STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chesterfield, in the County of Cheshire in the said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Chesterfield on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To elect a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 2. To elect one Selectman for three years.
- 3. To elect a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 4. To elect a Library Trustee for three years.
- 5. To elect one Fireward for three years.
- 6. To elect all other Town Officers.
- 7. To see what action the Town will take in regards to unexpended balances of 1933 appropriations.
- 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to defray fown charges.
- 9. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$1,992.00 for State Aid construction.
- 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of the poor.

- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Old Age Assistance.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for highway maintenance. (See Art. 21).
- 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Fire Department.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the support of Libraries.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and raise money for same.
- 16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for street lighting.
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to allow the Selectmen and the Firewards to move the old Hearse house to a suitable location and raise money for moving and putting it in condition for winter use; or to build a new building and raise money for the same.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to replace guard railing on the road on the north side of the lake.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$25.00 for the purpose of putting a plate with the names of the holders, the date they received it and the age, on the Boston Post gold head cane that goes to the oldest male resident of Chesterfield.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for new equipment.
- 21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for snow removal.

- 22. To see if the Town will vote to install one street light on an electric pole near John Belliviews house in Spofford village.
- 23. To see if the Town will vote to install one street light on the electric pole near the Chester Allen house in Spofford village.

Art. 24:

- (1) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$5,000.00, no less than \$4,000.00, to be used for the construction of a building to be known as the "Chesterfield Library and Arts Building" to be situated in Chesterfield on the main road between the Town Hall and the Dr. Estler home. This vote is not to be operative unless a grant is obtained by the Town under the Public Works Act or the Civil Works Act.
- (2) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the application for a loan and/or grant from the United States of America under the National Recovery Act, or any other act, of not exceeding \$5.000.00, such loan or grant if obtained to be applied to the construction of the building described in the next preceeding article.
- (3) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issue and sale to the United States of America, or any other purchaser or purchasers, of not exceeding \$5,000.00 of bonds of the Town, or in case a grant is obtained which is available for the cost of the project referred to in Article 1 rather than applicable to payments on account of such bonds, such less amount of bonds together with the said grant, shall not exceed \$5,000.00. Said bonds to be issued in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 59 of the Public Laws of New Hampshire, to bear interest at not exceeding 5% per annum payable semi-annually. Said bonds to be payable in accordance with Section 3 of Chapter 59 of said Public Laws: and, subject to the

foregoing limitations, the date of issue, the time and place of payment of principal and interest the fixing of the rate of interest, the provision for the sale of said bonds and other matters in relation thereto to be left to the discretion of the Selectmen.

- (4) To see if the Town will vote to authorize, ratify or approve any and all contracts or agreements in connection with any loan and/or grant, the application for which is authorized at the meeting.
- (5) To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to execute and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the Town, all contracts and agreements, and to take all action necessary or incidental to obtaining the loan and/or grant, the application for which is authorized at the meeting, and/or to carry out the project authorized at the meeting, and/or to issuing and selling the bonds authorized at the meeting.
- 25. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the ballot system for the election of Town Officers as provided for in Chap. 26 Public Laws of New Hampshire.
- 26. To see whether beer or other lawful alcoholic beverages shall be manufactured or sold locally as permitted under Chap. 99 section 22 Public Laws of New Hampshire.
- 27. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100 to be known as the Arthur H. Post Trust Fund, the income to be used for perpetual care and improvement of the Arthur H. Post burial lot in Spofford Cemetery.
- 28. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as Reuben B. Foster Trust Fund, the income to be used for perpetual care and improvement of the Reuben B. Foster burial lot in Spofford Cemetery.

- 29. To see if the Town will vote to accept the sum of \$100.00 to be known as the George O. and Merle W. Cobleigh Trust Fund, the income to be used for perpetual eare and improvement of their burial lots in Chesterfield West Cemetery.
- 30. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

TOWN MEETING, MARCH, 1933

Proceedings of the Annual Meeting of the voters of the Town of Chesterfield, called at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, March 14. 1933.

The meeting was called to order by the Moderator, James A. Wilson, at 9:50 A. M., and the warrant read by the Clerk.

The Articles of the warrant were then disposed of as follows:

Article 1. Election of Clerk. Voted that the Moderator be instructed to cast one ballot for Imogene L. Chickering to serve as Clerk for the ensuing year and Imogene L. Chickering having a majority of votes cast was declared elected and took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Article 2. Election of one Selectman for three years. Whole number of votes east 149. Necessary for choice 75. Chester M. Burnham had 149 and Chester M. Burnham having a majority of votes east was declared elected and took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Article 3. Election of Treasurer.

1st. vote. While number of votes cast 207. Necessary for choice 104. Ella M. Lewis had 12, Elsie Chickering Brown had 18, Beatrice N. Chickering had 34, John Mansley had 67, David W. Allen had 76 and there was no choice.

2nd vote. Whole number of votes 193. Necessary for choice 97. Ella M. Lewis had 3, Elsie Chickering Brown had 13, Beatrice N. Chickering had 27, John Mansley had 63, David W. Allen had 87 and there was no choice.

3rd. vote. Whole number of votes cast 201. Necessary for choice 101. Ella M. Lewis had 1, Elsie Chickering Brown had 1, Beatrice N. Chickering had 34. John Mansley had 59, David W. Allen had 106 and David W. Allen having a majority of votes cast was declared elected and took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Article 4. Election of Library Trustee for 3 years. Mrs. Ella M. Lewis was elected to serve as Library Trustee for three years by voice vote.

Article 5. Election of all other Town Officers. Election of Road Agents. Voted to elect a road agent for the East part of Town first. Whole number of votes east 182. Necessary for choice 92. Walter J. Post had 87, Donald A. Wellington had 95 and Donald A. Wellington having a majority of votes east was declared elected.

Election of Road Agent at Center. Whole number of votes east 191. Necessary for choice 96. Richard J. Butler had 26, Henry C. Chickering had 73, Roger C. Spaulding had 92 and there was no choice.

2nd. vote. Whole number of votes cast 197. Necessary for choice 99. Richard J. Butler had 16. Henry C. Chickering had 83, Roger C. Spaulding had 98 and there was no choice.

3rd. vote. Whole number of votes cast 197. Necessary for choice 99. Henry C. Chickering had 97, Roger C. Spaulding had 100 and Roger C. Spaulding having a majority of votes cast was declared elected.

Road Agent at West part. Whole number of votes east 190. Necessary for choice 96. Donald A. Wellington had 1, George E. Carruth had 34, Clifford E. Chickering had 76, Clarence F. Springer had 79 and there was no choice.

2nd, vote. Whole number of votes cast 190. Necessary for choice 96. George E. Carruth had 1, Clifford E. Chicker-

ing had 65 Clarence F. Springer had 124 and Clarence E. Springer having a majority of votes east was declared elected.

Then Donald A. Wellington, Roger C. Spaulding and Clarence F. Springer, road agents elected, took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Election of Auditors. Voted to ballot for John M. Mansley to serve as Auditor which resulted as follows: Whole number of votes cast 134. Necessary for choice 68. No had 45, Yes had 89 and John M. Mansley was declared elected.

Voted that future audits of town accounts be verified by a certified Public Accountant in the future.

Merle W. Cobleigh was elected by voice vote to serve as Auditor and John M. Mansley and Merle W. Cobleigh took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Election of Constables. Voted that the Clerk be instructed to cast one ballot for William D. Pierce to serve as Constable for the ensuing year and William D. Pierce having a majority of votes cast was declared elected. Charles H. Spaulding and Harold E. Randall were elected by voice vote to serve as Constables for the ensuing year, and William D. Pierce, Charles H. Spaulding and Harold E. Randall took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Election of Fence Viewers. Morris Friedsam, Walter Dunbar, and William Nurse were elected by voice vote to serve as fence viewers for the ensuing year and all took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Election of Surveyors of Wood and Lumber. Chester M. Burnham, Fred W. Holman, and Earl Walston were elected by voice vote to serve as Surveyors of wood and lumber for the ensuing year and all took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Election of Trustee of Trust Funds. William E. Nurse was elected by voice vote to serve as Trustee of Trust Funds for three years and took the oath of office before the Moderator. Voted that a Treasurer of Trust Funds be elected apart from the Trustees of Trust Funds and Ralph C. Chickering was elected to serve as such but he resigned as Treasurer in order that Merle W. Cobleigh might serve his unexpended term.

Election of Sextons. Byron A. Davis, Fred W. Holman, Harlan Streeter, Fred E. Atherton, Charles A. Tuttle and Paul Welcome were elected by voice vote to serve as Sextons for the ensuing year and all with the exception of Harlan Streeter took the oath of office before the Moderator.

Article 6. Fire Wards elected by voice vote were for the West part, Harold Ingalls, to serve for three years; Center, Paul M. Penning to serve for two years; and for the East part, Carl Whitcomb, to serve for one year. All took the oath of office.

Article 7. Voted to pass over the article.

Article 8. A motion made by Walter Post to cut all Town Officer's salaries and wages 25% over 1932 was amended by Mr. Friedsam as follows: That the Town vote the sum of \$2,650.00 for Town Charges which is a reduction of \$500.00, this amount to embrace a limit of \$250.00 for 'Assessors' expense in assessing and a general reduction of $12\frac{1}{2}\%$ on all other salaries in Town. The amendment carried in the affirmative.

Article 9. Voted to raise the sum of \$2.062.50 for State Aid Construction and also voted an Amendment to allow the Selectmen up to a period of 60 days the privilege of expending \$800.00 more from whatever fund is available so as to accept the State's proposal in the event of State Legislation volunteering to construct the Westmoreland Road at a cost

to Chesterfield of no more than \$800.00. Also voted that this Town is unanimously in favor of House Joint Resolution No. 43.

Article 10. Voted to raise the sum of \$1,129.34 for the support of the poor.

Article 11. Voted to raise the sum of \$120.00 for Old Age Assistance if the law is not repealed.

Article 12. Voted to raise the sum of \$6,000.00 for repairing highways and bridges.

Article 13. Voted to raise the sum of \$200.00 to be equally divided between the West and Center villages for maintenance of Fire Departments.

Article 14. Voted to raise the sum of \$200.00 for the support of the Library.

Article 15 Voted to observe Old Home Day and to raise the sum of \$67.06 for same. Voted that the same committee serve again. James A. Wilson and Belle E. Atherton resigned so it was voted that the remaining member, Walter Dunbar, pick his associates to suit himself.

Article 16. Voted to raise the sum of \$1,600.00 for street lighting.

Article 17. Voted to raise the sum of \$300.00 to be spent for gravelling the Atherton Hill road, so-called, beginning at Hewitt's corner at the top of the hill and onward east toward Keene as far as the above sum will allow.

Article 18. Voted to raise the sum of \$420.00 to purchase the snow plow now installed on the truck of W. J. Post for the Spofford District.

Article 19. Voted that Harry E. Winn serve as Tax Collector for the ensuing year and he took the oath of office before

the Moderator. Voted that the Collector charge 20c on all poll taxes not paid by the first of December besides the 12% interest allowed by law. Voted that the same method allowing discounts that were used last year be used again this year.

- Article 20. Voted that all unexpended 1932 appropriations be turned back for same purpose for which they were appropriated last year.
- Article 21. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector deeds.
- Article 22. Voted to install a light on Spring Street, on a pole near the residence of Sarah Horton.
- Article 23. Voted to accept the sum of \$100.00 for perpetual care of a lot in Chesterfield West Cemetery, to be known as the Barrett and Jackson Trust Fund.
- Article 24. Voted that only town help be employed on Town roads this year. Voted to adjourn at 6:10 P. M.

REPORT OF FIREWARDS

We wish to submit to the taxpayers the following report and recommendations for the coming year.

The West Chesterfield Fire Company had fourteen alarms in 1933, seven chimney fires, four building fires and three brush fires. There were also two calls from Westmoreland.

The Chesterfield Fire Company had sixteen alarms, nine chimney fires, four brush fires and three building fires. On three occasions it was necessary to call on West Chesterfield, being unable to start the pump due to cold weather.

About the first of January we put the fire pump and extinguishers in the Stone store so as to have the equipment in a warm place. A key was left at Spaulding's so that the pump would be accessible at all times.

We placed dual wheels on the trucks to make them safer to drive and to enable us to get the trucks across meadows and soft places.

The Firewards most earnestly recommend that a suitable place be provided to house the equipment in the Center, with heat and a hose tower that will be used by both companies. Hose must be thoroughly dried when used in freezing weather and we were seriously handicapped by ice in the hose. At present we have no way to dry hose. The Center engine has been of little use for the greater part of the winter due to cold weather and the need of warm storage is very great. We ask the voters to allow us to move the old hearse house to a suitable location or build a new house.

Also we would like to suggest to the citizens that they have available water on their property to clear a path to it and clean out water holes and brooks. This would greatly help in combating fires.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Chesterfield:

I herein submit my first annual report as superintendent of schools.

Necessarily the statistics of this report are taken from the data given in the registers and office records delivered to me last July.

During the few months since my induction as superintendent of your schools, I have found your schools well organized and taught by an able corps of teachers.

If I were to express in a few words a philosophy of education with a psychological background, it would recognize: (1) the human mind as the most unique, delicately poised and wonderful mechanism the world has ever known; (2) its stimuli are obtained through the co-called "Windows of the Soul" often called our common senses; (3) its products are the conceptions, ideations or thoughts resulting from a coalition and cooperation of mental activity, righteous feeling and power of decision between right and wrong.

To recognize these fundamental truths and provide the best environment for their healthy function and development is the problem of public education.

Not only must we develop the so-called skills in our schools but also those fundamental requisites essential to the highest type of American citizenship. This implies the cooperation of the school, the home and the church.

The condition of business is sometimes regarded as the corner stone of our educational structure. Therefore, we can be more optimistic than we were one year ago. The indices of

the business world are on the up-grade. Let not the schools lag behind.

Finally, let us remember: (1) "The school is the agent of the state in preserving itself." (2) "Education is not a charity but a part of the national defense." (3) "Education is the author of national ideals, the moulder of the soul of America."

REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

Mr. F. T. Johnson, Supt. of Schools Union No. 38, Marlboro, N. H., Dear Sir:

I herewith submit my annual report as school nurse for the Chesterfield schools:

135 pupils were examined.

- 3 pupils showed defective vision—uncorrected.
- 5 pupils showed poor posture.
- 40 pupils were underweight.
- 67 pupils were in need of dental care.
- 14 pupils have enlarged or diseased tonsils.
 - 3 pupils have enlarged glands.

Two tonsil clinics were held at the Keene Community hospital, 5 pupils were treated.

Two tonsil cases were treated privately.

An underweight clinic was held April 25, 1933, at the office of the New Hampshire Tuberculosis Association, Keene, N. H., 13 pupils were examined by Dr. R. B. Kerr.

A dental clinic was held at the office of Dr. Vera G. Congdon, Bellows Falls, Vt., 9 pupils were given dental care.

Six pupils have had their teeth cared for by their own dentist.

Milk and cod liver oil programs have been carried on in Spofford and the Village school, during the winter months of 1933, and again this winter.

Many home calls have been made, health conditions discussed with the parents. It is the desire of the nurse to give as much assistance as possible to the parents in arranging for correction of defects.

I wish to express the appreciation of the district to the local Red Cross chapter and Miss Alice Bennett.

I also wish to express my appreciation of the co-operation to the parents, members of the school board and teachers in the work accomplished in the last year.
