THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Tuesday the twelfth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, Trust Fund Trustee, Auditor, and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for—

a. Town Officers' Salaries

b. Town Officers' Expenses

c. Election Expenses

d. Municipal Court Expenses

e. Care and repair of town buildings

f. Police Department

g. Town fire protection and Department

h. Forest fires

i. Bounties and damage by dogs

j. Health department and vital statistics

k. Sewer maintenance

l. Highways and bridges

1. Town maintenance

2. Snow removal

3. Cleaning streets 4. Street lighting

5. General expense highway department -

m. Public Library

n. Old age assistance

o. Town poor

p. Memorial Day

q. Soldiers' aid

r. Memorial Field

s. Cemeteries

t. Insurance

u. Interest, bonds and notes

v. Traffic lights

w. Sidewalk maintenance

x. Payment on principal of town debt

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion and Morrison Hospital Auxiliary, for public purposes, the free use of the town hall.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the town will accept State Aid construction of Class V roads, commonly known as town roads.

6. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for advertising, the same to be expended through the Board of Trade.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate to the White Mountains Region Association, for its program of advertising, etc., as a part of the co-operative investment by regional towns, an amount equal to 10c per \$1,000 of the assessed valuation of the town for 1945.

8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$2,000 to aid in maintenance of the Morrison Hospital.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise the amount of \$200 to continue the control of White Pine Blister Rust in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department, thereby receiving the usual State Aid.

10. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the public highway over Bray Hill from Sylvester Newell's homestead turn northerly to Jefferson Town line.

11. To see if the town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds or otherwise.

12. To take action with reference to permanent location of the Honor Roll.

13. To see if the town will vote to acquire by gift or by purchase the Hazen Island Airport site, so-called, and lease the same to the federal government and/or State of New Hampshire, or such agency or authority as might be designated by them or either of them, under such terms and conditions as the Selectmen may approve.

14. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell at private or public sale the Hunt Field on Highland street and Hays Field in Dalton that were purchased by the town for cemetery purposes.

15. To see if the town will authorize the installation of two new street lights; one on Huron Street and the other on Maple Street.

16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate two hundred dollars for new sidewalk construction.

17. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a street sweeper at an expense not to exceed five hundred dollars and raise and appropriate money for the same.

18. To see if the town will vote to purchase grader, snowplow, wing, and all necessary parts for highway maintenance, at a cost not to exceed ten thousand dollars, and raise the same by issue of town notes payable over a period of years under such terms as the Selectmen may approve.

19. To see if the town will elect to approve of the inclusion of its officers and employees in the Employees Retirement System of the State of New Hampshire, which system is provided for by chapter 27-A of the Revised Laws, as inserted by chapter 183 of the Laws of 1945, and as provided by chapter 201 of the Laws of 1945 and any subsequent amendments thereto.

20. If the town votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred twelve dollars (\$512) for the purpose of providing funds for the town's contribution to said retirement system, for the coming year.

21. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

Given under our hands and the seal of the town this twenty-fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and seventieth.

Report of the White Mountains Region Association

To the Voters of the Town of Whitefield:

We hereby submit our annual report for the year 1945-46 showing what is being accomplished through the prestige gained by 46 towns working together in the interest of regional agriculture, industry and recreation:

AGRICULTURE: Sponsoring competition among 50 regional 4-H clubs to aid future agriculture by offering prizes to clubs and individual members for outstanding accomplishments; publishing expert advice from the Colebrook Agricultural Experiment Station on produce raising for profit; assisting cooperative efforts for raising, grading and marketing farm products.

INDUSTRY: Finding and following up new business possibilities and listing available sites, in cooperation with the State Industrial Division; broadcasting information of available research aid and results of experiments in wood waste use; offering facilities of State Industrial Division and University Research Division to towns and individuals.

RECREATION: Assisting towns, the state and U. S. Forest Service in plans to develop suitable recreation areas in the region; surveying and making known possibilities for improving facilities to increase regional income from commercial recreation.

AVIATION: Actively presenting region needs for airports and air service to state and federal agencies, to insure favorable action when federal funds are available.

REAL ESTATE: Sponsoring real estate organization to improve general conditions, standardize fees and services; distributing lists of prospects for properties. (\$75,000. of sales reported last year.)

PUBLICITY: Presenting advantages of towns and region by advertising, news and printed material—20,000 winter folders and newspaper advertising; 20,000 fishing-hunting folders; attendance of well-known guide and secretary at sportsmen's shows; 25,000 pictorial booklets and 100,000 low-cost folders planned for spring.

TRADE SCHOOLS: Developing possibilities for state aid trade schools and vocational courses in region schools for presentation to the state board of education.

TRANSPORTATION: Securing improved rail and bus service for sections needing it; keeping region requirements before transportation agencies.

GENERAL: Assisting on all types of town problems; representing town interests before state and other agencies; maintaining information center for use of citizens; furnishing region data for state departments; answering thousands of inquiries on all subjects.

Town appropriations make these services possible.
