

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Strafford in the County of Strafford in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Strafford on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of sixty-five dollars (\$65.00) for the Lakes Region Association.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of same.
- 5. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the support of the poor, including Old Age Assistance.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of nine hundred eighty-four dollars (\$984.00) for State Aid Construction.
- 8. To see if the Town will accept the report of the "Soldiers' Memorial Committee" and raise and appropriate such money as is needed.
- 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 10. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to grant a 2% discount on property taxes paid in full thirty days after issuing tax warrant.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Report of Forest Fire Warden

The year 1943 was an extremely fortunate one because of favorable weather conditions. Many towns had no fires, some had minor fires while a few had expensive ones. The public controls the answer to the 1944 and future years' fire records. If the public is careful and cooperative the record will be good.

Your town warden is, perhaps, more perplexed and anxious during these war years than ever before because of increased forest fire hazards and diminishing supplies of available manpower. He looks directly to you to aid him. Will you? You can aid him most effectively by always securing the required permit before attempting to burn and by complying fully with permit requirements; by being patient when he advises of departmental restrictions on permit burning or that he deems it unsafe to burn; and by giving him the needed assistance in extinguishing fires when he needs your help. To do so is to meet one real test of citizenship.
