

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Alexandria in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Alexandria on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon to three o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will raise for the maintenance of highways and bridges, except snow work.
- 4. To see how much money the town will raise for plowing and sanding roads in winter.
- 5. To see if town will accept State Aid Construction and raise \$763.50 for same or will accept Town Road Assistance and raise \$526.14 for same.
- 6. To see if town will vote to have taxes collected on a percentage basis and what rate to pay the Collector.
- 7. To see if town will vote to allow a discount of two per cent on taxes paid before July 1.
- 8. To see how much money the town will raise for War Defense purposes.
- 9. To see if town will raise money to survey the Alexandria-Danbury town line

- 10. To see if town will raise \$100 to purchase the old Bennett barn and also money to remove the barn.
- 11. To see if town will raise \$400 for Blister Rust control.
- 12. To see if town will raise \$50 for the Lakes Region Association for advertising the advantages and attractions of Alexandria.
- 13. To see if town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of receipt of taxes.
