To the inhabitants of the town of Ellworth in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at schoolhouse in said Ellsworth on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
- 3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of highways and bridges.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to qualify for State aid.
- 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for maintenance of State highways.
- 6. To see if the town will vote to qualify for State aid on bridges.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to raise \$500.00 to secure \$1,000.00 from the State for special appropriation.
- 8. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for payment of town debt.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of uncollected taxes.

- 10. To bring in your votes for the election of delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- 11. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
