles, chicken-pox and whooping-cough we have had no contagious diseases reported during the past year.

Samples of water from both the village supply and North Charlestown have been sent to the State Board of Health on an average of once a month for analysis and the reports have been about the same as during the past three years.

Milk samples have also been submitted from local producers and dealers and the tests have been very satisfactory.

#### ANOTHER ENEMY TO CONQUER

Here is a home front fight that everyone can get into. Last year in this State 558 brush and forest fires burned over 4,648 acres of land, of which 2,738 acres were valuable timber and young growth. With available manpower the lowest of any year since the war started, you can help to keep this loss down by preventing these fires from starting.

#### Keep in mind these simple rules;

- 1. Always get a permit from your forest fire warden before starting any fires in the open. Burning under certain conditions is permitted.
- 2. Never burn unless you have enough help to control your fire—a permit does not excuse you of negligence in case it gets away.
- 3. Always report any uncontrolled fire promptly to your forest fire warden. Minutes lost are acres lost.
- 4. Be especially careful with cigarettes, matches and pipes. Smokers caused most of our fires.
- 5. Never leave a fire unless it is dead out. You can't feel safe while there is a spark left.

# SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the School Board of Charlestown:

I herewith submit my annual report for the fifteenth year as your Superintendent of Schools.

The faculty for 1943-44 consisted of sixteen full time teachers and three part time teachers. This year we have fourteen full time teachers and one part time teacher. Some of the rooms are a little crowded, but if the distribution remains fairly even we can get along as far as the grades are concerned. The State has given the high school conditional approval for this year. The high school certainly needs more room and it would be economy to have one more grade room at the village.

We have been fortunate in having six able teachers from last year's force and one hired back from a former faculty. There are: Headmaster Lee W. Thomas, Miss Hortense Levesque, and Mrs. Thelma Hause in the high school and Miss Susie Benway, Miss Alice Palmer, Mrs. Olive Whitney and Miss Pearl Loiselle in the grades. Five able experienced teachers have been added to the force this vear: Miss Elizabeth Williams, English and mathematics in the high school, Mrs. Grace S. Kerr, commerce in high school, Mrs. Viola Horton, upper grades at Farwell School, Mrs. Jane Dahms, lower grades at Farwell School and Miss Regis Massucco, third gradeat Village. Three new teachers have been hired: Mr. Dwight Ainger, music in the high school and seventh and eighth grade, Miss Mary White, fourth grade Village and Mr. John Lyon, cabinet work. Both Mr. Ainger and Mr. Lyon are doing excellent work. Miss White has initiative. Her children seem to learn well, but that grade is hard to discipline and was last year. It has also been impossible to divide the classes in cabinet work evenly. This leaves one of the periods too crowded for good work. It has also been very hard to get material and repairs for machines. Miss White did an exceptionally good piece of work in playground activities during the fall.

Mrs. Z. L. Hasham continues her excellent work in looking after the health of the children. The Domestic Arts department will serve hot lunches at five cents a day to the children. In this work, considerable help is given by the members of the Mothers' Club. Two members each day help to prepare and serve the lunches. Several parents help by sending in canned goods and vegetables for which we are very thankful. We expect to have a dental clinic again this year.

At the present writing the teacher problem looks worse than it did last year. The normal schools expect to graduate only eighteen teachers for the grades next year. The average absorption by the schools in New Hampshire are a little over a hundred. Many of the older teachers, especially those married with families are staying with us because they think it is their duty. Soon they will give up the work and there seems to be no one to take their place. These conditions are found in all the neighboring states. Locally, we have raised teachers' salaries, but if one was to study the financial report it will be discovered that the net salaries paid the teachers after taxes are paid are not very high.

Let me repeat one paragraph from the last report. "It would be a great help for equalization of the costs of education in this state if a law was passed providing up to \$1,500.00 for each district to help maintain the high school or to pay the tuitions and other expenses of high school pupils." It looks now as though the Legislature this winter would do something about the situation.

The crying needs in our schools at Charlestown are; to furnish good housing and grounds for the high school, and to pay a salary scale sufficient to keep our best teachers or to hire good new ones. The present high school

building is about the right size for the grades. Many citizens seem to feel that when the war is over families will leave Charlestown and we will no longer have need of more buildings, but State officials sense that with the return of our army and navy boys and girls there will be a lack of jobs for the teen-aged youth and that there will be a rush back to the public schools. This will doubtlessly increase our school population. In 1934 the total registration was 366. In 1944 it was 420. It will be larger this year.

The Odd Fellows' lower hall has been rented and fixed into a school room for the third grade. The chemistry room has been enlarged and a much needed bulk-head with good steps built at the high school building. Sixty-five new seats and desks have been bought to replace part of those that have become delapidated. We have need of many more, but will have to take our time in getting them, not only because of the expense but because they are hard to procure.

On the whole, even with the reduced faculty, our schools are in much better condition than they were last year. I am very thankful for the help given me by officials, teachers, parents and pupils.

# REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

Your school nurse is glad to report that better health, better personal hygiene and more interest in preventive and corrective dentistry was noted among the school children. There is a growing need for a broader and better distribution of dental care through our rural and urban schools. One hundred five pupils attended the dental clinics. Directed by Dr. Irving Crandall of Claremont at North Charlestown March 21, 22 and in Village schools by Dr. William Sturt of Claremont, April 10, 11, 12; May 15, 16, 1944. Acknowledgment is due friends and parents for their aid and interest and for the help and cooperation from all the teachers.

There is urgent need for more help from the parents in the control of communicable diseases. The prevention and control of contagious diseases lies squarly on the shoulders of the parents. Teachers and nurses can only guide parents in the care and health of the children.

The terrfic epidemic of mumps had its beginning during the summer vacation which made it impossible to control at the opening of schools in September. Results were, the disease has swept through the student body attacking practically every pupil from I-XII grades who had not before had the disease.
