

# TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham, New Hampshire in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said Chatham on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to allow 2% discount on all property taxes paid before July first.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to raise the town officers' salaries and how much.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to distribute blank inventories at the time they appraise property to be taxed.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise money to insure the town house and schoolhouses it will take \$25.00 on a thousand.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$19.00 for the White Mountains Region Association.
- 8. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.
