To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Castle qualified to vote in town affairs:—

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on the second Tuesday of March, 1917, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers, heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- 2. To choose all necessary town officers and agents for the year ensuing.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairs of highways and bridges for the year ensuing.
- 5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money necessary for payment of all town officers for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the contingent expenses for the ensuing year.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary to pay the interest on town bonds for the ensuing year.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the commission of the collector of taxes for the year ensuing.
- 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the ensuing year to be applied on the sinking fund.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money on credit of the town at a rate not exceeding six per cent.
- 11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the public library for the year ensuing.

- 12. To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes paid within a limited time.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate ten dollars (\$10.00) for decorating the graves of soldiers.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary for the maintenance of street lights for the year ensuing.
- 15. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay the cost of moth extermination for the year ensuing.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary to pay town note due June 1st, 1917.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the money necessary for paying the interest due on town notes to December 1, 1917.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay for use of fire hydrants for the year ensuing.
- 19 To see if the town will vote to abolish the board of water commissioners and to place the management, control and direction of the water works in the board of selectmen, with all the powers and subject to all the duties in relation thereto that are imposed on boards of water commissioners by law; or to elect one water commissioner to hold office for three years, and one water commissioner to fill out the unexpired term of Frederick Bell, resigned.
- 20. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to pay such officers as will be required in carrying into effect Article 19.
- 21. To do any other things or transact any other business that legally may come before said meeting.

Report of the Board of Education

To the Citizens of New Castle-

The school board respectfully submits the annual report for the year ending February 15, 1917.

The attendance of our schools have not been at their usual standard this year, the epidemic of measles, together with the infantile paralysis scare, have kept our schools broken up to a very great extent.

Our primary school is still under the charge of Miss Maude Trefethen, and has kept its usual high standard. This building is too small for the number of children attending and will have to be remedied in the near future.

The grammar school is in charge of Miss Bertha Chapman, a graduate of the Portsmouth training school. She is doing excellent work and has the respect and good will of both pupils and parents. This room is in fair condition and with a small outlay on the interior could be put in good condition.

According to Public Statutes, Chapter 88, Section 2, as changed by Chapter 52, Laws of 1909, we hereby notify the selectmen that the following sums are required for the ensuing year:
