You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Tuftonboro on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. \$24,920.00 figures of the Budget Committee.

3. To see if the town will vote to rase and appropriate the sum of four hundred seventy two dollars and ninety six cents (\$472.96), the State to contribute the sum of three thousand one hundred fifty three dollars and five cents (\$3,153.05) for Town Road Aid.

4. To see if the town will vote to allow the collector of taxes additional compensation for his services in collecting the state head tax and to fix the amount thereof.

5. To transact any other business which may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Once again we are about to enter another forest fire season and once again your town forest fire warden is asking you to be careful of fires in our woodlands and along our roadsides. There is nothing more displeasing to the eye than an area of blackened waste. Nine out of ten of these blackened areas are caused by You and You. It is only with your cooperation that we can prevent such an area in our town. A great part of the men and women of this area depend on timber for their weekly pay check, and by you and you being careless, these people are being deprived of a living. We can't even try to prevent fires caused by lightning, but the number of fires caused by this agent is very small. It is you as a smoker, as a debris burner, — you as a careless person, who can do a great deal in preventing this most shameful waste of our natural resources.

You can help by making sure your smoking material is out — DEAD OUT, your incinerator is air tight, the area around it is cleaned of all burnable material, that you have had it inspected by your forest fire warden, that you have asked for and received a permit to burn from your forest fire warden. By doing these things the number of fires are going to be fewer and you will have woodlands to hunt in, to have picnics in, to be able to fish the stream. You will also be proud of your green mountainsides. By not doing this you will not enjoy yourself at all. It is not too long ago that most of us can still remember the fall of 1947, and we all know that most of those fires during that period could have been prevented if everyone was careful. So, it is only You and You that can prevent this most shameful waste of our woodland by this common enemy — FIRE.

Please remember it is a proud record for you to say that my town had no woods fires this past year and it is only through you and you that this goal can be reached. So, please help us to prevent forest fires.

LIBRARY REPORT

For the first time in many years there have been several major changes in the Tuftonboro Library.

After thirty years of faithful and devoted service, Mrs. Edwin Hersey resigned her position as Librarian. It was in 1922 that the Town Library books were moved from the Frank Hersey store at the Center to the pleasant front room in her home. The Town should be deeply appreciative of the years of service that Mrs. Hersey has given.

The problem of finding a new home for the Library was solved, temporarily, by the Tuftonboro Grange which made available a room in its building for Library use. It is hoped that someday the Library will have a permanent home which will be more accessible for the school children.

Mrs. Philip Johnson has accepted the position of Librarian and brings to the Town a background of several years of library experience at Simmons College.

The two immediate goals of the library program are first, increased circulation of books, and second, development of the book collection to meet the minimum standards set by the State.

In December a volunteer bookmobile service was started to the several sections of the town and circulation, including special requests from the State Library, shows a marked advance. The town collection is supplemented by the State Bookmobile every two months.

At least half of the books purchased this year will help to bring subjects for reference up to date.

B. REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT

During the past half century of turmoil and change, the values of our American educational system have been apparent to all thinking citizens. Leaders of the past and present have expressed their faith in a public school system. Presidents Washington, Lincoln, Roosevelt, and now Eisenhower have made statements of its prominence among the important institutions of the free American society.

Perhaps some foreign leaders have recognized its possibilities more fully than we. They continue to use it as a device to twist minds, spread untruths, and promote isms that benefit the few at the expense of the many.

In our democracy, the ideals of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness are brought closer to realization by means of the free public school. As we govern ourselves, better conditions for all of our people depend upon a constantly improving citizenry. Our schools are generally recognized as the best means to promote this improvement, and are deserving of continued public belief and confidence.

Though occasional weaknesses are observed, and slurs are cast, our free public schools continue to survive political and economic emergencies, and wars. We constantly seek to improve as new methods are devised, and new needs of the children are demonstrated.

I want to include a brief word in this annual report of my real joy and pleasure in being selected to serve you as superintendent. Particularly is it gratifying to return to the area where I previously worked for eight years as teacher, coach, and principal. You have intrusted me with increased responsibilities. In

fulfilling my duties to the best of my ability and energies, I shall place foremost the welfare of our boys and girls.

Teachers :

The addition of the fourth teacher in your school has brought about a very fine classroom situation. Between twenty and twenty-five pupils are in each room. The reduced number of grades and pupils assigned to each teacher gives more time for better instruction. Our special teachers, shared with Wolfboro, give our boys and girls opportunities to gain practical skills and knowledge in music, home making, and woodworking. The chart in Part II summarizes the training of our fine staff. As a community, we should be really concerned about retaining these people. In this time of teacher scarcity, many communities are far less fortunate.

Repairs and Improvements :

Our building is in good physical condition. As minor repairs were being completed last summer, it was discovered that the pillars of nearly all porches were rotting at the base. Moisture and lack of ventilation caused this decay. These have been repaired at greater expense than anticipated, and we hope a repetition of this trouble will not occur for many years. A major improvement was the laying of a new rubber tile floor in the kitchen. Some painting was completed, and a thorough job was done in cleaning and floor maintenance. A small sum is requested in the new budget to correct minor difficulties that may occur. We believe it is real economy to maintain our building and equipment in the best condition at all times.

Brewster Fund:

The Trustees of Brewster Academy again provided more than \$1000 for the purchase of a list of items prepared by the School Board. In addition to globes and other educational equipment, the science demonstration bench for the junior high grades represents a real improvement in facilities. These were provided at no cost to the taxpayer.

School Board Meetings:

Regular meetings are held at least once a month, and policies are determined. The superintendent and board members bring in problems presented to them, and make recommendations. Decisions are made after much thought and discussion. Relations are friendly and professional. Probably our biggest single task is the preparation of the school budget.

Finances:

Increasing school populations and inflated costs are making the support of schools in New Hampshire a difficult problem. Particularly is this true since we are almost completely dependent upon the real estate tax raised on local property. You are fortunate that your real estate is in sufficient quantity to make the support of education easier than in most towns of our state.

It appears now that we have enough money in our budget to take care of all expenses of the current year without deficit. After many hours of preparation the School Board has agreed on what they feel to be an honest budget, with no padding. There is reasonable increase included for teachers which places their salaries close to the state average. The largest single increase is that for tuition. The rate has been

advanced from \$200 to \$225. Though this is 12½% greater, it still remains considerably below the average costs for high school pupils.

* * * * *

For any community to be successful, there has to be a lot of working together. So too, a spirit of cooperation has to exist between all elements in a community and its school, if the school is to function to greatest advantage. I think such a spirit is prevalent in Tuftonboro.

AUXILIARY ACTIVITIES AND REPORTS

A. REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE FOR 1952

The usual routine work of the school health program has been carried out this year. At the time of the physical examinations by Dr. Gregory, a partial five-year survey was completed. The result shows an 85% improvement in the over-all health of our school children.

Through good parent cooperation visual defects have been checked or corrected.

Our serious measles epidemic of last spring was the worst of any since my time here as School Nurse. It was really nation wide, and there seemed to be no stopping it.

Hearing tests were started. Due to a breakdown of the machine, these were not completed, but they will be finished this year.

A dental clinic is now in progress. All the necessary work cannot be performed this year. I hope that it may become a continuous part of our health program.

The hot lunch program serves a dual purpose. It relieves the parent of putting up a lunch, and gives the child an opportunity to have a hot, well balanced lunch at noon.

I would like to thank all the teachers, the School Board, and the Superintendent for their help and cooperation during the past year.

WARRANT, SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING
THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Second District in the Town of Tuftonboro, N. H., qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 10th day of March, 1953 at 2:00 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the ensuing year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agents of the district.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this Warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from

the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
