Three distributing agencies have been established, and in that way the books are well circulated through the town, and more interest taken in the library. The "Record of the Rebellion" was presented

by the state library ; a book on " Christian Science," by Mrs. M. F. Berry, of Manchester, also several books have been sent from Washington by Congressman Baker, for which we are grateful.

The circulation of books has not been as large as last year, and we would ask for an appropriation this year, if only a small amount, so that the interest in the library so well started may not diminish.
