# State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the town of Gorham in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Municipal Hall on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To elect one selectman for three years, and to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To see what action the town will take on the proposed Zoning Ordinance.
- Article 3. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- Article 4. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for winter roads.
- Article 5. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for water and sewer maintenance.
- Article 6. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
- Article 7. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for police for the ensuing year.
- Article 8. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Library.
- Article 9. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the District Nursing Association.
- Article 10. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Gorham and Cascade Skating Rinks.
- Article 11. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks and Playgrounds.
- Article 12. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the American Legion Memorial Day.

- Article 13. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the necessary repairs at the American Legion Hall.
- Article 14. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Public Dumping Ground.
- Article 15. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges.
- Article 16. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking the inventory.
- Article 17. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, when such debts are incurred and expressly made payable therefrom by such vote. And to see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to apply to the Governor and Council for assistance in financing the needs of the town, as previously provided by Chapter 63 of the laws of 1933, or any amendment made thereto.
- Article 18. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Cemeteries.
- Article 19. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Band Concerts.
- Article 20. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Advertising.
- Article 21. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate to complete the Water Survey.
- Article 22. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Municipal Water Bonds.
- Article 23. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of Land Bonds.
- Article 24. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the retirement of the Water Supply Bonds (Ice Gulch and Gorham Hill), and the Equipment Bonds (Town Truck and Sidewalk Tractor).
- Article 25. To see what sum the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the water works on Gorham Hill.

Article 26. To see what action the town will take on the following proposed ordinance: "It shall be lawful on Sunday to conduct and operate the business of bowling and to charge therefor; but not earlier than two o'clock in the afternoon and not later than six o'clock in the afternoon; and only between the dates of November 1st and May 1st. Such bowling may be carried on only in such places as have the approval of the selectmen."

Article 27. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell any property bought by the town at tax sales.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for a State Audit.

Article 29. To hear the reports of town officers, agents, committee heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

# Zoning Ordinance

In order to preserve and improve the beauty and attractiveness of Gorham and make it a more desirable community for its residents and visitors, in order to safeguard the health and welfare of its residents and to provide for a planned and orderly growth in the future, Gorham is divided into the following zones, shown on a map, filed in the office of the Selectmen, signed by the Zoning Committee, and made a part of this ordinance.

- 1. Residential Districts
- 2. Commercial Districts
- 3. Industrial Districts
- 4. Agricultural Districts

#### Zone I-Residential Districts

In Zone I no building shall be erected, altered or used and no premises shall be used for any purpose except:

- A. Single or multi-family dwellings, hotels or tourist cabins.
- B. Church, library or school.
- C. Highway, historic, park or regulatory signs of the State or Municipality, including "Welcome" signs.
- D. Accessory uses (including the taking of boarders or lodgers) customarily incident to any of the above uses. "Accessory Uses" shall not include:
- 1. Any use, in the opinion of the Board of Adjustment, injurious, noxious or offensive to the neighborhood.
- 2. Garage space intended for public or commercial use beyond the space usually associated with a single or multi-family dwelling.
  - 3. Signs, except the following:

Signs pertaining to the sale or lease of the lot or dwelling on which placed, professional signs or signs for business properly carried on in a residence, such signs not to exceed a total area of six square feet.

Nothing herein is to be interpreted as permitting funeral homes, stores, shops or public display of goods or wares in this zone.

#### Zone II-Commercial Districts

In Zone II no building shall be erected or altered and no premises shall be used for any purpose except:

- A. As permitted in Zone I.
- B. For offices, retail stores, banks, filling stations, garages, places of amusement or assembly and any other retail business or service not involving manufacture on the premises, except such manufacture as does not involve, on the average, more than five operatives. No manufacturing or use will be allowed that is injurious, noxious or offensive in the opinion of the Board of Adjustment.
- C. For one or more signs pertaining to the lease, sale or use of the premises on which placed.

#### Zone III-Industrial Districts

In Zone III no building shall be erected or altered, and no premises shall be used except:

- A. As permitted in Zones I and II.
- B. For manufacturing, except any trade, industry or use that is injurious, noxious or offensive in the opinion of the Board of Adjustment.

#### Zone IV-Agricultural Districts

Only those uses allowed in Zones I to III inclusive and in addition such uses as are customarily incident to the pursuit of agriculture will be permitted in Zone IV.

#### Area Regulations

On land which is not divided into house lots at the time of the passage of this ordinance no residence shall be erected on a lot less than 5,000 square feet in area, or less than 50 feet in width at the street front and no building shall be erected on a lot nearer than 10 feet from the nearest building and in no case nearer than five feet from the side and rear lot line; also no building shall be erected within 20 feet from the street line. Proximity clause shall not apply to buildings on the same lot.

#### Non-Conforming Uses

Any lawful building or use of a building or premises or part thereof at the time of the passage of this ordinance or any amendment thereof may be continued although such use does not conform to the provisions thereof or of such amendment. Where non-conforming use has been abandoned for at least one year, subsequent use must conform to the terms of this ordinance.

#### Reconstruction of Buildings

Any structure destroyed by fire, explosion, flood, storm, or other act of God may be rebuilt or reconstructed within one year of its destruction.

#### **Building Permits**

Before the construction of any new building is started, or before any structural alteration or addition costing more than \$500 to an existing building is undertaken or before any building is moved from one location to another, the plans for the same must be submitted to the Board of Selectmen, who, if the plans conform to this ordinance, will issue a permit for the same.

When an objection to a proposed structure as above indicated, is raised by a majority of the families residing within a radius of 500 feet of the property in question, the Board of Adjustment shall hold a public hearing to receive evidence on both sides and shall have the authority to decide whether the permit shall be issued or not.

#### Board of Adjustment

Within twenty days after the passage of this ordinance, and thereafter as terms expire or vacancies occur, the Moderator, with the approval of the Board of Selectmen, shall appoint the Board of Adjustment, consisting of five members, owners of property in Gorham whose property is so located as to be representative of all sections of the town.

The terms of service, duties, etc., of the Board of Adjustment shall be as outlined in Public Laws, Chapter 42, Sections 48-68.

#### Penalty and Remedy for Violations

Whoever violates any provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of five dollars a day for each day of such violation. It shall be the duty of the Selectmen to enforce this ordinance and to take appropriate steps to correct any violations of this ordinance in accordance with Public Laws, Chapter 42, Section 67.

#### When Effective

This ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.

# Area Descriptions to Accompany ZONING ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF GORHAM, N. H.

#### Zone I-Residential Districts

All of the "Island."

All of that area within the following bounds: Beginning at Main Street and Peabody River, thence west to Glen Street, south on Glen Street to the Grand Trunk Railroad, thence east along the railroad right-of-way to the Old Morse Ice House Property, thence south to Washington Street, along Washington Street to the Island bridge, thence north along the Peabody River to the point of beginning.

A strip 100 feet deep along the south side of Washington Street from Mill Street to Peabody River.

A strip 100 feet deep along each side of Glen Street from the south line of the property now occupied by the Mt. Hayes Filling station to that property locally known as the Beaudette property, except the holdings of the Canadian National Railroad.

A strip 100 feet deep on both sides of Promenade Street from the east line of the Fancy property to Church Street and both sides of Wilson Street.

All land between Promenade and Wilson Streets.

A strip 100 feet deep on both sides of Church Street and Church Street Extension.

All land within the block bounded by Church, Main, School and Railroad Streets.

A strip 100 feet deep along the north side of Railroad Street from School Street to within 100 feet of Exchange Street.

A strip 100 feet deep along east side of School Street from 100 feet south of Main Street to Railroad Street.

A strip 100 feet deep along the west side of Park Street from the Town Building to the Phipps property.

A strip 100 feet deep along north side of Main Street from Peabody River to Woodland Park Road, thence along Woodland Park Road to Twin State Gas & Electric Company property.

All property between Main Street and Androscoggin River from Woodland Park Road to Boston & Maine Railroad bridge except the following described areas, which are considered to be commercial areas:

Strips 100 feet deep along Main Street between west line of the H. Wm. Johnson property and the east line of the Universalist Church property, and between the east line of the Phil Stuart property to Madison Avenue. (End of Exceptions.)

A strip 100 feet deep on south side of Main Street from west

line of Colonial Restaurant property to east line of Tanguay property.

A strip 165 feet deep on south side of Main Street from west line of Tanguay property to Union Street. (Lots here are 165 feet deep.)

All land between Grand Trunk Railroad and Main Street from Union Street to Boston & Maine bridge, except those properties known as the Wamboldt, Pellerin and Osgood properties at the junction of the Lancaster Road and Main Street.

#### Cascade Section

All land lying between Tinker Brook and Main Street from Tinker Brook to Berlin Road, except a strip 100 feet deep along Main Street from a point midway between the ends of River Road loop to Berlin Road.

All land between Main Street and Androscoggin River from Tinker Brook to northern end of River Street loop except a strip 100 feet deep along Main Street between the two ends of River Street loop.

All land west of Grand Trunk Railroad and south of Cascade Street to 100 feet south of Second Avenue.

All land between Grand Trunk Railroad and Berlin Road from Cascade Street to Gorham-Berlin Town Line.

#### Zone II-Commercial Districts

#### Cascade Section

A strip 100 feet deep along the north side of Main Street from a point directly opposite the middle of the un-named street running through the center of the block formed by River Road loop to the Berlin Road.

A strip 100 feet deep along the south side of Main Street between the two ends of River Road loop.

#### Gorham Section

A strip 100 feet deep along the north side of Main Street from Madison Avenue to the east line of the Phil Stuart property.

Those properties known as the Wamboldt, Pellerin and Osgood properties at the junction of the Lancaster Road and Main Street.

A strip 100 feet deep along the north side of Main Street from the east line of the Universalist Church property to the west line of the H. Wm. Johnson property.

A strip 100 feet deep along the south side of Main Street from School Street to Park Street.

A strip 100 feet deep along both sides of Exchange Street.

A strip 100 feet deep along north side of Railroad Street from Exchange Street to Park Street.

A strip 100 feet deep along the south side of Washington Street from Glen Street to Mill Street.

That area within the following bounds: Beginning at Glen Street and the Grand Trunk Railroad thence east along the railroad right-of-way to the old Morse Ice House property, thence south to Washington Street and along Washington Street to the point of beginning.

#### Zone III-Industrial Districts

All land now occupied by Brown Company Mill in Cascade section of Gorham.

That area between the Glen Road and Peabody River from Washington Street to 200 feet south of the Mill Pond except those areas within these bounds previously described as Residential and Commercial Areas.

All Grand Trunk, or Canadian National Railroad, holdings.

#### Zone IV-Agricultural Districts

All areas not listed above are considered to be in the Agricultural Area.

A petition for State Audit was presented with the required signatures, estimate cost \$125 and we recommend this amount be appropriated and raised for the purpose.

A petition for Band Concerts was presented and we recommend the sum of \$480 be appropriated and raised for same.

It is estimated it will take \$1,100 to finish the Water Survey and we have recommended this amount be appropriated and raised.

In order to complete the Gorham Hill Water project it is estimated it will take \$7,500. As the unexpended balance from last year will not be available this year we recommend the \$7,500 be appropriated and raised for the completion of this project.

We recommend the amount of \$1,700 be appropriated and raised for Parks and Playgrounds to be used as follows:

\$1,000 for Common; \$200 for Peabody Park; \$500 for Athletics.

The receipts of the Town as shown by the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer were checked as to source and amount: all money received by the Town Treasurer was deposited in either the White Mountain National Bank, or the Berlin City National Bank.

The disbursements of the Town as shown by the books of the Selectmen and Town Treasurer were checked with the vouchers and checks drawn; all checks drawn were signed by at least two of the Selectmen and countersigned by the Town Treasurer. Department payrolls were signed by the employees, or their recognized agents. Payrolls and bills were attached to vouchers.
