THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Pittsburg on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

 To bring in your ballots for one Selectman for three years and the following officers for one year.
 One Road Agent for the Lake District, one Road Agent for the Middle District, one Road Agent for the Lower District, Town Clerk,

Agent for the Lower District, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, three Auditors, three Trustees of Trust Funds, and one Overseer of the Poor.

- 2. To bring in all ballots for the election of delegates to the State Constitutional Convention, delegates at large, alternate delegates at large, delegates and alternate delegates to the National Convention of the various political parties to be held to nominate party candidates for President and Vice-President of the United
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to appoint all other Town Officers.

States.

4. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes .

- 5. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to distribute blank inventories at the time they examine and appraise the property to be taxed.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote whereby it adopted the Australian ballot at its annual Town Meeting held in said Town of Pittsburg on the 12th day of March, 1935, and to be effective on the adjournment of the March Town Meeting held in said town on March 9th, 1948.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a non-partisan ballot system for the election of the town officers as provided in Chapter 22, of the Public Laws of 1943, in amendment of Chapter 4, providing for a non-partisan ballot system for town elections.
- 8. To see what action the Town will take in regard to observing Old Home Day and raise money for the same.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the moderator to appoint a committee of five to set the date and manage the Old Home Day observance.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the budget and raise money for same.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The polls shall be opened at 10 A. M. and not close before 6 P. M.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Superintending School Committee and the Citizens of the Pittsburg School District:

Foreword

Certainly the wealth of natural resources which abound here in this northernmost section of our Grand Old State of New Hampshire is vividly impressed upon our minds whenever we stop a moment to reflect upon our surroundings. Whether our thoughts are absorbed with the grandeur of Mother Nature's handiwork on every side, or with the rolling by of truck load after truck load of milk, potatoes, pulp or logs, as the case may be, our conclusion is the same, namely we are living in a land of tremendous natural resources and we are doing something with them.

Deeply impressed as we are by the potentiality of these most generally thought of natural resouces, we are sometimes prone to overlook the two all important ones. All others are meaningless without them. The intelligence and initiative of our boys and girls—the determining factors of where we will be tomorrow—are our greatest "natural resources." Where we are today is not primarily a result of our other natural resources—although we have been most fortunate in this respect—but of the abilities which our youths of yesterday developed. Where we will be in the future will be dependent, in turn, upon the abilities which we help our present younger generation to develop.

Faced with this fundamental truth it is imperative that everything possible be done in our schools to meet these needs. Especially is this true, when we realize that we have not only "come a long way" in bringing about the high standards of living enjoyed today but, also, that we have "gone a long way" in depleting our natural resources of a material

nature in bringing them up to our present high level. It means that the demands upon our educational system are paramount as never before to assist in developing the most vitally important of all our "natural resources" the ability of our boys and girls to successfully meet the many complicated situations of life.

Teachers

The vacancy in the headmaster's and mathematics and science position was filled by James A. Jordan, a graduate of Keene Teachers' College with several years of experience. Edith A. Emery, University of New Hampshire, was selected to teach music to all grades, and Social Studies to Grades 7-10. Eva S. Schoff, Plymouth Teachers' College, and an experienced teacher, was selected to teach Grade 1. Doris E. Fissette, Perry Kindergarten and Boston University, also an experienced teacher, filled the vacancy in Grades 5-6. We are extremely fortunate in having Guy A. Bagley return to teach English, French and U. S. History, Marion K. Gray to teach the Commercial subjects and Lillian M. Ball to teach Grades 3-4.

Buildings and Equipment

During the past year minor repairs and improvements made include storm windows for the Home Economics Room, and installation of a transom over door of basement classroom, occupied by Grades 3-4, for purposes of ventilation. The building is in good condition, and exemplifies excellent care.

Enrollment and Attendance

The present enrollment shows a total of 133, as compared with 124 last year, and 110 the previous year. There are three tuition pupils from Clarksville; two in the High School and one in the Elementary School. Five Pittsburg pupils are in attendance at West Stewartstown. The average percentage of attendance for the past year in Grades 1-8 was 94.78,

and for the High School 95.45. One group, Grades 5-6, had an average of 96.66. The number of tardinesses was 23.

Notes on the Budget

The School Boards' Budget for 1948-49 totals \$36,906.00 as compared with \$30,039.00 for last year. With an estimated income of \$1,800.00, this makes the requested appropriation \$35,106.00. This increase over last year's budget is explained somewhat by increases in teachers' salaries and in the cost of supplies. Also, provision is made for expenses of operation incurred through possible expansion.

Need for Addition on Present Building

With the enrollment in the elementary grades steadily increasing, the need for additional space is becoming ever more acute. This will be further enhanced if provision is made for the offering of courses in high school that tend to appeal to boys and results in their remaining for the four years.

Feasible possibilities indicate a doubling of the present enrollment in Grades 9-12, which would mean a substantial increase in the school's total enrollment.

Legislature

The past year has been an epoch making one in the passing of legislation beneficial to education. Of the several bills passed, the ones of state aid and teachers' salaries are extremely important. The former provides for the annual distribution of \$2,000,000. on an equalization and general basis for both elementary and secondary education throughout the state. The latter establishes minimum teacher salaries dependent upon the amount of training and experience of the teacher.

Conclusion

Again may I reiterate the magnitude of our re-

sponsibility to help our boys and girls to develop sterling characters, sound judgments and deep understandings—the prerequisites of extensive ability. The degree to which not only our section, but also our nation, maintains and improves upon its present status is going to be directly proportional to the extent that these traits are established and function in the routine every-day living of its citizens.

May I take this opportunity to express my deep appreciation to the members of the school board, parents, teachers and citizens for all the help received in endeavoring to maintain high standards in our schools.
