# Report of School Board

---

FELLOW CITIZENS:

We believe that our schools for the year have been for the most part successful and profitable. Some of our teachers who have been well qualified in every other respect for first-class teachers, have lacked greatly in discipline, and that we think is a serious fault. It is useless for a teacher to think she will gain the good will or respect of a scholar by allowing them to do pretty much as they please. Scholars cannot advance much unless there is order and discipline in school. Reasonable but rigid laws should be laid before the school at the commencement of each term, and then they should be strictly adhered to. The result will be a quiet and orderly school, the teacher will command the respect and love of the pupils, and they will learn.

We are glad to note that in some districts the parents as well as teachers and scholars have cooperated for best results; this is worthy of commendation. If parents wish their children to have an education, they should see to it that they are in school *every day* if they are able to be there. And they have no right to keep them out to work or for any dislike that they may have for the teacher. It is robbing the child of its legal rights at a time in life when they cannot act for themselves, and is no better than stealing. Many people do not seem to realize this.

We do the best we can to secure good teachers. We expect all the parents to help us in every way they can to have good schools.

We would recommend that the district help repair the schoolhouse in the Union district providing the town of Dorchester will give us a deed of one-half of the schoolhouse and pay one-half of the expense of repairing.
