TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. S.]

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Salem, in the County of Rockingham, in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house, in said town, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at six-thirty (6:30) of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Art. 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.

Art. 3. To see if the town will vote to raise any more money for the repairs of highways than the law requires.

Art. 4. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Art. 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the town treasurer to hire, with the approval of the selectmen, such sums of money as may be needed for general purposes in anticipation of taxes.

Art. 6. To see what action the town will take relative to lighting the streets, and raise money for the same.

Art. 7. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed four thousand dollars (\$4,000), for the purpose of providing police officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 8. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money not to exceed three thousand dollars, (\$3,000), for the maintenance of the fire department for the ensuing year.

Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000), or any part thereof, for the removal of snow from the highways and general highway expenses.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of six hundred and forty-two dollars and sixty cents (\$642.60), and apply for aid from the state for Class 5 roads.

Art. 11. By request of library trustees. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800, or any part thereof, above the sum required by law, for the support of the Salem Free Public Library for the year 1939.

Art. 12. By request of Chester T. Woodbury. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100), or any part thereof, to maintain and improve the Town Common and the Public Square near Pine Grove Cemetery.

Art. 13. By request of Ernest W. Young Post. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of three hundred dollars (\$300), or any part thereof, for the use of Ernest W. Young Post, No. 63, American Legion, to be expended in the observance of Memorial Day in the year 1939.

Art. 14. By request of Ernest W. Young Post. To see if the town will vote to raise six hundred dollars (\$600), or any part thereof, for the erection of a band stand on or near the Town Common.

Art. 15. By request of the Salem District Nursing Association. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of ewelve hundred dollars (\$1,200), toward the support of the District Nursing Association.

Art. 16. By request of Walter Stickney and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand eight hundred and twenty-two dollars and fifty cents (\$1,822.50), or any uart thereof, and apply for State Aid on the road from Cowbell Corner to the Atkinson town line.

Art. 17. By request of Melzar Doble and others. To see if the town will vote to gravel and tar Martin Avenue and raise the sum of six hundred dollars (\$600), or any part thereof, for the same.

Art. 18. By request of Charles F. Smith and others. To see if the town will vote to repair with gravel and tar the road leading from Woodbury's Corner, so called, over Zion's Hill, commencing at the end of the present tar road, and raise the sum of fifteen hundred dollars (\$1,500), or any part thereof, for the same.

Art. 19. By request of Hagop Kachadoorian. To see if the town will vote to repair with gravel and tar the road leading from No. 8 schoolhouse to Kelley's Crossing and raise money for the same.

Art. 20. By request of Paul Garabedian and others. To see if the town will vote to repair Salem Street with gravel and tar beginning at the Ararat Congregational Church, and continuing to the state line or any part of this distance and raise money for the same.

Art. 21. By request of Henry J. Pendergast and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or any part thereof, for repair on Cluff Road from end of tar road to Foster's corner.

Art. 22. By request of William A. Kinzler and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of four hundred dollars (\$400), or any part thereof, for surfacing with gravel the Pumping Station Road, so called.

Art. 23. By request of William A. Kinzler and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500), or any part thereof, to repair Pelham Road with gravel from where the tarvia now ends to the Pelham line.

Art. 24. By request of Rosario Fontaine and others. To see if the town will vote to repair the south end of Granite Avenue with gravel and raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200), or any part thereof, for the same.

Art. 25. By request of Leslie H. Kohler and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two thousand dollars (\$2,000), or any part thereof, to continue the gravel and tar road from Merrill's Corner to North Salem Road.

Art. 26. By request of Edgar W. Smith. To see if the town will vote to widen and repair the bridge near the entrance to Millville Lake Park and raise money for the same.

Art. 27. By request of Arthur W. Cross. To see if the town will vote to accept Howard Street from Walter Smith's residence to the front of the residence of Arthur Cross and keep it passable.

Art. 28. By request of Chester T. Woodbury. To see if the town will vote to install furnace heat in the town hall and raise money for the same.

Art. 29. By request of the North Salem Fire Department and others. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars (\$2,500), for a piece of approved motor fire apparatus to be housed at the North Salem Fire Station.

Art. 30. By request of Daniel J. Buckley. To see if the town will vote to extend the water main down Pleasant Street to Hall's Crossing and to authorize the selectmen to get State or Federal aid or any other money available for same.

Art. 31. By request of Clarence J. Shirley. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200), or any part thereof, to improve the appearance of the old burial grounds of Salem known as "Spear Hill" Burying Ground near the

Windham line, and the one near the Atkinson line opposite the residence of Mr. Arthur Cullen, and to straighten the old stones therein, and re-cut the lettering of same where necessary.

Art. 32. By request of Chester T. Woodbury. To see if the town will vote to accept the John A. Bailey fund of two thousand one hundred and three dollars and sixty-four cents (\$2,103.64), the income to be used to buy books for the public library which shall most benefit young people in obtaining a scientific or technical education.

Art. 33. By request of Charles E. Head. To see if the town will vote to accept from Charles E. Head the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100), as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Charles E. Head Lot in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery.

Art. 34. By request of Emma E. Chase. To see if the town will vote to accept from Emma E. Chase the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Robert Chase Lot in Mt. Pleasant Cemetery.

Art. 35. By request of Frederick and Donald Hall. To see if the town will vote to accept from Frederick and Donald Hall the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Walter E. Hall lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

Art. 36. By request of Willis L. Hall. To see if the town will vote to accept from Willis L. Hall the sum of fifty dollars (\$50) as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Arthur L. Cross lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

Art. 37. By request of Abbie C. Bailey Estate. To see if the town will vote to accept from Abbie C. Bailey Estate, the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Osmon C. Bailey lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

Art. 38. By request of Evelena Lord. To see if the town will vote to accept from Evelena Lord, the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Evelena Lord lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

Art. 39. By request of Mrs. Gertrude Bradford. To see if the town will vote to accept from Mrs. Gertrude Bradford, the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) as a perpetual fund, the interest to be expended in the care of the Hall and Huntington lot in Pine Grove Cemetery.

REPORT OF THE SALEM FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Fire Department during the past year answered 72 bell alarms and 5 still alarms. The fire loss for the year was \$8,825.13. The approximate value of the property involved was \$83,000.00. This is a decrease of \$5,055.60 from last year's loss. A new inhalator and two smoke masks have been added to the equipment of the department.

To correct the many rumors as to the cost of the fires in North Salem I wish to state that the average fire cost to North Salem for the year 1938 was \$11.68. This amount includes the cost of truck and man hire.

The new piece of fire apparatus is in splendid condition and should be for many years. The old piece needs considerable repairs and the department feels that if the appropriation was increased to \$3,000.00 this machine could be put into excellent shape. REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD

Your board is privileged at this time to submit to you its report on the general conditions of the schools of the town as well as the more important factors entering into their maintenance. We have endeavored to continue our policy of economy without sacrifice to the welfare of our school system. On the contrary, we have put forth every effort to improve the general conditions of our schools and their morale. It may be of interest to the taxpayers to note that the ratio of money expended for school purposes as against the total amount expended by the community as a whole is approximately ten percent less than the average in the state. We hope that we may continue to operate in such manner as will be conducive to further economy and at the same time continue our efforts to raise the general standard wherever possible. In view of this, we are asking the citizens for somewhat less money in our budget this year than last.

Woodbury High School:—Two sides of this building have been water-proofed and all cracks caulked. The entire driveway around the school has been graded and tarred in a substantial manner and a long needed improvement has been effected. Flood lights have been installed on two sides, completely illuminating the rear and one side of the school yard and driveway. Since there is no street light in front of the school, we hope to be able to put a third light of a similar type on the front of the building to take care of proper lighting over this section.

No. 1 School:—A start has been made toward grading the land on the upper side of this building for athletic and playground purposes, and it was used during the fall season by the high school foot-

ball squad. The toilet walls in the basement were repainted. The steam system in this school is giving very satisfactory results.

Nos. 4 and 5 Schools:—Nominal repairs only were made here except that an effort was made to secure the basement windows against further breaks, which gave us considerable concern during one period of the year.

No. 6 School:—Fifty new modern type steel desks and chairs were installed in one room of this school, a new ceiling was put up in one of the primary rooms, and the desks in all other rooms were resurfaced and refinished. One section of the carrying timbers was found to be in poor condition and was repaired.

No. 7 School:—The interior of this school was repainted and some of the better desks removed from No. 6 School were installed here to replace those in poor condition. Others of the good desks were used at No. 4 School to replace those in bad condition.

No. 9 School:—The outside of this school was repainted with two coats. An oil burner was installed in the present boiler. Town water has been piped into the building, eliminating the uncertain well and pump used previously, and giving us a safe and reliable water service. The toilets here were repaired and are regularly supplied with water. This is a material improvement.

In all the school buildings the regular routine maintenance work was done. Window and sash cords were renewed where needed and various minor repairs were made.

It was intimated by the board in its annual report of last year that the town would lose about \$1,000.00 state aid money because there were too few pupils attending No. 9 School, and that if the attendance this fall did not increase to the required number,

some pupils would possibly be transported from overcrowded schools to give the required number at No. 9, thereby enabling us to get back this amount of state aid money. This has been done by transportation of some children from No. 1 District and from No. 5 District where there was a condition of overcrowding and it is working out in a satisfactory manner.

The board feels that the people of the community work too hard to earn the money raised for the support of their schools to consider any additions to present buildings, because of too many pupils per school, unless such become necessary. And so, where such conditions do arise, and where children may be transported or transferred to another school having space available without detriment to their welfare, we shall request such transfers to be made for the common good of all concerned.

More strongly than ever, we wish to call the attention of the citizens to the splendid support and spirit of cooperation extended to us from town officials, superintendent, headmaster, teachers, pupils, and the public as a whole during this past year. We greatly appreciate the time and effort expended by our superintendent at Concord in the offices of the State Department of Education during the Christmas holidays when he was by such efforts instrumental in restoring to us a considerable amount of state aid money. We also deeply appreciate the growing interest in the schools and their work by the parents, for only by such interest can the schools function as they should.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT
OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Salem:

It is with pleasure that I present my annual report as superintendent of your schools.

The Statistical Report is for the school year ending June 30, 1938. This report is followed by the reports of the Headmaster of the High School, the Music Supervisor and the School Nurse.

The changes in teachers since my last report are two in number. Miss Edna Grierson is succeeding Miss Doris Hanson at Number Eight Primary School, and Mr. Clifton Smith succeeds Miss Evelyn Searle at the High School. Our teachers with but a few exceptions have taken courses in education either during the summer or during the school year. At the present time, a number are taking a course in Remedial Reading given by Dr. Durrell of Boston University, at Haverhill. By means of this work our teachers are keeping abreast of modern thought and practice in school matters. Several are planning further work next summer. The retention of able and experienced teachers for a period of years is a valuable asset to successful schools and a source of educational economy not to be overlooked.

The enrollment for the year covered by this report was 742, which was twelve more than during the previous year. The School attendance averaged 95.32% of the membership, as compared with the state average of 95.13%.

There were fifty-nine boys and girls graduated from the eighth grade last June. All but four of these have entered a high school this year. The medal, awarded each year by the Sons of the American Revolution, to the pupil in the graduating class

of the elementary schools who has best exemplified the principles of good citizenship, was given to Gertrude Brown. The pupils in grade eight who received the Scholarship medals awarded by the Salem Board of Trade are as follows:

Gold Medal—Josephine Valeska.

Silver Medal—Helen Smith.

Bronze Medal—Lewis Soule.

The report presented by Mr. Atherton contains detailed information about the Woodbury High School. The fine achievement of the High School has continued. This is shown by the attitude and spirit of the student body, the efficiency of the teaching staff, and the fine school plant. I believe this condition is largely appreciated in town, but not fully realized, as it would be if change should break the system down. I would not be doing my duty if I did not again call your attention to the need for a different type of education for those of high school age who are not academically minded. Our High School curriculum provides an excellent training for those who are adapted to it, but for many it is inadequate. There is great need for vocational education and the establishment of a Mechanic Arts Course for boys.

A 16mm. Silent Motion Picture Machine was purchased by the towns of our Supervisory Union last spring for use in Visual Education in the Schools. Films that deal with and supplement the curriculum of the school are shown. For the elementary school there are available without cost, except transportation, films dealing with health, safety, geography, history and home making. Films have been shown on Alaska, Brazil, Philippine Islands, Denmark, Siberia, and the Sahara Desert; as well as on Wheat, Corn, Oranges, the Life of Lincoln, and of Washing-

ton. Motion Pictures and Radio are rapidly taking a place in the school room. Non-readers often learn by this means as rapidly as good readers. Teachers find that a motion picture in history or geography creates a desire to learn more about the subject. Experimentors have found that children learn from Motion Pictures three or four times as rapidly as by reading and retain it longer.

We greatly appreciate the generosity of the Lions Club, the Woman's Club, the Men's Club and other organizations who contributed milk, shoes, and clothing to the children in need of same. An annual dental clinic in Salem is a real necessity. Those responsible for the welfare of our children wish to express our appreciation for the effort on the part of several organizations in making a Dental Clinic possible, and we hope it may be possible to have another clinic this spring.

New desks were installed in the fifth and sixth grade room at the Depot School, and adjustable desks were also put into the North Salem School. Desks were resurfaced at the Depot, No. 8, and No. 9 Schools. This has been greatly appreciated since desks with a good surface are more easily kept clean and sanitary. Black window shades were installed in Mrs. Titcomb's and Miss Hilliard's rooms, so that we might have the room dark at the times motion pictures are shown at these buildings. The cost was paid from entertainment proceeds. Proceeds from an entertainment made it possible to buy a new radio for the Center School.

The Metropolitan Achievement tests are given each year in grades one to eight inclusive. The Otis Mental Ability Tests are given in grade four. These tests help in checking school progress. They also show the need, when it exists, of additional drill in

some subjects. Our tests show that good progress is being made. The teachers taking Dr. Durrell's Course in Remedial Reading will receive assistance in solving reading problems.

The Safety Patrol is used at No. 1 and No. 6 Schools, and insures greater safety for the boys and girls. A curriculum in Safety Education has been worked out by a committee of New Hampshire educators and has been made available for each school. This will be of real help to our teachers in making education for safety more effective. Not only is safety on the highway stressed, but also safety in the home and on the playground.

During National Education Week in November, parents are urged to visit the schools. A large number of parents, especially mothers, avail themselves of this opportunity. We only wish that parents would come more often. If parent and teacher are to work together for the best development of the child, it is very necessary that they have an opportunity to meet.

In conclusion, I wish to express my thanks to the School Board for their generous support and commend the time and energy they have so generously expended for the welfare of the schools. I also commend the effective and loyal work of the teachers in guiding their pupils forward on the road to good citizenship.

REPORT OF THE HEADMASTER

To W. J. Nelson, Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith submit my annual report as Headmaster of Woodbury High School.

Since school opened September 7, 1938 for its fourteenth year 282 pupils in all have been registered, 3 less than last year. Since that time 11 pupils have withdrawn from the school so that the present enrollment is 271. The following table will show the distribution by classes:

There are in the school 16 tuition pupils from the following towns: One from Derry, three from Atkinson, and twelve from Windham.

Of the 33 graduates last June seven are living at home. The others are gainfully employed or enrolled in post secondary institutions as follows:

- 2 postgraduates in Woodbury High School.
- 2 are attending the University of New Hampshire.
- 1 is attending Wheaton College, Illinois.
- 1 is in training at the Elliot Hospital, Manchester.
- 1 is attending business college.

- 1 is attending a hairdressing school.
- 2 are working on dairy farms.
- 4 are working in shoe factories.
- 1 has enlisted in the United States Army.
- 3 are engaged in housework.
- 2 are operating a laundry.
- 1 is working in a textile mill.
- 1 is a waitress.
- 1 is working in a bakery shop.
- 1 is working for a wholesale fruit company.
- 1 is a doctor's secretary.
- 1 is a clerk in a drug store.

There was only one change in the faculty this year, Mr. Clifton W. Smith joining the teaching staff as teacher of sophomore English, commercial geography and biology. Mr. Smith is a graduate of Keene Normal School.

Activities during the past year have been many and varied. They have included regular class work, athletics, music, and special events. School work in classes is not spectacular but represents the most important function of the school. It has been carried on by a loyal faculty, ever alert to the needs and best interests of the pupils.

Several changes have taken place in the school's athletic policy this year. It became necessary to give up the regular schedules in baseball and football for two reasons. In the first place no suitable field was available for either sport. As matters stand at present the school badly needs an athletic field before baseball and regular football can be again undertaken. In the second place there were not enough interested boys to support either sport. The following table will show clearly how few boys are enrolled in the upper classes at the present time.

This table shows that the girls outnumber the boys almost 4 to 1. While this appears to be a temporary condition, as the boys and girls are more equally divided in the lower grades, it is obvious that there will not be much material available for football at least for two or three years.

In place of regular baseball a soft ball league was formed at school, composed of both girls' and boys' teams. This sport is inexpensive, does not require a good or a large field, and most important of all, gives exercise and recreation to a large number of individuals, girls as well as boys.

After some preliminary work a six-man football team was organized last fall. Two games were played in which the team acquitted itself unusually well against teams with much more training and experience. This game requiring fewer boys and a smaller field than regular football may be a solution for the football problems facing our school at the present time.

The basketball season is well under way. Mr. McPhee and Miss Minichiello are coaching the boys' and girls' teams respectively. The younger boys and girls have been organized into squads to practice under the direction of Mr. Rourke and Miss Fisk.

Physical exercises have been carried on in morning recess periods, out of doors in good weather and indoors with windows opened on stormy or cold days.

Fire drills have been held frequently. This year several drills have been held with one stairway

blocked as might be the case in a real fire. With all exits in use the building can be emptied in sixty seconds; with one stairway blocked, in about a minute and a half.

Class dances and parties are held each month except during the basketball season. Both the junior and senior high had Christmas parties.

The annual operetta, "Rose of the Danube," presented by the Athletic Association, was produced under the splendid direction of Mrs. Eva W. Thompson, ably assisted by Mrs. Smith, Miss Minichiello, Miss Courser and Mr. McPhee.

The Student Council organized in the fall with representatives elected from the different classes. The Council takes charge of all the assemblies, traffic in the halls, the Christmas parties and any other general activities.

The school magazine, *The Ray*, is being published by the school. This year not only the senior class but all the other classes in school as well have representatives on the editorial board. The first number was issued Thanksgiving.

The guidance groups in the lower grades are being continued this year for the discussion of ethical problems, and study of vocations. Boys and girls who give some serious thought as to their future vocations are more apt to have serious purposes for their work in school.

Hot lunches are being served at cost during the coldest months of the school year. It would be desirable to improve the equipment in the Home Economics room, not only for general efficiency but for the possibility of expanding the present system of hot lunches into a school cafeteria. More modern stoves are badly needed to replace the old oil stoves now being used.

Whenever difficulties in the way can be overcome, the addition of some kind of mechanic arts or technical course for boys is badly needed. We already offer four courses to the girls in school, Latin, Social Science, Commercial and Home Economics. The boys have only two, namely Latin and Social Science, with no opportunity for any practical vocational training. Before such work can be carried on more room is needed in the school building.

All parents and interested citizens are cordially invited to visit school. They will find the members of the faculty anxious to cooperate with them for the best interest of any pupil.

I wish to extend appreciation for the kindness of teachers, superintendent, School Board, and citizens who have cooperated in all activities of the school.

REPORT OF SUPERVISOR OF MUSIC

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I herewith present my annual report as Supervisor of Music in the Salem Schools.

The work in music is being continued much the same as in former years. The children have an organized course in rote singing, the songs are written within the range of the child voice and of simple rhythm. The elements of musical notation are taught step by step; as the children are ready for a problem it is presented to the eye on the blackboard, training the ear and eye for sight-reading.

The radio and victrola are used for the teaching of Musical Appreciation. An outline of the program is written on the blackboard; the teacher tells something of interest about the selection and the composer, before the children listen to the composition.

On May 20th the pupils of Number One School very beautifully presented the musical play, "Between the Bookends." The play was very well received and a success financially. The proceeds were used to purchase a radio for the school.

Two operettas were given during the year by the students of Woodbury High School. On April 7th and 8th the Gilbert and Sullivan opera Pinafore, and on December 15th and 16th Rose of the Danube by Morgan and Penn. Excellent work was done on both. The boys and girls should be commended for their fine school spirit, and I wish to thank them for the many hours they worked after school to make the operettas the success that they were. I cannot fully express my appreciation to the teachers who were ever willing, and worked untiringly for the success of these productions.

The orchestra is growing in both quality and quantity. It now consists of five violins, three clarinets, two trumpets, a French horn and piano. This organization meets once a week for rehearsal and shows steady improvement.

A mixed quartet, two seniors and two juniors sang with the All-State Chorus at the annual State Music Festival on the evening of May 13th. The group learned and memorized five selections of moderate difficulty. It was a rich experience for those participating and a joy to those who listened.

For your continued interest and support and the hearty cooperation of the teachers, I am most grateful.

A tuberculosis clinic was held, June 1st. Fifty-two children were examined, including the boys at Woodbury high school, who were desirous of taking part in athletics, the coming school year. Those qualifying were given certificates by Dr. Kerr, lung specialist.
