To the inhabitants of the Town of Dummer, in the County [L. S.] of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Willis Schoolhouse in said Dummer on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repair of highways and bridges.
- 4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for snow removal.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for cutting bushes along Town roads.
 - 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept T. R. A.
- 7. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of Town libraries.
- 8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of cemeteries.
- 9. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the suport of the Town Poor, and Old Age Assistance.
 - 10. To see if the Town will vote to give discount on taxes.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to give the Selectmen the right to hire money in anticipation of taxes, and to renew notes.
- 12. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate any sum of money for the White Mountains Region Association.
- 13. To see what sum the Town will vote and, appropriate for the purpose of establishing a capital reserve fund to be used for buying snow removal machinery.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

To the School Board and citizens of Dummer:

Following is the annual report of Superintendent of Schools with tables of statistics for last complete school year ending June 30, 1944.

Two schools (Willis and West Dummer) were maintained for the required year of 36 weeks with three regular teachers, two at Willis School. The percentage of attendance for the year was 92.2.

During the year, your Superintendent made 39 visits of inspection and supervision. The work of the pupils was carefully examined and standardized tests were given in various upper grades.

This present year (1944-1945) opened with one teacher (Mrs. Natalie Tillotson, a graduate of Plymouth Normal School) in charge at the Willis School and with Mrs. Winnifred Hart, a graduate of Gorham, Maine, Normal School as teacher of West Dummer School.
