#### WARRANT FOR THE ANNUAL MEETING

#### March 11, 1941

#### State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet in the Town Hall in said Town on the Second Tuesday of March next at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

First—To see of the Town will vote to accept the report of the Budget Committee and vote to adopt their recommendations as printed.

**Second**—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

**Third**—To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division.

**Fourth**—To see if the Town will vote to discontinue such portions of the Dartmouth College Road between West Lebanon Village and the Hanover Line as are no longer required for Highway purposes.

Fifth—On a petition of ten or more legal voters to see if the Town will vote to lay a sewer from the westerly end of the Mascoma Street Extension sewer up Peabody Street, to the house lot of Fred Dunham, a distance of about four hundred (400) feet, and to appropriate the money therefor.

Sixth—To choose a Selectman for the ensuing three years.

**Seventh**—To choose a Town Clerk, a Tax Collector, Overseer of the Poor Agent, Treasurer, a Highway Agent, and a Chief of Police for the ensuing year.

Eighth—To choose three Library Trustees for the ensuing three years.

Ninth—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.

Tenth—To choose four members to act on the Budget Committee for the ensuing three years.

**Eleventh**—To transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

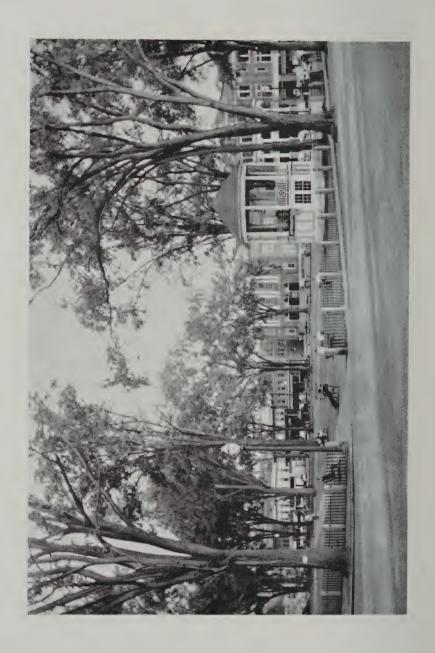

To the Board of Selectmen Lebanon, New Hampshire

Gentlemen:

Pursuant to your request, we have audited the accounts and records of the Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector and the Trustees of Trust Funds for the period of one year from February 1, 1940, to January 31, 1941. Submitted herewith is our report in the form of Exhibits together with the usual Certificate of Audit for the period under review.

#### Scope of Audit

The audit and examination consisted of a complete verification of accounts and supporting vouchers for all recorded assets and liabilities together with revenue and expenditures for the period under review. The accounting system and procedure follow the double entry system of accounting, operating strictly on a cash basis and based on a revised classification of accounts which provides better control. This was evidenced by the accuracy found throughout the accounts and records which were examined. All accounts were in agreement with the General Ledger and required but minor adjustments as a result of the audit and examination.

#### Selectmen's Records

The records of cash received and disbursements ordered by the Selectmen were found in excellent order and in complete agreement with supporting vouchers and checks together with the accounts in the General Ledger. We found considerably added volume due to the requirements of payroll disbursements by individual vouchers and check in place of the method heretofore in use. Regardless of the added activity, we found careful classification and consistent interpretation of all recorded transactions. It was noted that certain vouchers and checks drawn for Town Officers' Salary were made payable to parties other than the Officials. All vouchers and checks in the future should be drawn only to the order of the party to whom the payment is due.

#### Tax Collector

All collections made by the Tax Collector and remitted to the Town Treasurer were verified by reconciliation and comparison with the Tax Warrants and uncollected balances therein, consideration being given to added taxes, abatements and other affecting entries. Uncollected taxes were listed and found to be in agreement with the control accounts in the General Ledger, Unpaid property and poll taxes are in process of further verification by direct correspondence with the individual taxpayers. Returns from this verification are directed to the office of the State Tax Commission in Concord, New Hampshire. Improvement has been noted in the accounting for Taxes Bought by the Town and Property Deeded to the Town. We believe, however, that further improvement can be made by additional cooperative study of this difficult problem by the Tax Collector and the State Tax Commission staff.

It is again suggested that more adequate protection be given the Tax Collector in the matter of office arrangement and equipment.

#### Town Clerk

All permits and licenses issued by the Town Clerk were accounted for numerically and proved in agreement with remittances to the Town Treasurer and the

corresponding Selectmen's records.

Surety bonds were produced and examined. We found that the Town Treasurer, Town Clerk and Tax Collector are bonded as shown by Exhibit L in our report. A surety bond should also be provided for the Trustees of Trust Funds as required by Chapter 42, Sec. 27, New Hampshire Public Laws.

#### Town Treasurer

The Treasurer's records of Cash Received and Cash Disbursed were found in agreement with the reported receipts from all sources and orders issued for disbursements. Cancelled checks were examined and compared with supporting vouchers and the balance verified by statement from the depository.

#### Trust Funds

All Trust Funds were compared from the records with corresponding bank books, and the activity therein was found properly supported by receipts and vouchers

for payments. The Library and Cemetery accounts, together with related accounts showing the final disposition of Income, were examined and found in good order with supporting vouchers and checks. The result of our examination of such accounts is reflected by Exhibits B-2, 3 and 4, and Exhibits K-1 to 4, inclusive.

#### The Balance Sheet

We submit herein a Comparative Balance Sheet as of January 31, 1940, and January 31, 1941, Exhibit A, and also a Comparative Balance Sheet in Condensed Form for the period of ten years ending January 31, 1941, Exhibit G. The substantial reduction of the Town's Net Debt each year throughout this period indicates careful planling and sound financial management by the Town Officials in charge.

Exhibit D analyzes the reconciliation of the Net Debt between the end of the year, January 31, 1940, and the end of the present period, January 31, 1941. The net increase in the Debt during the present fiscal year is more than totally accounted for by a non-recurring item appearing in Sewer Maintenance, the cause of which is evidently commonly known, and the result of which is admittedly well worth the added expenditure. It may be said in passing that such reconciliation as is submitted herewith is in effect a profit and loss statement and properly reflects the operations during the period covered.

#### General Comments

Considerable improvement has been noted in the accounting method and procedure as revised. It is now simpler of operation and more productive of complete and accurate information. The cooperation of all town officials is very much appreciated. Our audit and examination this year has engaged the time of two men for a period of two weeks. We offer our sincere thanks to all Town officials and their staffs who have given us their time and assistance during the progress of the audit.

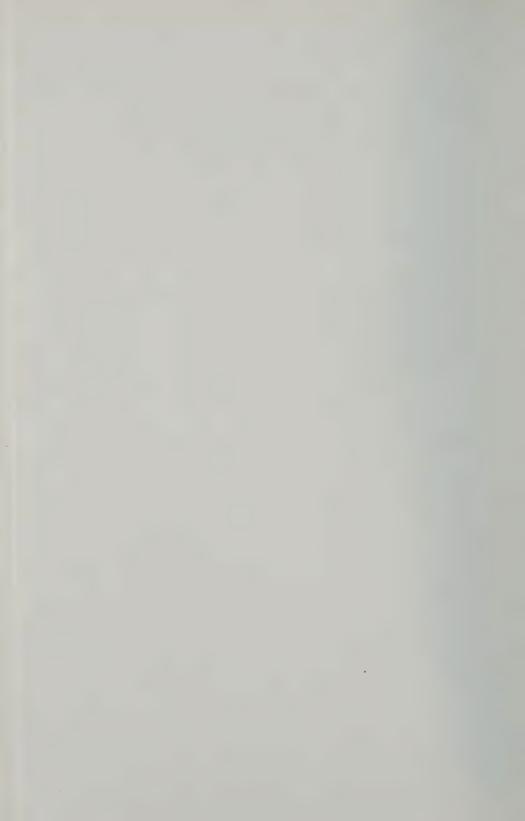

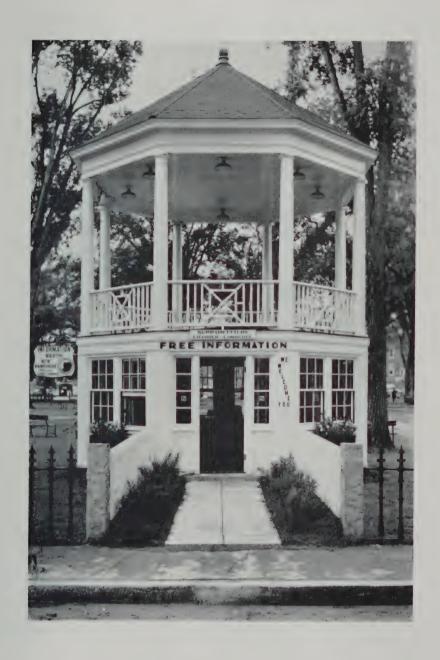

#### HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

Again we can claim that Lebanon is on the list of healthy Towns in New Hampshire, for we have had fewer cases of contagious diseases reported, than last year and no deaths from any of these reported.

Our local Doctors have reported the following cases: 25 Chicken Pox, 3 German Measles, 18 Whooping Cough, 8 Lober Pneumonia, 1 Bronchial Pneumonia, 2 Undulent Fever, 4 Scarlet Fever, 1 Measles, and 6 cases of Venereal diseases.

During the year there have been 12 Well Child Health Conferences, 219 children examined by the local Doctors, 29 children have been given the treatment for the prevention of Diphtheria. These Clinics are held under the supervision of the State Board of Health by Miss Elizabeth Carriel, State Board of Health Nurse in Sullivan and Grafton Counties, assisted by the local Nurse, Doctors and ladies from local clubs and fraternal orders.

The question of the disposal of waste and garbage is still serious. Dumps of all sizes and conditions have been reported, and in every case, have been investigated and Notices Posted, and in some cases the second time. There seems to be a disposition of people in general, to dispose of their rubbish, in the easiest way possible regardless of the place and without regard to the looks, beside our highways or the surrounding country.

At this time I wish to thank the School Nurse, the Doctors and all who have in any way assisted me in my duties as your Health Officer.

#### REPORT OF RELIEF DEPARTMENT

For the year from Jan. 1, 1940 to Dec. 31, 1940 orders were made in the Local Relief Office for Town Direct Relief cases and Town Boarding Adults to the amount of \$14,734.48.

Town orders for Administration amounted to \$1,-514.18. This does not include the Overseer's salary.

County orders for the year for Lebanon's County Direct Relief and extras on County Boarding Adults was \$33,030.17. Board and Care of County Boarding Adults and Children is paid directly through the County Office.

During the year six cases with seventeen persons were transferred from Town to County according to law. Three Town Relief persons were granted Old Age Assistance.

Over the same period five County Relief persons were given Old Age Assistance and one inactive County Case of four persons, after having been self supporting for five years, again, because of sickness, required aid and was reopened as a Town Case.

During the calendar year of 1940 a monthly average of 161 Town persons and 425 County persons received aid through the Local Department. For various lengths of time a total of 1041 different people received relief.

As reported in former years, all wood and small lots of clothing (purchased at bargain prices) are bought by the Town. These are carried in this office as separate accounts and only as actual deliveries are made to either Town or County Cases, do they become Direct Relief charges.

#### REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

The U.S. Forest Service has reduced the fire hazard caused by the hurricane, but there are still many locations in Lebanon that are very dangerous should a fire get started and out of control.

It is therefore necessary that everyone take precautions when in the woods or driving along our highways and be careful about smoking or throwing away cigarette stubs or matches.

Do not attempt to start a fire without a permit from the Warden. Farmers wishing a permit to burn brush will be granted one providing conditions are right and they have help enough to keep the fire under control.

There is a severe penalty for starting a fire without a permit.

Thanking the public in general for their splendid cooperation and the Deputy Wardens of Lebanon, members of the Lebanon Fire Department and volunteers for their very efficient work, I am

#### REPORT OF MILK INSPECTOR

Our milk supply at present is much safer than heretofore in that a large amount is being Pasteurized and the cattle in a great many cases are being Bang tested removing the danger of Undulant fever to a great extent.

We have some bills governing milk coming up in the House this year that if passed will be a great benefit to the general health of the public.

A report of the general conditions of the milk supply as to Bacteria Count, B. Coli, sediment, etc., has been furnished your budget committee from time to time during the past year, showing in most cases a very good grade of milk, some of the Pasteurized milk has not been satisfactory but the conditions have been remedied.

We have two cases of Undulant fever in town at present that I know of.

I have carried out the method of inspection that we adopted several years ago, namely collecting samples from each producer for analysis, the inspecting of milk rooms, stables, etc. We have at present between sixty and seventy herds supplying milk to our town.
