THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Columbia, in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday the 9th day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk for the year ensuing.
- 2. To choose by ballot and major vote one Selectman for three years next ensuing.
- 3. To choose by ballot and major vote one or more Auditors for the year next ensuing.
- 4. To choose by ballot and major vote, Library Trustees for the year next ensuing.
- 5. To choose by ballot and major vote, a Trustee of Trust Funds for three years ensuing.
- 6. To choose by ballot and major vote all other necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Poor for the year ensuing.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of Highways.

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct its Selectmen to take such action, regarding rolling, plowing or otherwise, in keeping open winter roads in said town for the year ensuing, as in their judgment seems most conducive to the best interest of the Town, and appropriate money for the same.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will appropriate if any, for the purpose of opening up so-called, "Spring Roads."
- 11. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of the Class II road known as Jackson road and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$814.50; or will accept state aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose for said purpose the sum of \$359.19.
- 12. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the upkeep of the cemetery.
- 13. To see what action the Town will take with reference to hiring the Colebrook Fire Department, for the purpose of extinguishing of fires, in said town, and in event of favorable action, to make the necessary appropriation for the same.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to fix the price per day for the hiring of manual labor, teams, and trucks for work on Town Roads.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur the debts for temporary loans in anticipation of the taxes of the ensuing municipal year and to pay such debts out of the tax money when it is received.
- 16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate

- acquired by the town through Tax Collector's Deeds.
- 17. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support and upkeep of Library.
- 18. To raise such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a cer-19. tain portion of the old highway, in said Town. commencing at the Westerly end of "Jordan Hill Road," so known, where it intersects the highway at or near the residence of the Ernest Sims place, so-called, thence running in a southerly direction and parallel with the New Daniel Webster highway until it intersects said Daniel Webster highway on its easterly limits; also another certain portion of said old highway southerly of the first described road and on the Easterly side of said Daniel Webster Highway and running parallel therewith; also all that portion of said old highway located on the Westerly side of the aforesaid mentioned Daniel Webster Highway between the residence of John Harding and the barn on the premises of Jeannette Holbrook.
- 20. To vote upon the following resolution adopted by the General Court: "Is it expedient to revise the Constitution?"
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, Selectmen, and all other officers, and ratify and confirm the same.
- 22. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.
