

TOWN WARRANT

TO THE INHABITANTS of the Town of Nelson, in the County of Cheshire, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs: YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED to meet in the Town Hall in said Nelson on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, at 3:00p.m. of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following articles:

POLLS will be open from 3:00p.m. and close at 8:00p.m.

BUSINESS MEETING to start at 7:00p.m.

ARTICLES OF A GENERAL NATURE

1. To choose necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,210.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing.
3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1984.
4. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof.
5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept gifts and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and grant them power to expend such funds.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the support of the Town Library.
7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$766.50 as the Town's share of the operating costs of the Home Health Care and Community Services.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$328.50 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service.
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$438.00 as the Town's share for the Southwest Region Planning Commission.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,460.00 to develop a passive recreation area on the so-called Quigley Lot next to the Town Hall and further to authorize the

Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend a 50 percent matching grant from the Land and Water Conservation Fund of the U.S. Department of the Interior to defray the expenses of said project. In the event that the said Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant is not awarded to the Town, the Selectmen shall have the authority to expend \$1,230.00 for said project.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Old Schoolhouse or Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Grand Mondanock Arts Council, or take any other action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of a summer day camp sponsored by the Cheshire County YMCA.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$7,500.00 from the Town Hall Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund. This money to be used for construction of a leach field, and reconstruction of the Restroom Facilities for the Town Hall.

15. To see if the Town of Nelson shall call upon the Governor and Executive Council, its State Representative(s) and State Senator to promptly convene a Special Session of the Legislature for the sole purpose of preventing the imposition of huge cost increases in electric rates resulting from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant on the citizens, businesses, schools and agencies in the Town of Nelson, and to direct the Selectmen to promptly notify our above listed elected officials of the Town's desire. (By Petition).

16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for expenses that will be incurred in acquisition of Rye Pond property if such property is given for the purpose of creating a Conservation Park and 50/50 matching federal Land and Water Conservation Funds are granted for said project.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 which sum is to be paid to the City of Keene for the use of its Landfill.

18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Memorial Day purposes.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the proper expenses and member reimbursement of the Fire Department and rescue Squad.
20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, it being understood that Townspeople will still be charged for individual calls.
21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department.
22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for the purchase of two self-contained breathing apparatus.
23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000.00 for the purchase and outfitting of a vehicle for the Police Department.
24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,800.00 for the proper expenses of the Police Department.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for wages in the maintenance of the roads and bridges.
26. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$42,524.00 for General Highway expenses--gas, repairs and supplies.
27. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to receive and appropriate the monies from the state Highway Block Grant. These monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance.
28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action relating thereto.

29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee.

30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 for the purchase of 2 acres of land located on the southeast side of the present Town Barn being a portion of the former Elliot Priest property.

31. To see if the Town will vote to exchange .03 + acres owned by the Town next to John Bradshaw's garage on Old Stoddard Road for .03 + acres owned by John Bradshaw behind the present Highway Barn, with John Bradshaw paying all transfer fees.

32. To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as they may legally be brought before the meeting.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

This past year brought us an alignment and, therefore, great improvement to the front steps. This was made possible by an interested party and we wish to thank her for making this possible.

We were also given, in the name of Mrs. Rodger Tolman, retired Trustee, a new PC 20 Canon copier by another interested party and the Friends of the Library group. This machine is indeed paying for itself and is in use often. It may be used by anyone during library hours at 10¢ per copy.

Four sixth graders from the Munsonville School came to the Library last Spring for Library course taught by the Librarian. The course lasted seven weeks and concluded with a trip to the Keene Junior High School Media Center.

Twenty-four young people took part in the Summer Reading Program entitled "Bigfoot". A Bigfoot Party was held in late August with Bigfoot cookies and punch. Michelle Teeter won the Bigfoot puzzle poster.

Books are no longer available from the Bookmobile Office as this closed in August and we were allowed to keep what books we had borrowed previously from the office. Adult non-fiction is still available from the State Library as always and any other requests, such as children's books and adult fiction, may be filled from area libraries.

Story Time is held every other Monday at 3:15 p.m. and an average of ten youngsters attend for stories and refreshments.

Books were taken to the Munsonville School every two weeks and my thanks to those who helped carry the books to the young people.

The Trustees met four times during the year.

Thirty-five books were obtained on Interlibrary loan.

Three hundred sixty-six books were catalogued during the year.

REPORT OF THE CEMETERY BOARD

One major project has been completed under the direction of our sexton, Mr. French. This involved clearing an area near the northwest part of the old cemetery large enough for, at least, four burial lots. Two people have already been allotted four lots in this space.

The town does not permit charging for burial lots in the old section of the cemetery so these people have donated \$300.00 to be added to the Cemetery Trust Funds for Perpetual Care.

The Cemetery Board recommends that the town appropriate \$1,800 for the cemetery expenses in 1984.

POLICE REPORT

1983 was a year of growth for the Nelson Police Department. We instituted a case log system so that all cases have a number which is assigned to them and are filed in their own folder, making them easy to be referenced by means of the case log book. We purchased a locking file cabinet and have moved from one of my rooms at my residence to our new office upstairs in the Old Brick Schoolhouse. This move gives us much needed space.

In compliance with the new RSA 105-A5, dealing with part time officers having to be certified, we hired Lee LaChance from the Marlborough Police Department. Lee's primary function is to handle daytime investigations. Lee brings with him much experience in this field and has been a great asset to the Department.

There has been some concern expressed that no patrolling was done anymore. The main reason for the lack of patrol is insurance. The town cannot insure a personal car being used for police work, thus our own insurance is the primary coverage. I feel that this is too great a financial risk for any individual to take while being employed by the town. For this reason, I am recommending that the town purchase a vehicle and insure it under the town insurance for the use of the Police Department.

I realize this is a big step, but financially I can see no alternatives. I strongly feel this is not an unreasonable request. We cannot expect the Police Department to do the job in their own family cars and take the chance of losing the use of their private vehicle or having the risk of their insurance cancelling due to the insurance policy doing what it was not intended to do.

In closing, I would like to thank the townspeople for their continuing support and the area police departments for continued assistance.

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND
STATE FOREST RANGER

Once again, our cooperative town and state forest fire prevention and control program leads the nation in least acres burned per forest fire. Less than $\frac{1}{2}$ acre per fire statewide average.

At the town level, your Forest Fire Warden is responsible for the prevention and control of all grass and woods fires when the ground is not snow covered.

Forest fire prevention is achieved at the town level by issuing a written permit for every fire that is to be kindled on the ground out of doors when the ground is not covered with snow. Each person wishing to have an outside fire must obtain this written permit from the town Fire Warden before kindling the fire. Any person that does not obtain a fire permit, when one is required, is violating our forest fire permit law and is subject to a court appearance and could be fined up to \$1,000 and receive a jail sentence of up to one year.

No fire permit will be issued between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. unless it is raining. The reason for this is twofold: the fire danger increases steadily between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., then subsides to a safe level between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. This happens because the sun dries out the fine fuels that are easily ignited and dries the air which permits rapid fire spread. Also during this part of the day fire fighters are not readily available in most communities so an escaped fire could burn longer and cause greater damage before being suppressed.

Your cooperation in burning only when conditions are safe is greatly appreciated.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

In the first week of April, 1983, a joint meeting on wetlands protection was held at the Harris Center for Environmental Education with Conservation Commissioners from Nelson, Hancock, Stoddard, Sullivan and Antrim. It was called by Andy Motter of Sullivan, and addressed by Marjorie Swope, President of the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions, and Bruce Howland of the Society for the Protection of New Hampshire Forests. Afterwards small groups addressed specific areas in which several towns have mutual interests. This format was successful and will be a precedent for future meetings.

NCC has held no public events this year, but recycling education in the Munsonville School was active under the leadership of Ann Ames and Mike Iselin.

Challenges for the coming year are serious and urgent. We seek volunteers and members who realize that clean water, soil and air start in their hometowns and require vigilance and protection. Nelson must carry out its role as a member of the Southwest Solid Waste Management District. Nelson's prime wetlands require formal designation. The protection of the unique Rye Pond area is a priority.

Town Meeting, March 8, 1983

Minutes of the Town Meeting of Nelson, New Hampshire

The checklist was handed over to the Town Clerk and was signed by the Clerk and the Supervisors of the Checklist.

The meeting was opened by Moderator John Bradshaw at 3:00 p.m. It was moved and seconded to suspend the reading of the entire warrant; the motion was passed. **ARTICLE ONE** was read, and the polls were declared open.

Sleet was rattling against the windows at 7:02 p.m. when Moderator Bradshaw gaveled the meeting to order. About 75 or 80 people were present. The meeting and voting went on simultaneously until the polls closed at 8:09 p.m.

ARTICLE TWO: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$40,975.00 to defray Town Charges for the year ensuing. It was moved and seconded that the article be accepted as read. Selectman Richard Lothrop amended the amount to \$39,975.00, explaining that the town's insurance policy premium was reduced by \$1,000. Carol Raynor asked about miscellaneous charges listed on page 11 of the 1982 Town Report. Mr. Lothrop explained that the items were lumped in with the general expenses of the town, but the dollar value was the same. All money appropriated in the warrant is put into a general fund. The amendment was passed. The article was adopted as amended by voice vote.

ARTICLE THREE: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow on the credit of the Town in anticipation of taxes for the year 1983. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FOUR: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at public auction, or by advertised sealed bid, to any proper buyer any and all parcels of property conveyed to the Town by the Tax Collector or other deeds and to execute, acknowledge, and deliver appropriate deeds thereof. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FIVE: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and to accept gifts and/or federal or state aid in the name of the Town of Nelson and grant them power to expend such funds. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE SIX: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to receive monies from the State under the Highway Grant, these monies to be used to supplement summer and winter road maintenance. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE SEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,300.00 for the support of the Town Library. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE EIGHT: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$438.00 as the Town's share of the operating cost of the Cheshire Health and Social Services. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE NINE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$219.00 as its fair share of the operating costs of the Monadnock Family and Mental Health Service. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$443.00 as the Town's share for the Southwest Regional Planning Commission. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. A brief discussion ensued during which Selectman Lothrop explained that the Town of Nelson gets help in solid waste planning, the benefits of a purchasing co-op, and planning board assistance from this organization. He added that the Town's cost for Articles eight, nine and ten is determined on a per capita basis. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE ELEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$3,000.00 from the Town Hall /Schoolhouse Capital Reserve fund. This money is to be used for the construction of removable-partitioned Town Offices in the upstairs of the Old Brick Schoolhouse. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman John Bunce explained that the plan would include insulating the ceiling and installing partitions to make a conference room and several small offices. The curved ceiling would not be altered. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWELVE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00, this sum to be held in the Town Hall/Schoolhouse Capital Reserve Fund for the renovation or remodeling of the Old Schoolhouse or Town Hall, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Grand Monadnock Arts Council, or take any other action relating thereto. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 as the Town's share of the operating costs of a summer day camp sponsored by the Cheshire County YMCA. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Kenneth Jeffery explained that the program is open to all town children for one week at the cost of \$9.00 per child (in addition to the money mentioned in this article). The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE FIFTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to go on record in support of immediate actions by the Federal Government to control and reduce acid rain, which is harmful to the environment and economy of Nelson, New Hampshire, and to the health and welfare of the people of Nelson, New Hampshire. These actions shall include: 1) reduce by at least half the major cause of acid rain -- sulfur dioxide emissions -- by the year 1990; 2) conclude negotiations and adopt a treaty with the government of Canada that will commit both nations to this same goal. The record of the vote on this article shall be transmitted to the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation and to the President of the United States. (By Petition). It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed unanimously by voice vote.

ARTICLE SIXTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with a Data Processing firm for maintenance of its fiscal or other Town records. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. One voter asked what this would cost. Selectmen Lothrop and Bunce explained that the cost would be about \$400, and would enable the town to take advantage of the services of the Southwest Region Planning Commission. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH SERVICE AND PROTECTION

ARTICLE SEVENTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 to support the Town's continued participation in the existing Regional Solid Waste Facility based in Keene, with it being understood that this vote includes the participation and support of a regional solution for handling solid waste either by agreeing to accept a landfill site in the Town, providing cover material from the Town, accepting an alternative operation in the Town, or agreeing to whatever other aspect of a regional solid waste operation that is sensible for serving the region so that a good, cooperative regional solution will be a commitment and a reality. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Lothrop explained that the sum mentioned in the article is what the City of Keene charges Nelson - - we sign a contract every year. The article passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE EIGHTEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Civil Defense purposes. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE NINETEEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the proper expenses and member reimbursement of the Fire Department and Rescue Squad. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 as a subsidy for ambulance service for the ensuing year, March 1983 to March 1984, it being understood that Townspeople will still be charged for individual calls. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Lothrop explained that the service includes ambulance service from Keene. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-ONE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the purchase of a new truck for the Fire Department, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from the fund except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Fire Department. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-TWO: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of two self-contained breathing apparatus. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Fire Chief Robert West amended the sum to \$1,000 to cover one self-contained breathing apparatus. He said that costs have risen dramatically. The amendment was adopted, and the article was passed as amended by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-THREE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purchase of a Fold-A-Tank water storage device. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Fire Chief West amended the amount to \$900. The amendment was passed. The article was passed as amended by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FOUR: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 for the purchase of a portable radio for the Rescue Squad. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Fire Chief West amended the sum to \$1,200.00. The amendment was passed. The article was passed as amended by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-FIVE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for proper expenses of the Police Department. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Barry Tolman asked what last year's amount had been. The answer was \$1,500. Selectman Bunce explained that the additional money is needed to pay for time and mileage. Voters also wondered what had happened to the radar set that was such an object of controversy the year before. Mr. Bunce said that Michael Blandschun had purchased the set himself. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-SIX: To see if the Town will vote that on the expiration of the term of Police Officer and constable elected at the Annual Meeting of the Town in 1983, the Selectmen be, and hereby are, authorized thereafter to appoint the Police Officer and Constable in accordance with the Revised Statutes Annotated as amended. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. A discussion followed: those opposed to the article said that it eroded the authority of the voters, might open the door to letting the Selectmen appoint other officers, would enable the appointees to demand more money, and would make the appointed officers difficult to remove. Those in favor to the article cited the increased need for professionalism and the danger of having the office be a popularity contest, the fact that more than half of the towns in the region do appoint their police officers, and the need for the police to be responsive to the Selectmen. The article was defeated by a strongly negative voice vote.

ARTICLES DEALING WITH ROADS

ARTICLE TWENTY-SEVEN: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000.00 for wages in the maintenance of the roads and bridges. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Mr. Bunce pointed out that this money is used strictly for labor costs: there are no paid vacations or other benefits, and no guarantees of a 40-hour week. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE TWENTY-EIGHT: To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$43,000.00 for General Highway expenses - - gas, repair, and supplies. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Bunce explained the breakdown of the costs: the majority of the money (\$25,000) is for general repairs, fuel, and miscellaneous costs. The balance is for specific projects, including gravel for Old Stoddard road, extending the bridge on Log Cabin Road, oiling and smoothing McIntire Road and Barrett Road, and gravel for Lead Mine Road and others. The article was passed by voice vote.

The polls were declared closed at 8:09 p.m.

ARTICLE TWENTY-NINE: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$537.29 as its share of TRA construction costs, the State's share being \$3,581.92. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. It was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY: To see if the Town will vote to accept additional Highway Subsidy Funds in the estimated amount of \$3,933.23. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. William Robertson wondered whether voting to accept the money was different from voting to spend it. Selectman Lothrop explained that the way to spend it is mandated by the State. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-ONE: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro rata reductions in the amounts estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action relating thereto. Appropriation: Highway Maintenance. Amount: \$8,300.00. Related Article: 27 (this corrects a typographical error in the town report). It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-TWO: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be added to the Equipment Capital Reserve Fund, it being understood that no withdrawals may be made from this fund for the purchase of road equipment except by vote of the Town and upon recommendation of the Town Equipment Committee. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-THREE: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw the sum of \$12,000.00 from the road Equipment Capital Reserve Fund. This money is to be used for the purchase of a used dump truck for the Highway Department per recommendations of the Road Equipment Committee and the Selectmen. It being understood that the 1973 4-wheel-drive International dump truck be traded in or sold outright to the highest bidder, or take any other action thereto. It was moved and seconded that the article be adopted as read. Selectman Bunce explained that one good piece of 2-wheel-drive equipment could replace two old trucks. The article was passed by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-FOUR: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000.00 for the purchase of 42 acres of land located on the southeast side of the present Town Barn, being a portion of the Eliot Priest property. It was moved and seconded to pass over this article. It was also moved and seconded to adopt the article as read. Moderator Bradshaw ruled that the positive motion to adopt would take precedence. Selectman Bunce explained the reasons in favor of acquiring the property: the need for more land around the town barn, the resources in the form of sand and gravel contained in the property, the central location of the land and its possible future as a site for a dump container, and the need for the town to control exploitation of the site. Voters opposed to the article said that we would lose the tax revenue from the property and that we don't need that much extra land. Barry Tolman characterized the parcel as a "wasteland." The article was defeated by voice vote.

ARTICLE THIRTY-FIVE: To transact any other business or discuss other warrant proposals as they may legally be brought before the meeting.

Earlier in the meeting (during the break when the polls were closed), testimonials had been given to honor two Nelson citizens. John Bradshaw announced that the New Hampshire Tax Collectors Association has honored Sidney Partridge for his 20 years of service. Maury Collins spoke on behalf of Florence Tolman in memory of Mildred Quigley, recalling Mrs. Quigley's role in town affairs, as a nurse to the elderly people of the town, and as Town Historian. A moment of silence was observed in memory of her recent death.

Selectman Lothrop announced corrections in the town report, on pages 18 and 19 of the 1982 report. The total of uncollected taxes on page 18 should read \$39,527.11, bringing the figure for total assets to \$209,213.22. The figure on page 19 for Fund Balance - - Total Surplus should read \$8,544.85, bringing the grand total to \$209,213.22.

William Riley advocated mailing out town reports so that voters can be better prepared to discuss questions on the warrant.

It was moved and seconded that the meeting be adjourned. The motion was passed, and meeting was adjourned by Moderator Bradshaw at 8:47 p.m.

ANNUAL SCHOOL MEETING

March 4, 1983

The polls were opened for persons wishing to vote for the officers listed by non-partisan ballot as required by law by the Moderator, Ethan C. Tolman, at the Nelson Town Hall, at 5:00 p.m. The Moderator announced that the polls would remain open until 10:00 p.m.

The checklist was handed over to the Clerk and signed by the Clerk and the Supervisors of the Checklist.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. and the Moderator asked it be moved and seconded to pass over the formal reading of the warrant in favor of saving time and the Moderator's failing voice. It was so moved and seconded and the motion carried.

The Chairman of the School Board distributed information sheets covering the budget distribution.

The Moderator introduced the Superintendent of Schools, Richard Champagne and David Hill, Supervisory Union Administrator. It was stated that they were available to answer questions of a technical nature throughout the meeting by way of the Moderator.

Article 1: It was moved and seconded to accept the reports of agents, auditors and committees as published in the Nelson School District Report. The motion carried.

Article 2: Motion was made and seconded that Article 2 be accepted as read. "To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to make application for, and to accept and use in the name of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government, the State of New Hampshire, or any department or agency thereof, or any federal, state, or private agency." The motion carried.

Article 3: Motion was made and seconded that Article 3 be accepted as read. David Upton, Chairman of the School Board, explained that this article would allow the District to expend "unanticipated funds" without the need for a District Meeting. "To see if the District will vote to authorize the school board to apply for, accept and expend, without further action by the School District Meeting, money from the state, federal, or other governmental unit or private source which becomes available during the 1983-1984 school fiscal year provided that such expenditure be made for purposes for which a school district may appropriate money, and that such expenditures not require the expenditure of other school district funds. The motion carried.

Article 4: Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 4 as read. Discussion followed by Mrs. Lape who questioned what students this involved and how many. Anne Ames of the School Board replied that it included the students in the 5th grade. The Moderator called for a vote and the motion carried.

Article 5: Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 5 as read. The Moderator stated that passage of this article required a 2/3 majority vote. He also stated the motion was not appropriate that the article doesn't show an intent. There was considerable discussion as to the purpose of this article. Karen Tolman of the School Board explained that adding this purpose would allow the school board to expend the funds for improvements to the waste disposal system at the school without appropriating and raising additional funds from the District. The Moderator asked for further discussion and called for a written ballot. David Upton interjected a motion be made and seconded that the vote be made by a show of hands. It was so moved and seconded. The vote was unanimously in favor of accepting Article 5 to read "That the District will amend the purpose of the Capital Reserve Fund established by the District in March of 1972 for the purpose of construction of buildings and/or purchase of equipment, and/or the acquisition of land for school purposes by adding: and shall include the construction, reconstruction, or acquisition of a specific capital improvement to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville Elementary School, or to take any other action relating thereto. The motion carried.

Article 6: Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 6 as read. Discussion followed by Mr. Lothrop questioning the wording of "appropriate". Mr. Champagne explained "that the legal council approved that the word 'appropriate' was appropriate." Further discussion included Mr. David Upton asking for a motion to be made to have the article read "or lesser amount". The Moderator asked if there be any objection to such and there was none. It was asked just what is needed for a new system. The board replied that they are not sure at this time what is needed but want to be prepared for any of the suggestions made by the Dion Engineering Firm. David Upton explained that the board was aiming for the replacement of the tank only and in hopes that the rest of the system will be adequate. Mr. Upton moved that the article be amended to read "\$6,847.87". Motion was seconded and following short discussion, a vote was called for and the amendment was carried. It was moved and seconded to accept Article 6 as amended to read "To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$6,847.87 or a lesser amount, from the Capital Reserve Fund established by the District in March 1972, and as amended March 1983, to make improvements to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville Elementary School, or to take any other action regarding a waste disposal system. Whereas action is required immediately in regard to the improvements needed on the waste disposal system, that the school board be authorized to take whatever action is deemed necessary at the earliest possible date." Motion carried.

Article 7: Motion was made and seconded to accept Article 7 to see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to be deposited in the Capital Reserve Fund established at the March 1972 District Meeting and as amended March 1983, for the purpose of construction, reconstruction, or acquisition of a specific capital improvement to the waste disposal system at the Munsonville Elementary School, or to take any action relating thereto. The motion carried.

Article 8: Motion was made and seconded by members of the school board to change the dollar figure in Article 8 to \$245,352. After a good deal of discussion a motion from Carol Raynor was made to amend the article to read \$242,800. The motion was seconded, a written ballot was called for and of 37 ballots cast 14 vote in favor of the amendment and 23 vote against the amendment. The amendment did not carry. Vote was called for Article 8 to read "To see if the District will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$245,352.00 for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officers and agents, and for the statutory obligations of the District." Motion carried.

Article 9: Motion was made and seconded to pass over Article 9. The Moderator called for a brief recess and Mr. Upton withdrew the motion to pass over in favor of asking for volunteers to help investigate the needs of the waste disposal system at the Munsonville school and these volunteers will be appointed by the board at a later meeting. Volunteers were: John VanKirk, Maurice Collins, Barry Tolman and Richard Church.

Article 10: To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting. Mr. Tolman as moderator, thanked the District and recognized Mrs. Skinner. He mentioned there would be a Planning Board meeting for all interested persons on March 15 at the Old Brick Schoolhouse. The Moderator then reminded the District that the polls were still open and would remain open until 10:00 p.m. The meeting was adjourned at 9:35 p.m.

REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN

As reported last year, change is an ongoing process in our school. We have succeeded in creating improvements in program, curricula, individualized instructional techniques, and effective administrative organization. Changes in program, methods, and procedures are understood by the school staff, students, and parents involved but are not usually apparent to the community. During the past year, the process of change became most visible to the whole community with the leaving of Jackie Martin and Martha Marsette from our school staff, and Dr. Bernard Ellis from central office. I wish to take this opportunity to thank them all, including our superintendent, Richard Champagne, and our primary grades' teacher, Judy Sargent, for their tireless contribution to the success of Nelson students, and to the building of the foundation upon which our school continues to grow today.

Filling vacancies in critical staff positions created feelings of anxiety and anticipation for everyone involved. The N.H. School Administrative Unit 29 Board, and the superintendent, spent from September to May hiring an assistant superintendent for towns. The process included two recruiting drives, and a central office reorganization study. Our efforts were rewarded with the hiring of Lawrence Seavey. Larry comes to us from the Montpelier, Vt., school system with a background of personal integrity, public sensitivity, and administrative and educational achievement which is essential to his position.

My thanks go to the Nelson School/Community Council, and to the central office staff for helping the board create a recruitment and hiring process which allowed us and the community to participate together in filling the teaching positions at the Munsonville Schol. Our success should be obvious to all those who know Virginia Ledell and Judy Fink.

Recent national and state reemphasis on educational excellence, teaching staff competency, and appropriate compensation are not new issues in the Nelson School District. Nevertheless, the challenge of growth and change always remains before us. Our budget for the 1984-85 school year contains our usual tuition, transportation and maintenance items. In addition, the board feels it necessary to support significant increases in staff salaries, staff development funding, instructional supplies, and equipment accounts.

We believe our salary proposal is fair to the staff and to the community. We accomplish this degree of fairness by thoughtfully linking the necessary components of staff tenure, ability, and performance with a reasonably competitive salary award schedule. Funding our staff development plan will contribute directly to our teachers' professional growth, ability, and enthusiasm. Purchasing the necessary equipment and materials allows our teachers

to provide our kids with the educational experiences they need to prepare them for their continuing education in the Keene schools and for life in our highly competitive world.

With your support our people and programs will continue to meet the challenges of change. We will make every effort to demonstrate to you, the parents, that the Munsonville School is the best elementary school your youngsters could possibly attend. At the same time, we will strive to continue to earn your trust that we are being as cost effective as possible.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Munsonville School has experienced many changes during the 1983-1984 school year including twelve new children and several new staff members. The enrollment as of September 6, 1983 was 29 and has since grown to 31 as of January 2, 1984. New staff members include: Virginia Ledell, Principal and Resource Room teacher; Judith Fink, fourth, fifth and sixth grade teacher; Harriet Ash, Nurse; Karen Desrosiers, Music teacher; Diane DiMeco, Chapter I teacher; Bonita Kraft, Psychologist; Ellen Post, Guidance Counselor; and Linda Vermouth, Physical Education teacher.

Computer education has been offered to all of the children this year. Students are learning the LOGO computer language, thanks to the generous donation of a disc drive by the Packersfield Club.

The STAMM Math program is in its second year and both teachers and students are finding math to be challenging and dynamic. A school newspaper has become an exciting method for creative expressions. The Kodaly method of music instruction is being taught this year along with art instruction by both teachers and talented parent volunteers.

A Chapter One Grant was written and approved this Fall. The money received from this grant enables eligible students to receive individual and small group instruction in the areas of math, reading, and language arts.

In order to continually strive for excellence in all academic areas, representatives from the Town Schools in SAU 29 have decided to investigate and improve science instruction in the elementary schools. Munsonville School is represented on this curriculum study committee.

Parent and community involvement in this school has been an important and greatly appreciated component in creating a quality educational environment. In addition, the continuous support and the guidance offered by the Nelson School Board members and all of the people at SAU 29 have helped make this year of change a positive experience for all.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

All agree that the Nelson School has done well this year. In Munsonville we see a new spirit, some recent staff additions, fresh involvement of the parents, and an improved structure and direction. There is a good feeling for the schools in town.

Our staff training and expectations for teachers should be increased. Plans must be made for an expected increase in enrollment in the near future in view of our limited facilities.

We are encouraged by the willingness of many to build quality education in Nelson. Experience shows that areas that value their schools become quality communities in which to live and work. With cooperative efforts that is happening here.

Your school board has represented you well this year. Responsiveness to others, alertness to fiscal details, and genuine concern for the students of this district are all characteristics of the board. It has been my pleasure to be associated with them as they have represented you. People of Nelson have every reason to be proud of the directions they are setting to benefit their children. The administration salutes those efforts and expresses its appreciation to teachers, parents, students, and board members for a good year.
