To the inhabitants of the Town of Shelburne, in the County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Shelburne on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.
- To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To hear the report of the budget committee and act thereon.
- 4. To hear the reports of Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of town highways and bridges.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Road Construction of highways.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.
- 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of cemeteries.
- To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the relief of town poor.
- 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for fire prevention.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$100 to be used by the Committee in improving the town forest.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$81.90, based on a 1-100 of 1% of the assessed valuation, for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.

13. To see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

14. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.

15. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks when taking inventory.

16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
