10. To see if the town will vote to raise money for Old Home Day and make appropriations for same.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to repairing Town dam in Huckins pasture to lay pipe below frost line for the benefit of those who desire more water for home and public buildings at the rate of \$6 per year. Each subscriber will attach at their own expense.

12. To see what action the town will take in regard to breaking roads out of town.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting and make necessary appropriations for the same.
