THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lyman, in the county of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Lyman Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the 10th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Old Home Week.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the observance of Memorial Day.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the Lisbon District Nursing Association.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid on its highways and raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the necessary sums for State Aid maintenance on its State highways.

- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the laying out, construction and repairing of highways and bridges.
- 9. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.
- 10. To choose agents or committees to any arcticles in this warrant.
- 11. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before said meeting.
