REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Deering, N. H.:

The report of the Superintendent of Schools, for the year 1925-6 is hereby respectfully submitted:—

Although the year was started with teachers, all of whom had previously taught in our town, yet they were not located just as they were last year.

Due to illness in her family Mrs. Fisher was obliged to resign, Mrs. Abbie Fisher kindly agreed to take the school until such time as we could find a regular teacher, and remained until Miss Barbara Cummings, a Keene Normal student, came to finish out the year.

The pay of the teachers was again slightly increased from \$648 to \$684 per year; but when we learn that 442 of the state's 659 rural teachers received more than \$750, and that 51 of them received \$1000 or more, we realize we are still paying them a low salary. Only 10 elementary teachers in the State receive less than we pay our teachers.

Pleasing graduation exercises were held in the Town Hall, followed by a social hour. These were the third annual graduation exercises.

School visits from the school board numbered 20, from the Sup't 95, and from others 183, which in each case is an increase over the number recorded for any other year. This speaks well for a growing interest in our schools. The school board especially greatly increased its number of visits, from 9 last year to 20 this year.

Repetition is not always desirable, but we hope each parent may read again what was said on the subject of tardiness in last year's report. Although pupils, teachers and parents are responsible in this matter, yet parents have the greater influence, and we are glad to note cases in which they have shown a realization of this responsibility. The Pond School with an enrollment of 8 reportcl only one case of tardiness for the whole year, while the East School with only one more pupil reported 43 cases of tardiness. Attention to this matter does improve conditions, and at the writing of this report the East School has an almost perfect record of attendance.
